Please be advised of the following changes in the plans and specifications for this project:

Item 2.01: Refer to the Itemized Proposal Form:

Replace the Itemized Proposal Form with the attached updated Itemized Proposal Form. Please submit this new Itemized Proposal Form with your bid.

Note that soil sampling and testing has been removed from Pay Item 26.a. Pay Item 26.d (Contaminated Soils Testing Allowance) has been added as an Allowance.

Item 2.02: Refer to Section 01 20 00 – Price and Payment Section:

Pay Item 26.a – delete "soil sampling and testing."

Add the following Pay Item 26.d – Contaminated Soils Testing Allowance

An Allowance to engage with an environmental consultant to collect up to three soil borings and water samples from Station 10+00 to Station 11+00. Samples shall be submitted to a North Carolina certified laboratory and analyzed for pesticides listed in the Soil Management Plan in the Appendix. If contaminants are detected in the soil or groundwater, the Contractor shall follow the Soil Management Plan. The contaminated soil testing shall be incorporated into the Contractor's schedule and shall occur within 90 days of Notice to Proceed. The following questions were received in writing and the Engineer's response is in bold below.

 Norfolk Southern Railway - Agreement Requirements for "Railway Support Services" Addendum 1 includes the License Agreement with Norfolk Southern Railway and, states that the Licensee will be responsible for expenses regarding "Flagging Operations" and "Construction Monitoring". Will these costs be paid by Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Utilities (the named Licensee)? or, will these costs be passed on to the Contractor? If the costs are to be the responsibility of the contractor, would you consider adding an allowance for Railway Support Services (Monitoring and Flagging)?

Costs for railway support services shall be the Contractor's responsibility.

2. Shoring/Protection of Structures for buildings adjacent to Pipe Bursting work It has been mentioned that the Pipe Bursting operations may pose a risk to the adjacent buildings and, that underpinning and shoring will be required to mitigate possible damage. Would you consider adding an item for the protection of existing structures?

Protection of existing structures, if needed, shall be included in existing Bid Items.

3. Item 26, A, B, C - Contaminated Soils

The Item Description and Measurement and Payment Section for item 26 (A) - Contaminated Soils Management, states that, this is a lump sum item – and is to include soil sampling, testing, trench lining, temporary monitoring wells, environmental consulting, development of a remediation plan and any other work required for the completion of this item and full remediation for up to 200 CY of material.

However, the Soil Management Plan (Appendix B) states that the excavated material must be placed in sealed roll off boxes or drums, stored on-site, and then must be tested before a proper disposal/remediation plan can be determined.

It is therefore not possible for the contractor to determine a cost for this item with accuracy. In fairness to the Owner and the Contractor, It is suggested and requested that an allowance Item is created 26 A, B and C.

An allowance for soil sampling has been added, see Items 2.01 and 2.02 above.

No further changes at this time.

ARTICLE 1 – BID RECIPIENT

1.01 The undersigned Bidder proposes and agrees, if this Bid is accepted, to enter into an Agreement with Owner in the form included in the Bidding Documents to perform all Work as specified or indicated in the Bidding Documents for the prices and within the times indicated in this Bid and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Bidding Documents.

ARTICLE 2 – BIDDER'S ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

2.01 Bidder accepts all of the terms and conditions of the Instructions to Bidders, including without limitation those dealing with the disposition of Bid security.

ARTICLE 3 – BIDDER'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 3.01 In submitting this Bid, Bidder represents that:
 - A. Bidder has examined and carefully studied the Bidding Documents, and any data and reference items identified in the Bidding Documents, and hereby acknowledges receipt of the following Addenda:

- B. Bidder has visited the Site, conducted a thorough, alert visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with and satisfied itself as to the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- C. Bidder is familiar with and has satisfied itself as to all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- D. Bidder has considered the information known to Bidder itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Bidding Documents; and any Site-related reports and drawings identified in the Bidding Documents, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and documents on (1) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (2) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Bidder; (3) Bidder's safety precautions and programs; and (4) Bidder has correlated all such information available.
- E. Bidder agrees, based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the determination of this Bid for performance of the Work at the price bid and within the times required, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Bidding Documents.
- F. Bidder is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.
- G. Bidder has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Bidder has discovered in the Bidding Documents, and confirms that the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Bidder.
- H. The Bidding Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for the performance and furnishing of the Work.

1. The submission of this Bid constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Bidder that Bidder has complied with every requirement of this Article, and that without exception the Bid and all prices in the Bid are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work required by the Bidding Documents.

ARTICLE 4 – BIDDER'S CERTIFICATION

- 4.01 Bidder certifies that:
 - A. This Bid is genuine and not made in the interest of or on behalf of any undisclosed individual or entity and is not submitted in conformity with any collusive agreement or rules of any group, association, organization, or corporation;
 - B. Bidder has not directly or indirectly induced or solicited any other Bidder to submit a false or sham Bid;
 - C. Bidder has not solicited or induced any individual or entity to refrain from bidding; and
 - D. Bidder has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for the Contract. For the purposes of this Paragraph 4.01.D:
 - 1. "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value likely to influence the action of a public official in the bidding process;
 - 2. "fraudulent practice" means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to influence the bidding process to the detriment of Owner, (b) to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels, or (c) to deprive Owner of the benefits of free and open competition;
 - 3. "collusive practice" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of Owner, a purpose of which is to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels; and
 - 4. "coercive practice" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the bidding process or affect the execution of the Contract.

- 6.01 Bidder agrees that the Work will be Substantially Complete in accordance with Paragraph 15.04 of the General Conditions within <u>480 calendar days</u> of Notice to Proceed as indicated in the Construction Contract.
- 6.02 Bidder agrees that the Work will be completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions within <u>510 calendar days</u> of Notice to Proceed as indicated in the Construction Contract.

Note that calendar days to final payment includes 180 calendar days for material procurement.

6.03 Bidder accepts the liquidated damages sum of \$1,200 per calendar day and provisions thereof as stipulated in the Construction Contract.
