Introduction

This report was developed by the Research, Policy, and Impact Center (RPIC) of the National Institute of Minority Economic Development in response to a request from Bernita, President/CEO of the Welfare Reform Liaison Project (WRLP) and Sharon Barlow, Director of Social Services for Guilford County (GC-DHHS-DSS). The RPIC is charged with assisting the WRLP and GC-DHHS-DSS in conducting an in-depth needs assessment and an analysis of secondary-demographic data for the Welfare Reform Liaison Project for programing metrics and grant writing purposes and for the Guilford County Government Department of Health and Human Services to explore opportunities to improve SNAP service delivery and access to vulnerable populations that may be disproportionately impacted by remote operations, language barriers, fear of government services, and a lack of access to technology.. The study will have special focus on what has changed in Low-and-Moderate Income (LMI) communities since the last report in 2020 as a result of the COVID-19 Pandemic. Our research is mixed method and incorporate extensive quantitative and qualitative data, community and stakeholder input. This report will provide the analysis of secondary socio-demographic data and will be followed by a qualitative report based on focus groups with low-and middle-income residents as well as stakeholder interviews. The following report will also include data from a county-wide survey of residents.

Data Sources

Socio-demographic data

This sociodemographic analysis includes the latest information on community economic, demographic, and social conditions available from national sources (Census Bureau, American Housing Survey, American Community Survey, US Postal Service, Zillow, ESRI datasets, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, etc.).

The majority of data from this report comes from the 2021 American Community Survey (ACS) one-year estimate demographic data which was accessed via SimplyAnalytics, a subscription based a web-based mapping, analytics, and data

visualization application. Other variables were downloaded independently from Policy Map, a mapping and analytics platform with a data warehouse of over 50000 indicators.

Additional data comes from the Consumer Expenditure Estimates dataset created by SimplyAnalytics using small area estimation techniques. The Consumer Expenditure (CE) Public Use Microdata (PUMD) samples thousands of respondents (referred to as consumer units, or "CUs") across the United States. Each CU is assigned a weight that reflects the relative proportion of all American CUs that they represent. The estimates are further adjusted to account for regional fluctuations in cost of living.

Local Employment Context

Guilford County

Guilford County is a sprawling urban and peri-urban county in the heart of the Piedmont which includes the Greensboro-High Point MSA as well as incorporated towns of Gibsonville, Jamestown, Oak Ridge, Pleasant Garden, Sedalia, Stokesdale, Summerfield, and Whitsett. It covers an area of 658 square miles and a population of over 539,036 (ACS 2021). The population is mostly White: 53.8% and Black/African American: 33.7%. It is the third most populated county in NC (following Wake County and Mecklenburg County). The county is expected to maintain a population growth of between 1-2% annually with both natural growth (more births than deaths) and net migration (more people moving to Guilford County than moving out of the county).

The County is home to two major municipalities, Greensboro and High Point, with separate courts, jails, and county human services departments in each city. The County is a very accessible place intersected by 8 interstate highways, 6 US highways and 7 major NC highways. It is home to a major airport (Piedmont Triad International) and has railroad depots located in downtown Greensboro and downtown High Point with daily passenger traffic up and down the eastern corridor and in state transportation to Raleigh and Charlotte. The County is protected by 3

major law enforcement agencies, the County Sheriff’s Department, City of Greensboro Police Department, and the High Point Police Department.

Affordability

According to the Economic Policy Institute Family Budget Calculator (March 2022), “The cost of living for a two-parent, two-child family in Guilford County, NC is: \$75,833 per year; \$6,319 per month.” A majority (63.0%) of households in Guilford County fall below this income level. The average household spent \$4,604 on utilities, fuels, and public services and \$9,359 on food in 2020 (Easy Analytic Software, Inc. - Consumer Expenditures (CEX) Database, 2020).

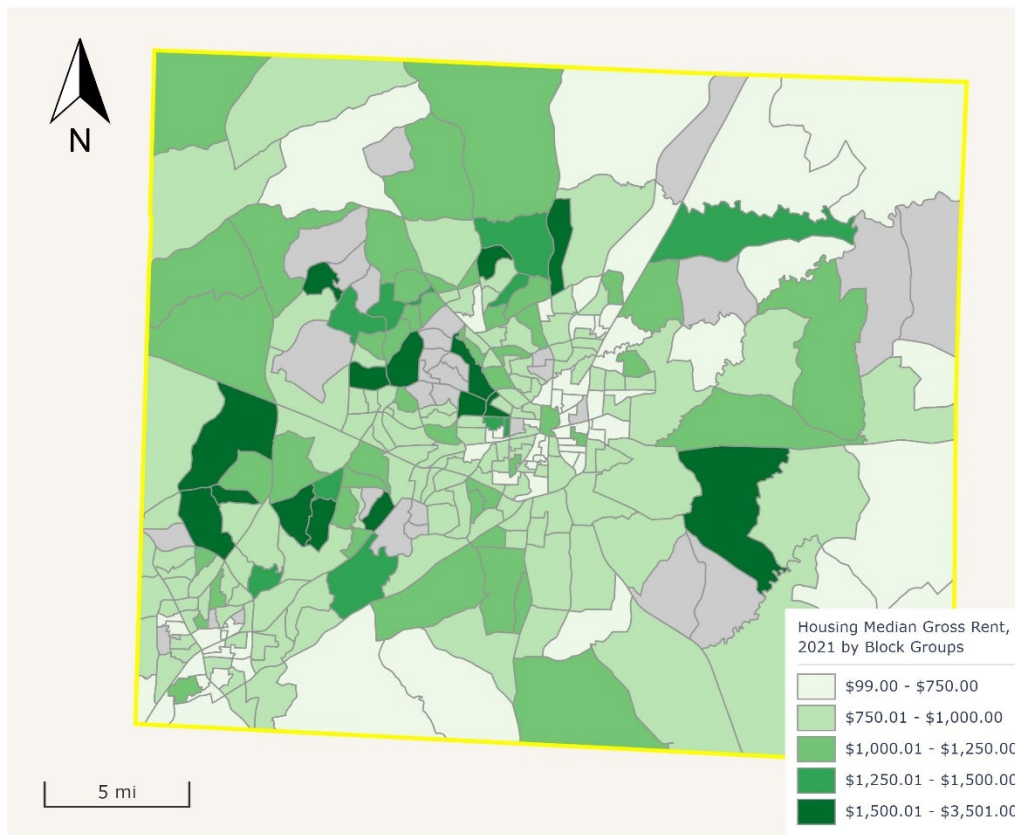


FIGURE 1 – MEDIAN GROSS RENTS GUILFORD COUNTY, NC 2021

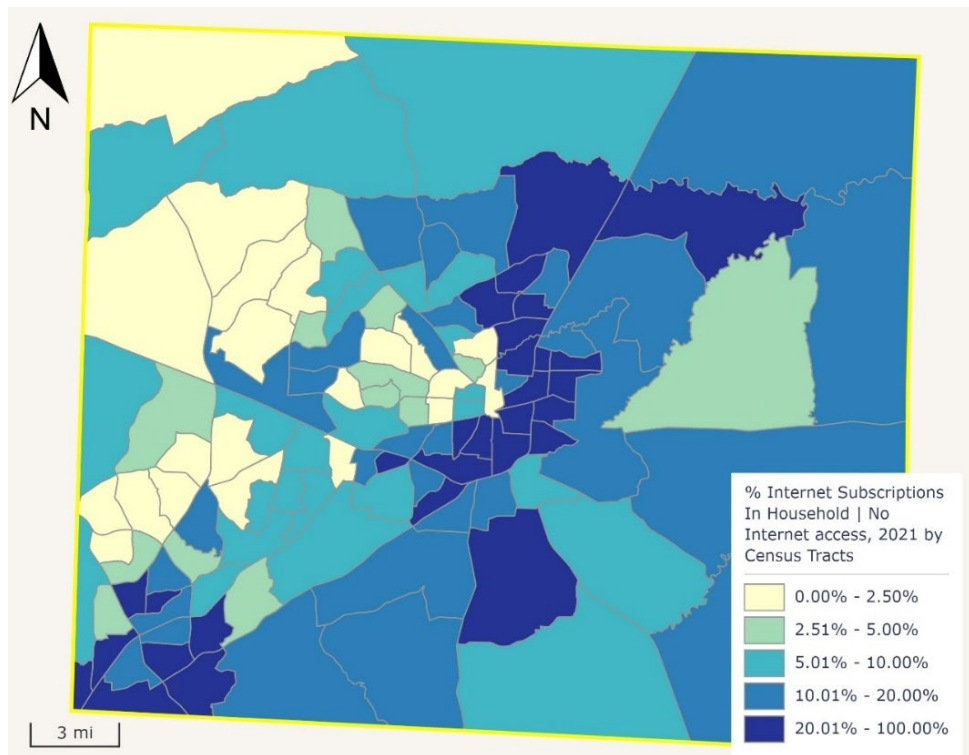


FIGURE 2 – HOUSEHOLDS WITHOUT INTERNET ACCESS GUILFORD COUNTY, NC 2021

Quality of Life

In Guilford County 80.6% of households had internet access in 2021 (ACS), but access was not distributed equally throughout the County as can be seen in the map below where dark blue represents 20% or more of households within a Census Tract as lacking connectivity. Guilford County ranked “moderate to high” in terms of social vulnerability (CDC 2018), which was a variable that considers four categories: socioeconomic (ranked as “low”); household composition (ranked as “very low”); minority and language (ranked as “high”); and housing and transportation (ranked as “high”). There are 11 Census Tracts in Greensboro and eight in High Point that are considered by the USDA as having low income and low food access (aka Food Deserts). The justice served population includes 17,000 people released per year from Guilford County Jail. In Guilford County violent crime index is 24.9 (US average is 22.7) and property crime is 55.5. (US average is 35.4). There is an overall crime rate of 2,582 reports per 100,000 residents (FBI Uniform Crime Reports). Assault, Larceny, and Burglary were the most prevalent.

Population & Population Density

Guilford County is home to an estimated 517,197 people. According to the American Community Survey (2021), Guilford County ranks 3rd out of the 100 counties in NC in population and has experienced a population growth of 13.3 since 2010 and increasing 28.0% since 2000. The county is expected to maintain a population growth of between 1-2% annually. The population density is 834.5 individuals per square mile countywide, but 2,304.3 in Greensboro and 2,030.8 in High Point. A few Census Tracts in Greensboro (in the UNCG area) reach as high as 7,500 or more per square mile.

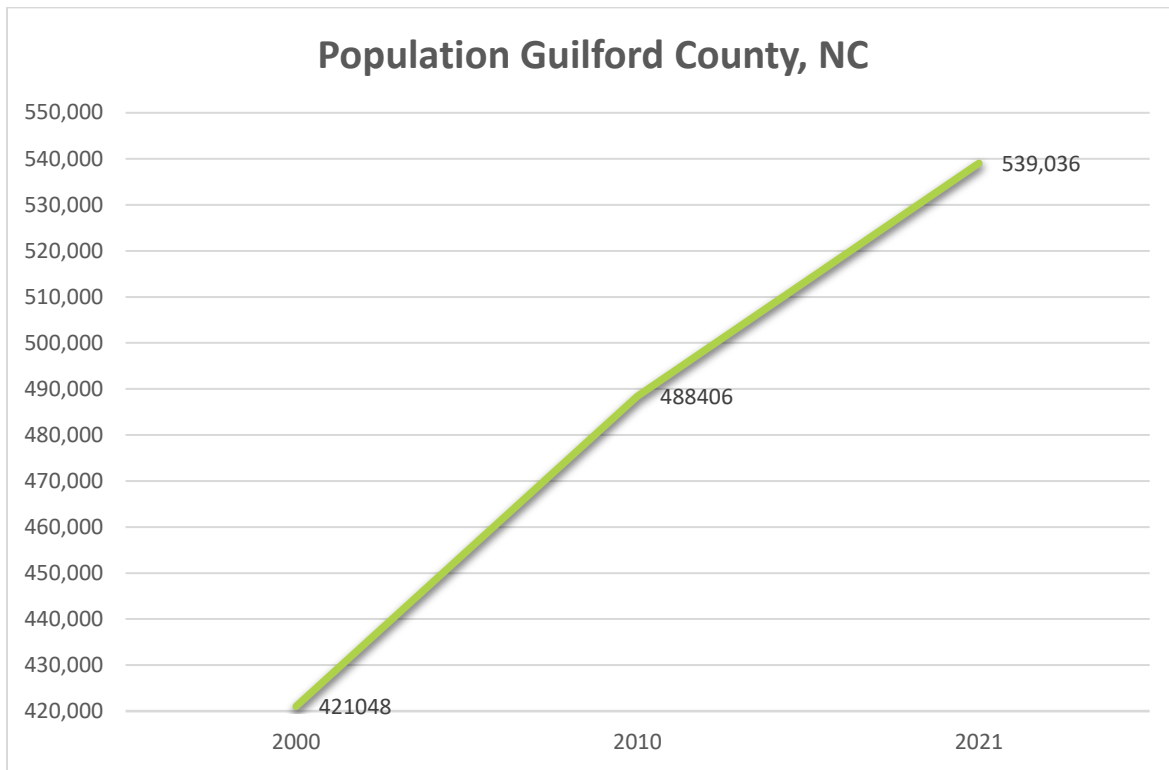


FIGURE 3 - POPULATION INCREASE GUILFORD COUNTY, NC 2000, 2010, 2021

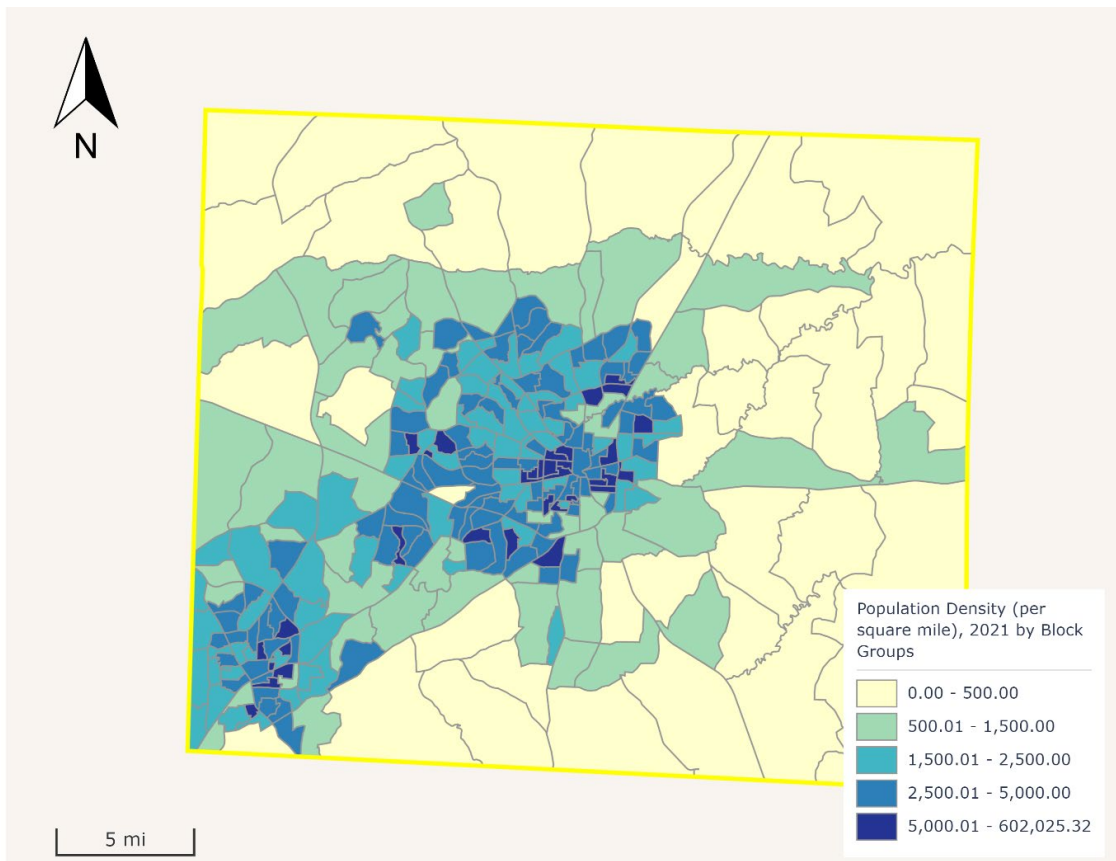


FIGURE 4 – POPULATION DENSITY GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP (ACS 2021)

Age Structure

According to ACS 5year estimates for 2016-2020, 15.2% of the population is over the age of 65, 62.6% are of working age (18-64), 22.3% are under 18, and 5.9% are under 5 years old. The median age for males and females in Guilford County was 42.3 and 44.6 years, respectively (ACS 2019). The urban areas had a lower median age than in unincorporated county areas. High Point had median ages were slightly lower than Greensboro (40.1 males, 42.8 females as compared to 40.8 males, 43.6 females in Greensboro). There are concentrations of neighborhoods where the median age was 50 years or more in the southern part of the county as well as northwest High Point and northwest Greensboro. In Southwest High Point and Southwest Greensboro, the median age was younger (25-35). Likewise in the Census Tracts containing High Point University, UNC Greensboro, Greensboro College, and NC A&T the median age was below 25.

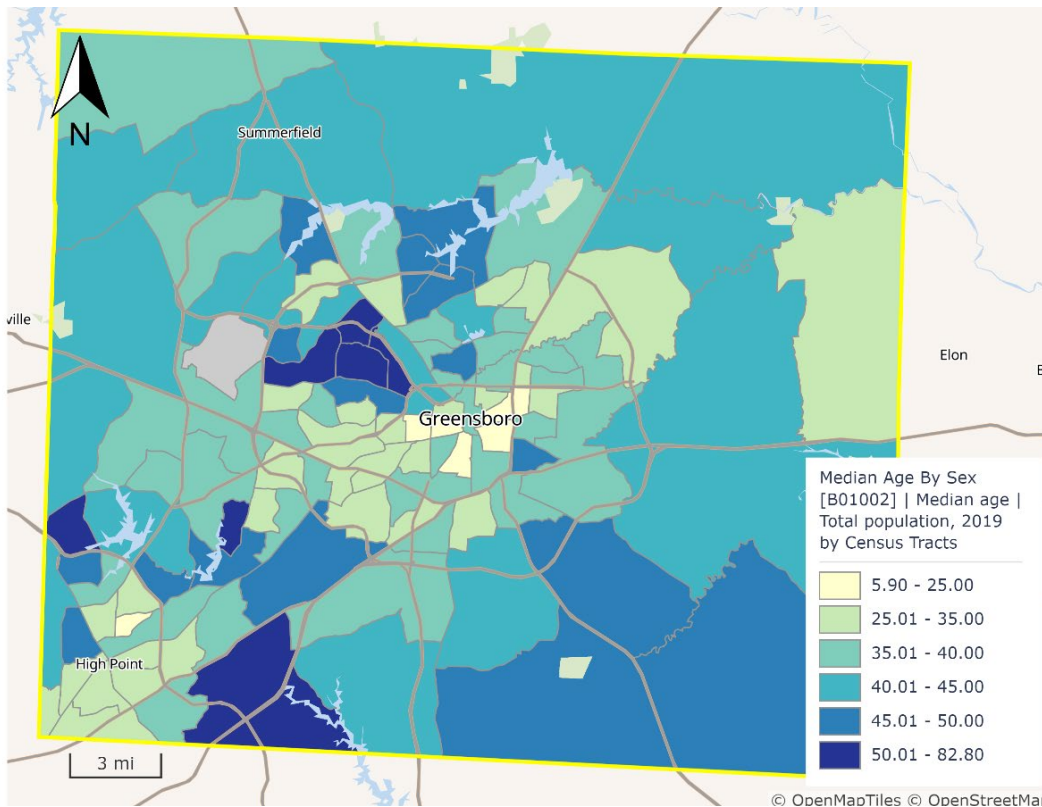


FIGURE 5 – MEDIAN AGE OF POPULATION GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

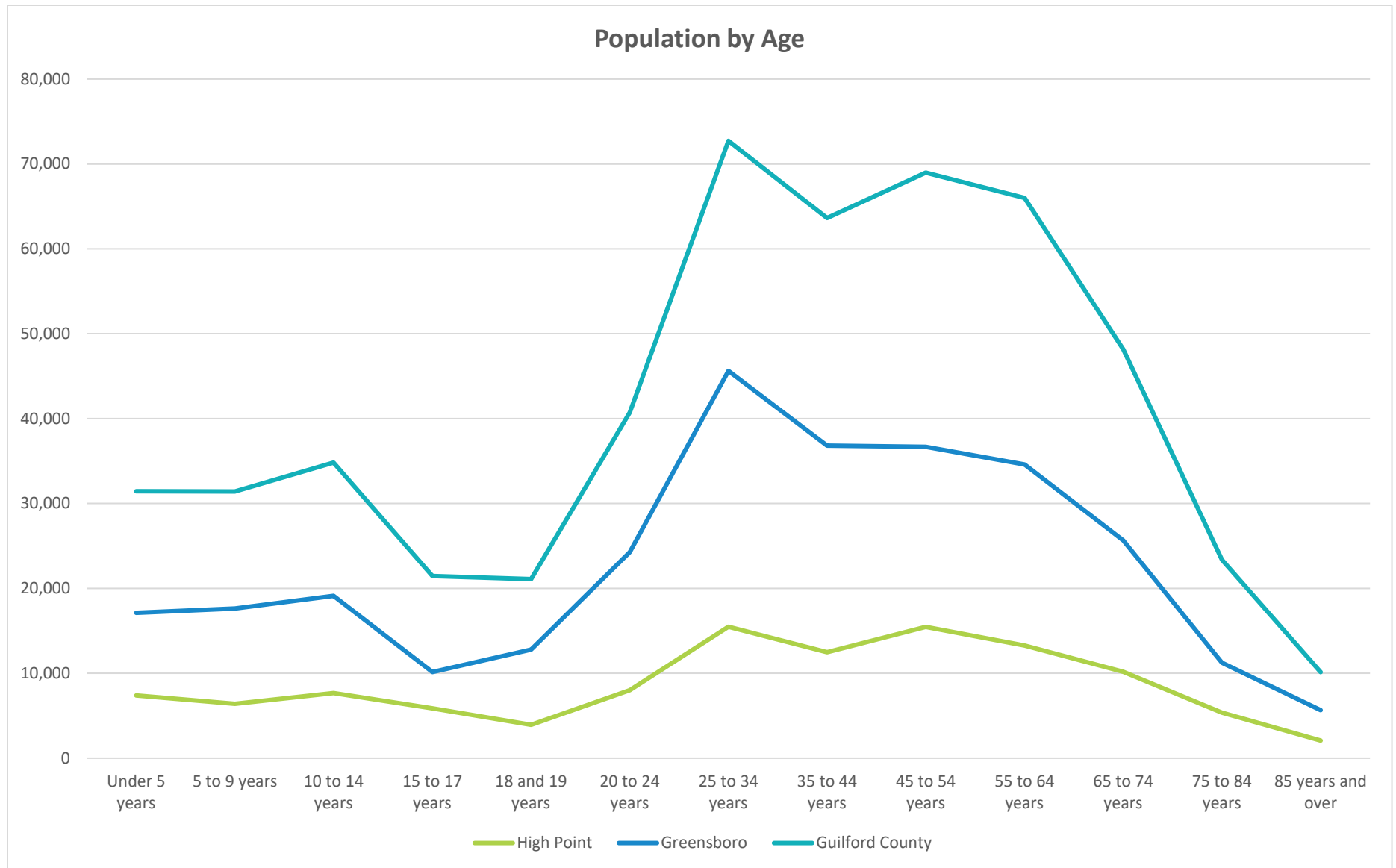


FIGURE 6 – POPULATION BY AGE, HIGH POINT, GREENSBORO, GUILFORD COUNTY (ACS 2021)

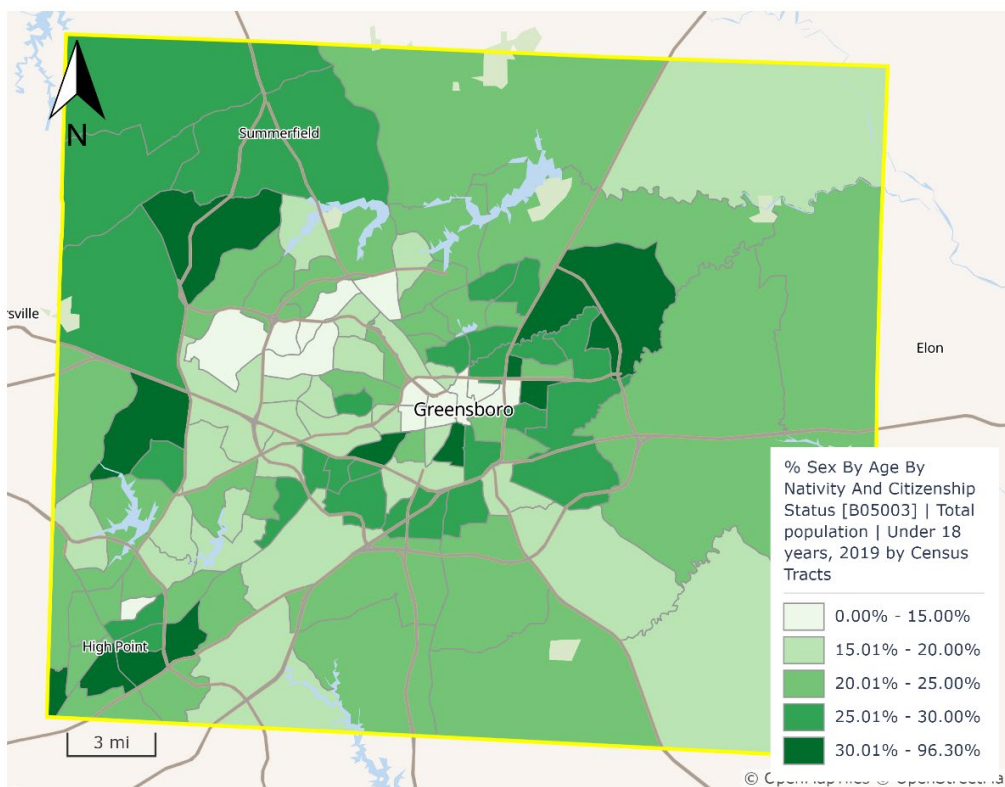


FIGURE 7 – PERCENT OF POPULATION UNDER 18 GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

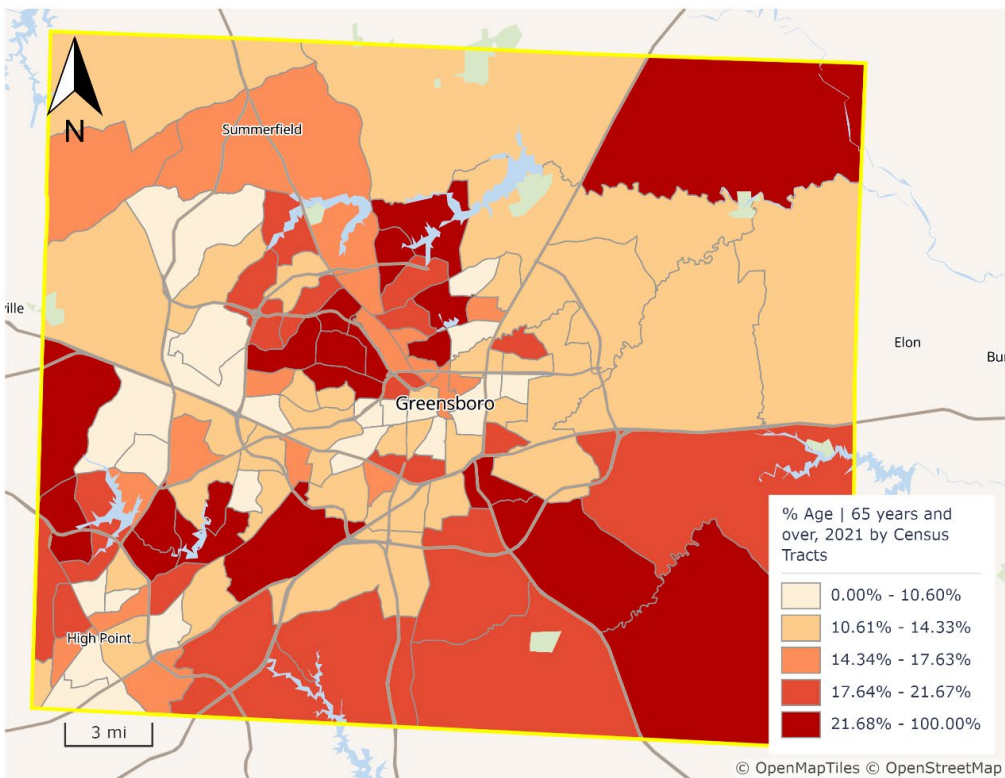


FIGURE 8 – PERCENT OF POPULATION OVER 65 GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

Households & Family Structures

Household Types

There are an estimated 205,455 households in Guilford County (ACS 2021); this was an increase of 21.8% since the 2000 Census. The median household size in 2021 was 2.5 individuals. There are many different types of family and non-family households. Most individuals live in one of 129,439 family households accounting for 63.0% of all households in the County. Families are groups of related people who live together, whereas households refer to the person or group of people living in a housing unit. Generally, households that do not contain a family are made up of unrelated people living together (e.g., roommates) or people living alone. From the table on the next page, we see that there are about 61,044 living alone with more females living alone than males. About 6,778 individuals (1.3%) live with an unmarried partner, while 8,287 (1.6%) live with a roommate.

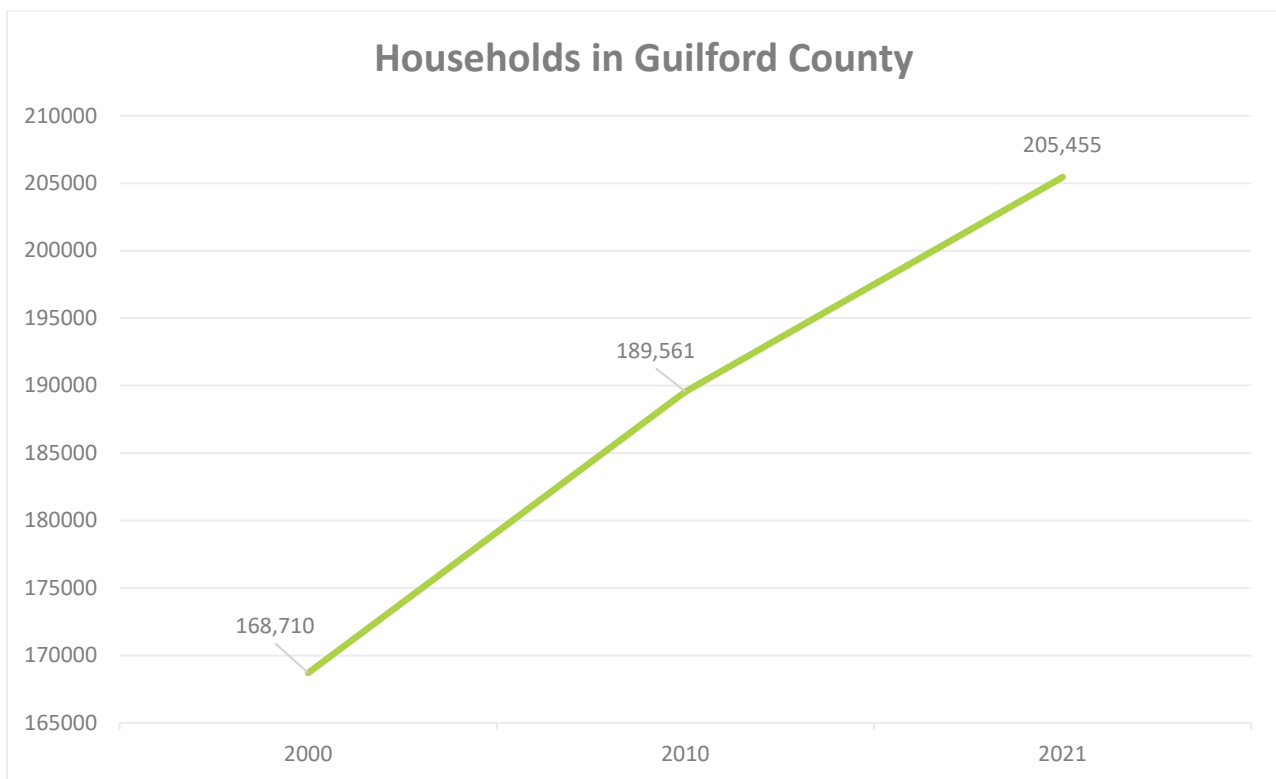


FIGURE 9 - HOUSEHOLDS INCREASE GUILFORD COUNTY, NC 2000, 2010, 2019

Households with Children

The number of family households with children has fallen from 46.9% (in ACS 2006-2010) to 44.6% (in ACS 2016-2020). About a quarter (26.5%) of families are married parents with children, while about a fifth (18.1%) are single head-of-household families (ACS 2016-2020). The relationship of children to homeowners was broken into four main categories: own child, grandchild, other relative, and foster child. The “own child” category includes biological (88%), adopted (2.2%), and stepchildren (3.2%) of families with children. Guilford County’s children are predominately “own children” with grandchildren in the next largest category at 6.5%. In non-family households we see foster children accounting for .2% or about 264 households as captured by the American Community Survey.

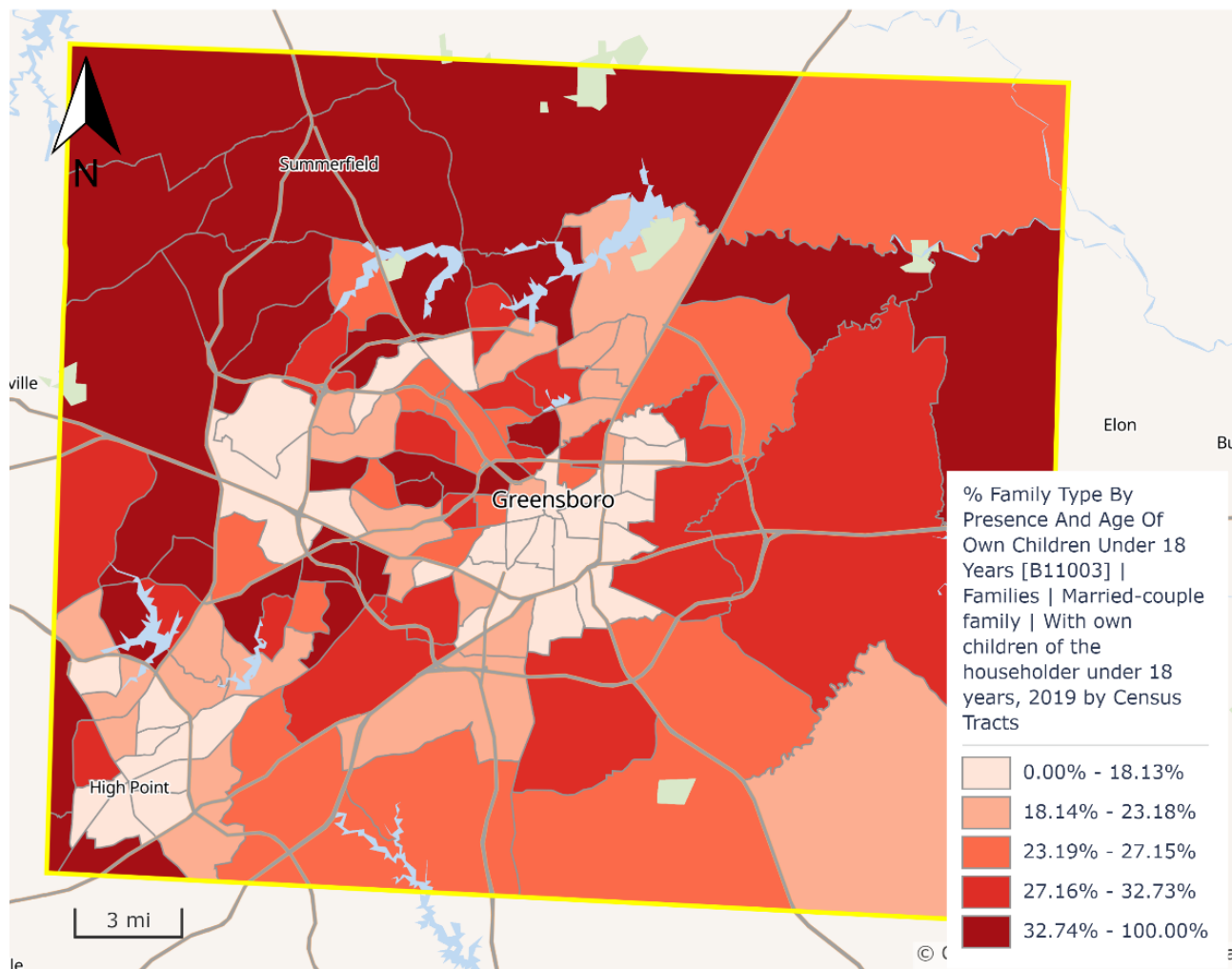


FIGURE 10 – MARRIED COUPLE FAMILY WITH CHILDREN GUILFORD COUNTY BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2019)

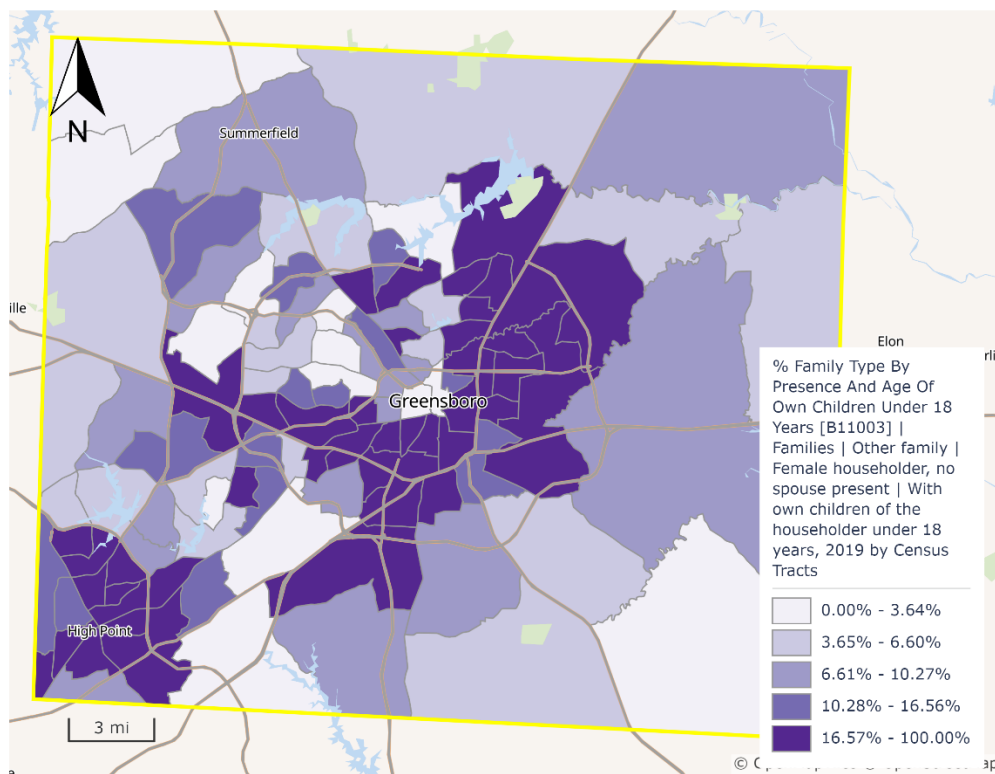


FIGURE 11 – SINGLE FEMALE WITH CHILDREN GUILFORD COUNTY BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2019)

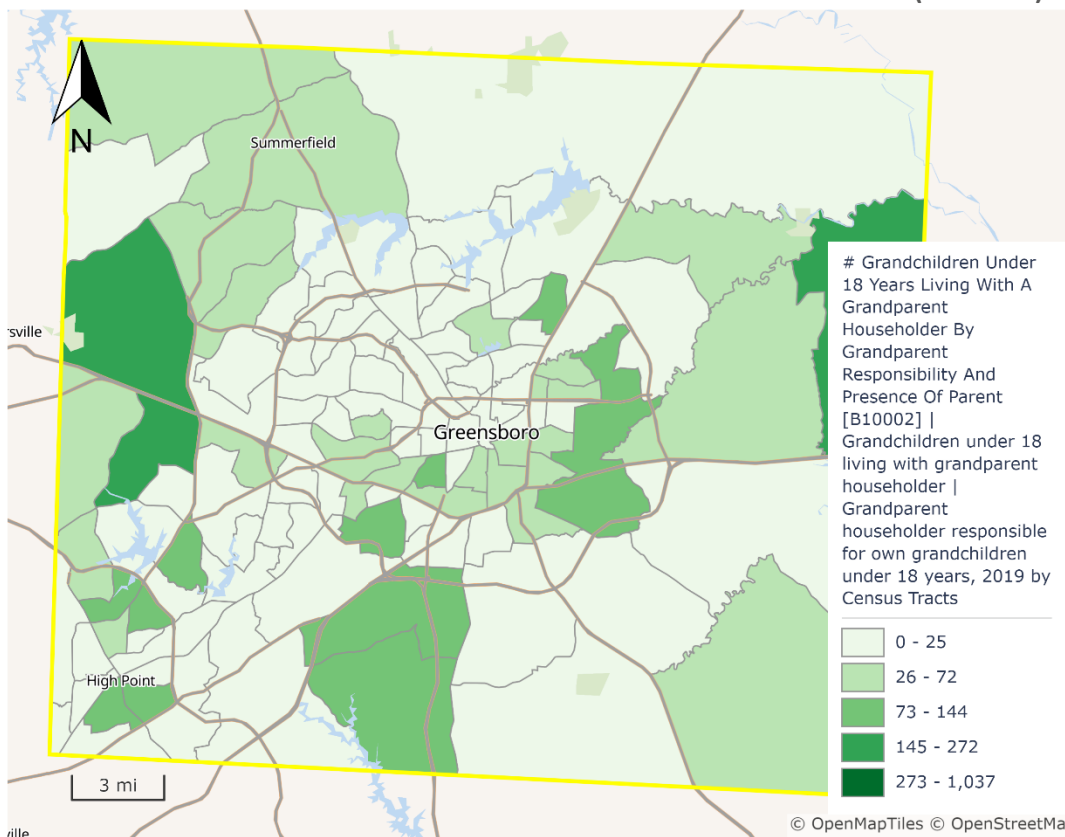


FIGURE 12 – GRANDPARENTS RESPONSIBLE FOR CHILDREN GUILFORD COUNTY BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2019)

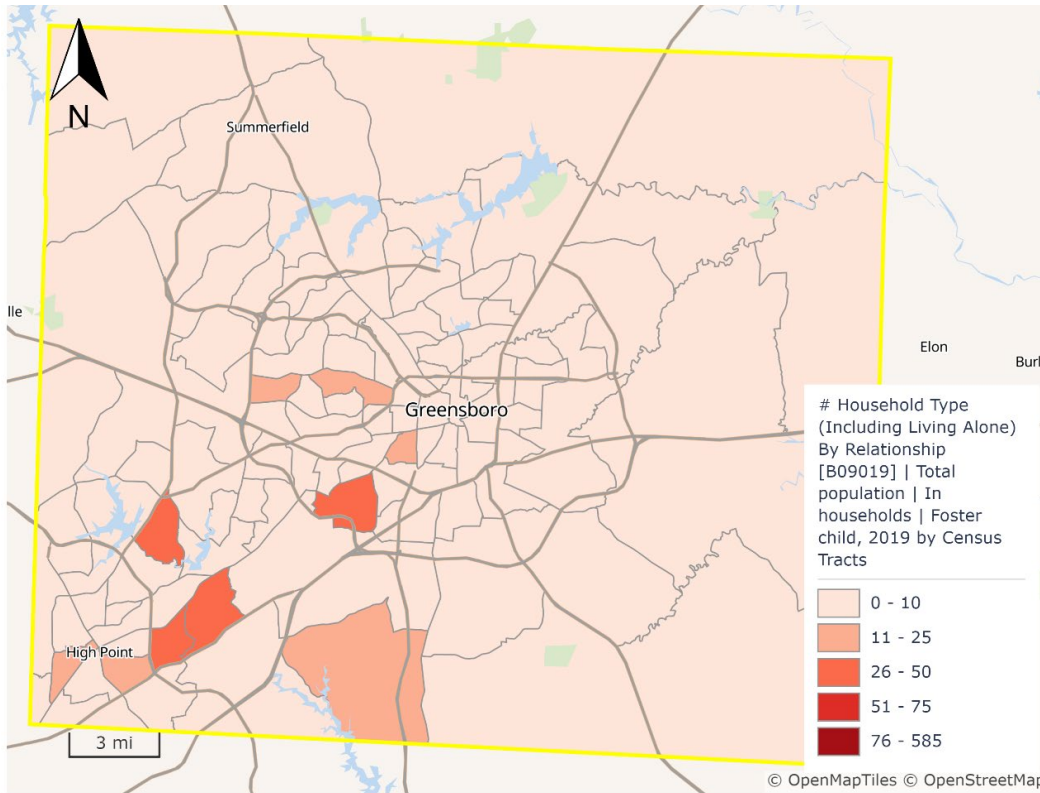


FIGURE 13 – NUMBER OF CHILDREN W/FOSTER PARENTS GUILFORD COUNTY BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2019)

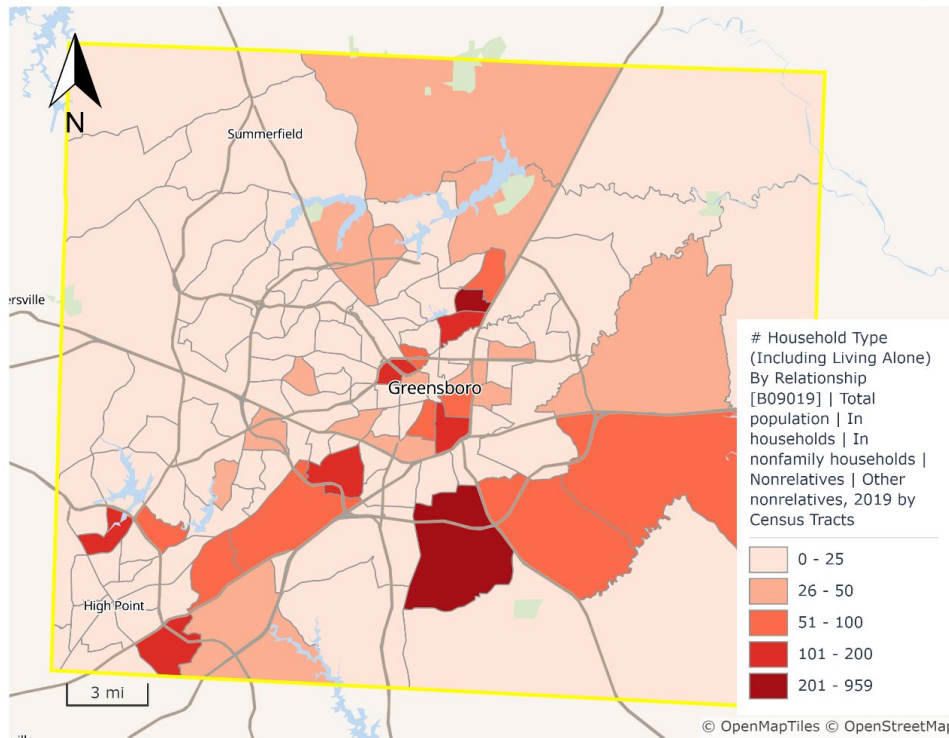


FIGURE 14 – NUMBER OF ADULTS LIVING W/ UNMARRIED PARTNER GUILFORD COUNTY BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2019)

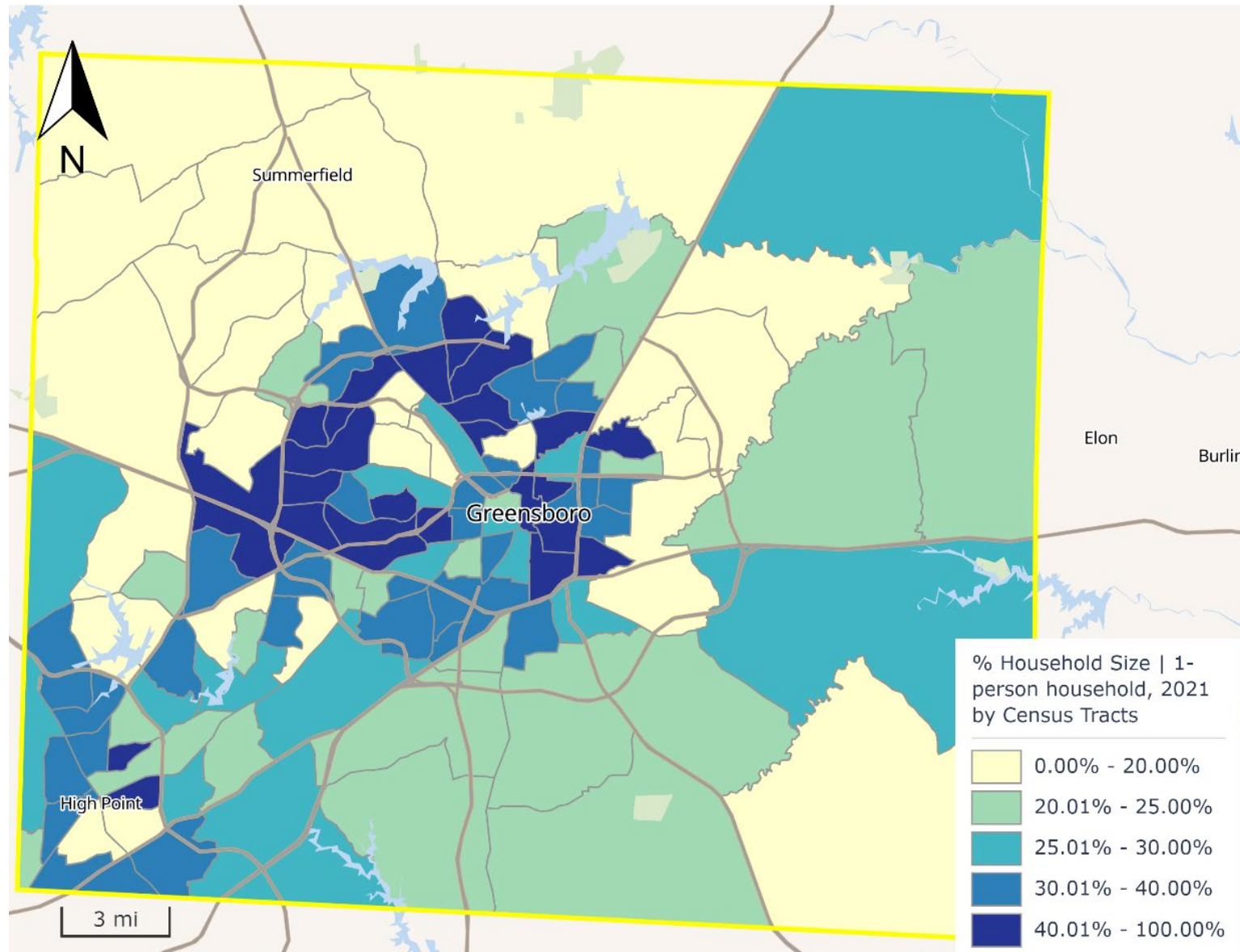


FIGURE 15 – PERCENT ADULTS LIVING ALONE GUILFORD COUNTY BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

Race, Ethnicity, & Nationality

The population of Guilford County was a third African American (33.7%), a little more than half white (53.8%), 5.6% Asian, and 3.1% two or more races. Hispanic and Asian populations have grown considerably over the last few decades to 8.5% and 5.6% respectively. Geospatial analysis shows a resurgence of racial/ethnic isolation and a “concentration effect” of poverty. GIS mapping of American Community Survey data reveals that Guilford County has pockets that are highly segregated by race. Rural areas and the northwest of both Greensboro and High Point have high concentrations of white populations. Conversely, non-white populations are concentrated in the southeast of both cities. This pattern was particularly true for the African American population, while other non-whites are more evenly distributed. Hispanics make up 8.5% of the Guilford population. The Hispanic population has greatest concentrations in south High Point and northeast of Greensboro.

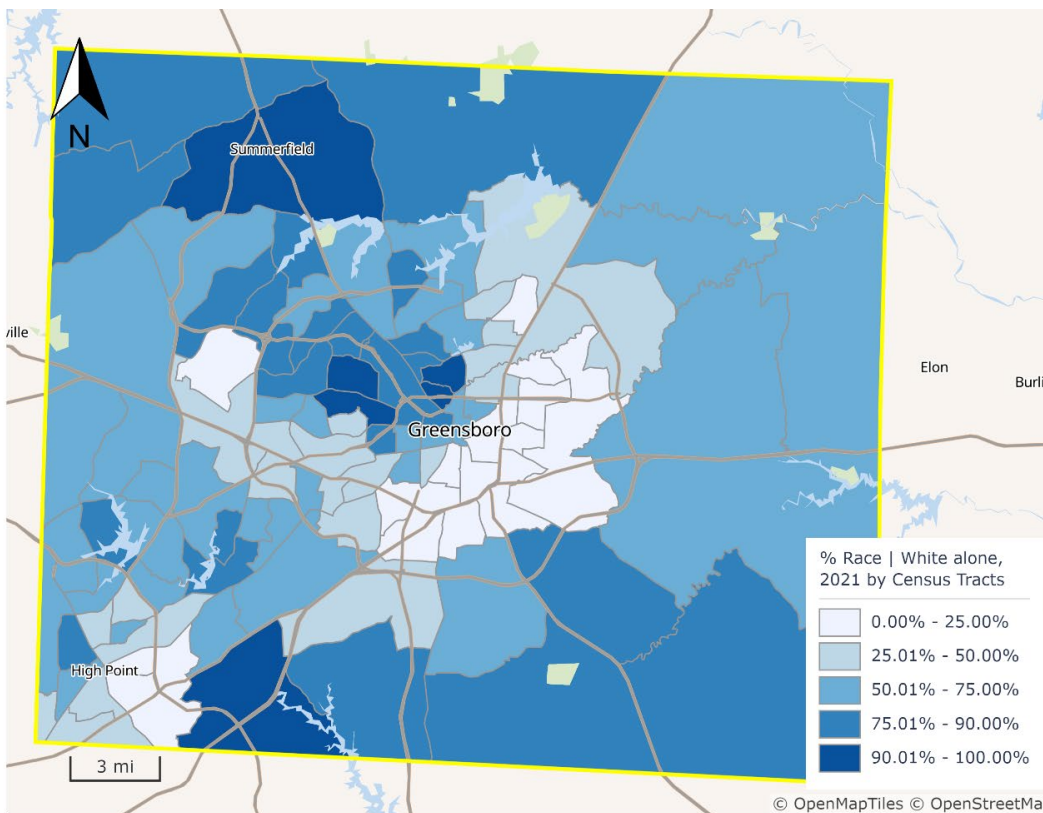


FIGURE 16 – POPULATION WHITE GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

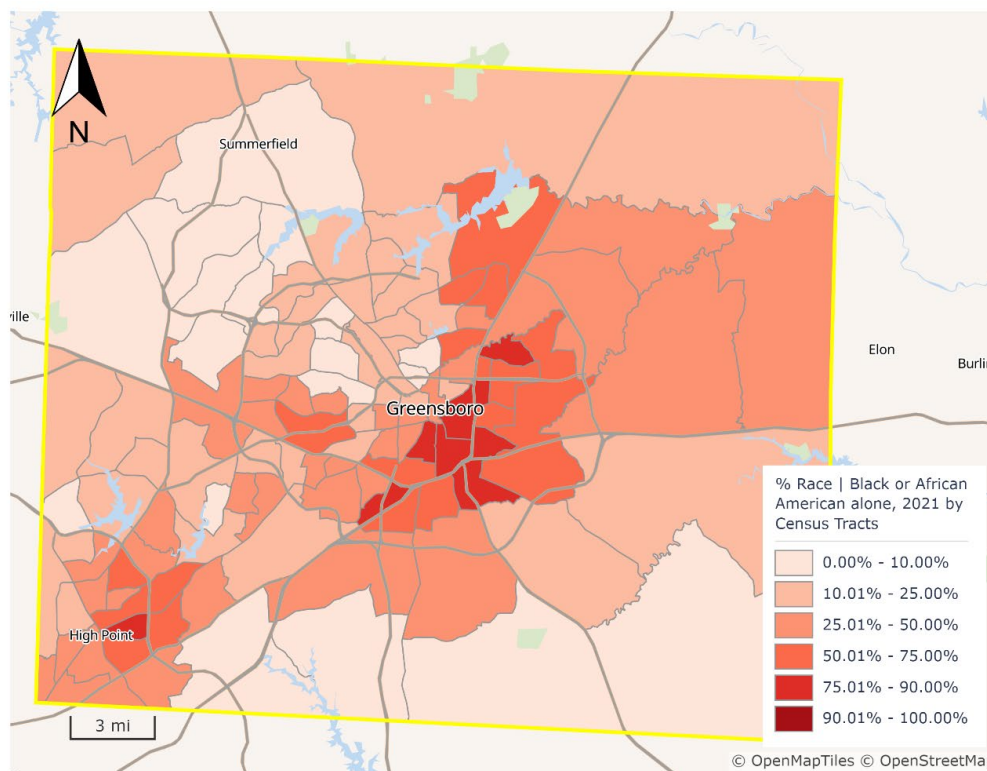


FIGURE 17 – POPULATION AFRICAN-AMERICAN GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

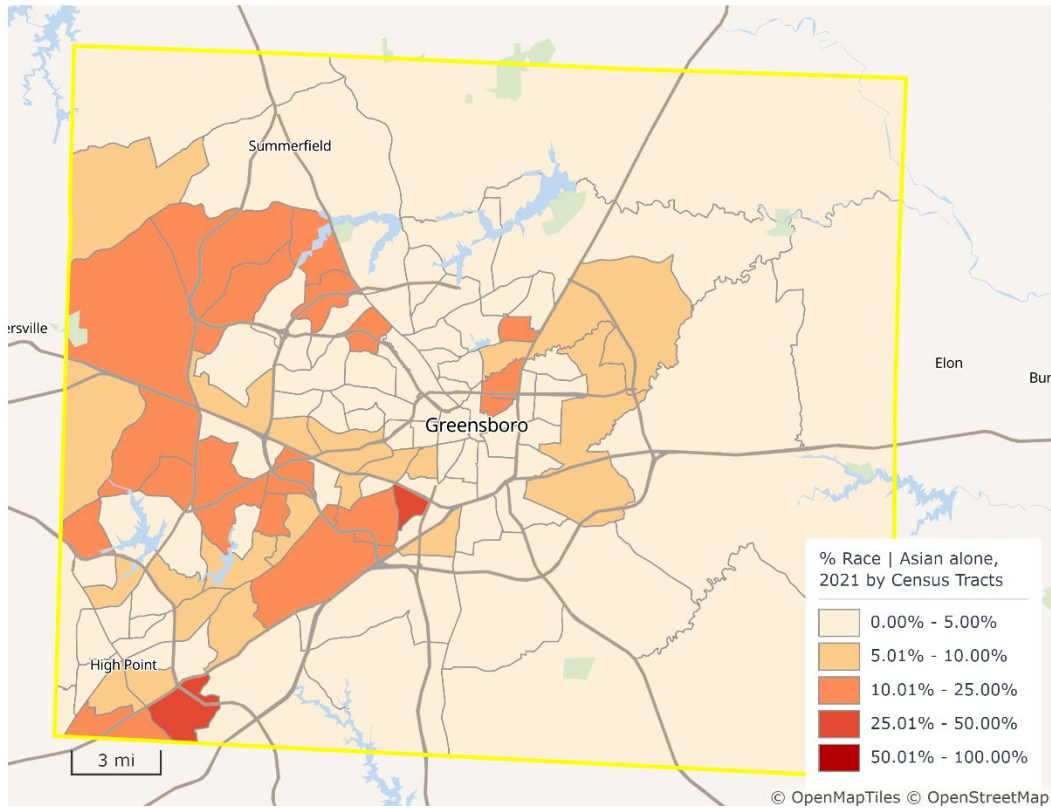


FIGURE 18 – POPULATION ASIAN GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

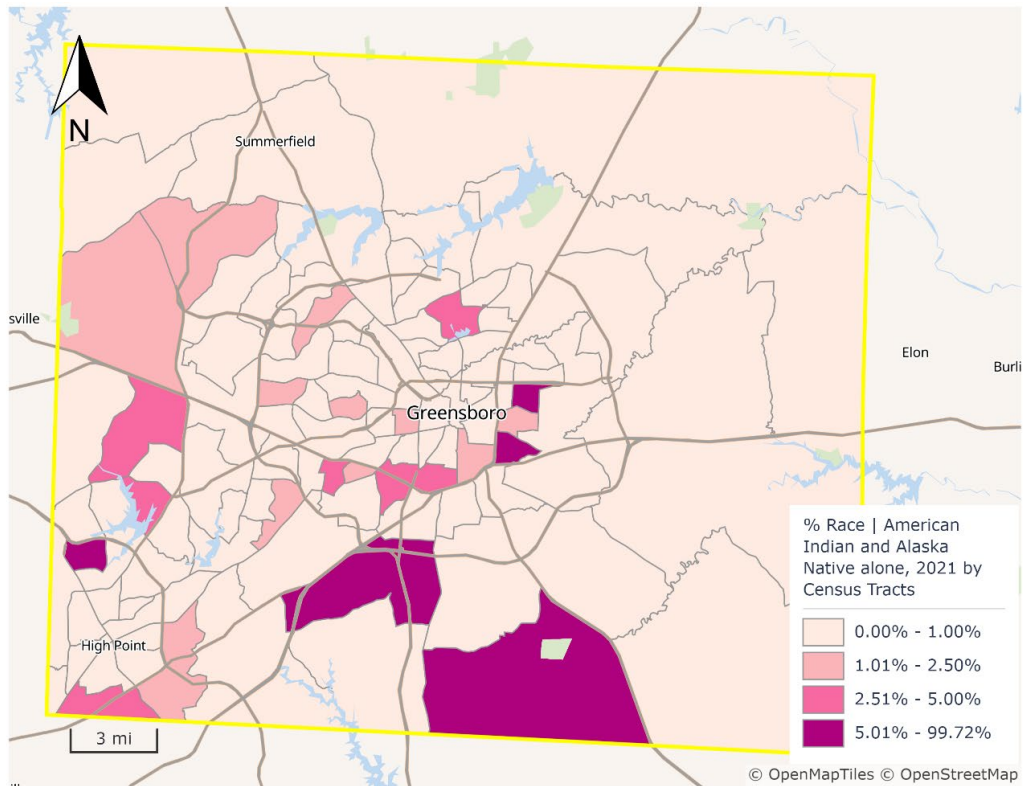


FIGURE 19 – POPULATION NATIVE AMERICAN GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

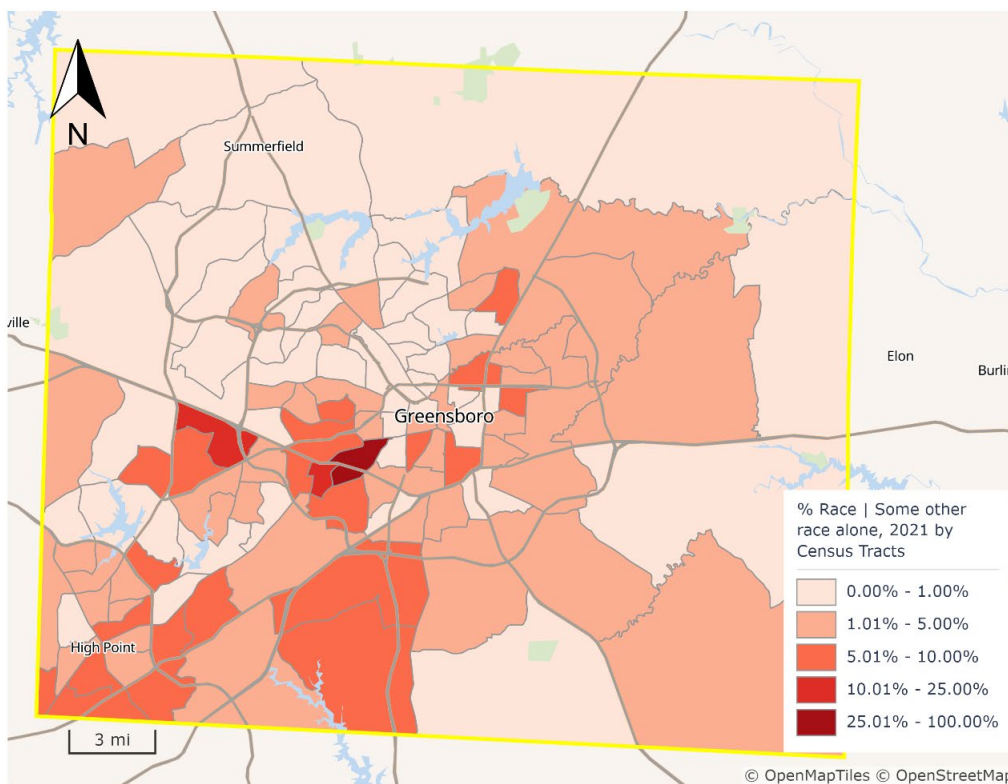


FIGURE 20 – POPULATION OTHER RACE GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

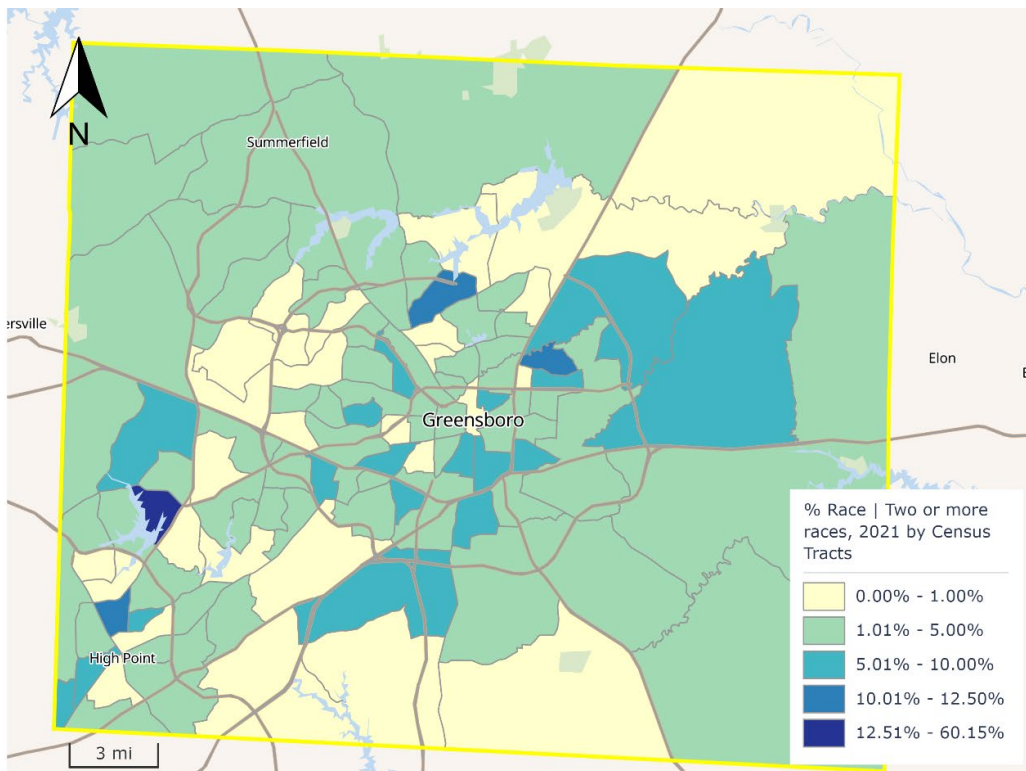


FIGURE 21 – POPULATION TWO OR MORE RACES GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

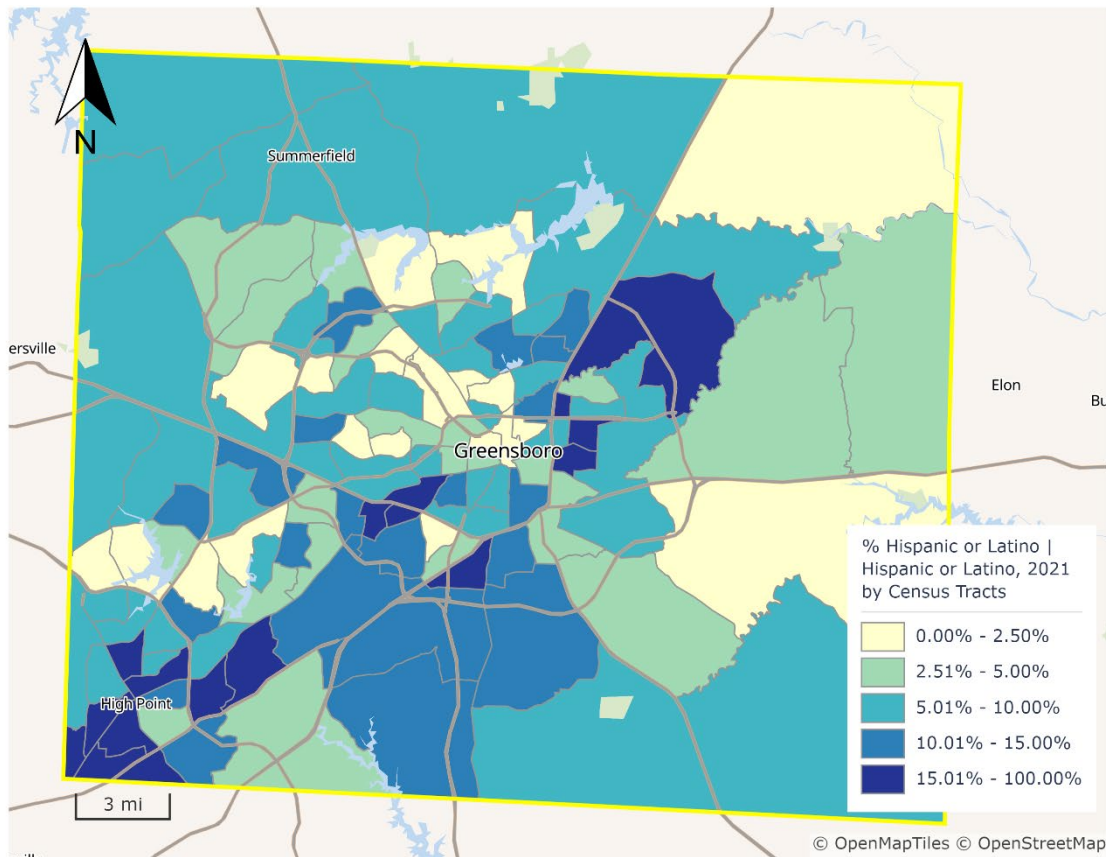


FIGURE 22 – HISPANIC POPULATION GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

Citizenship among US and Foreign Born

Three refugee resettlement agencies are active in bringing more diverse foreign-born populations to the area. Data from the U.S. Census Bureau for 2016-2020 indicates that 57,152 people or 10.72% of the population living in this area are foreign-born. The Census defines foreign born as anyone who was not a U.S. citizen at birth. In general, there was a low percentage of foreign-born citizens in the more rural areas of the county. High Point has a higher percentage foreign born (14.1%) than Greensboro (11.2%). About half (47.0%) of foreign born are naturalized citizens with the largest population coming from Asia (10,870). Of the 30,161 foreign born who are not naturalized, 12,426 (or 41.2%) were from Latin America and 11,797 (39.1%) were from Asia. A majority of households (85.6%) speak only English in the home, whereas 6.3% of households are Spanish speaking, 1.8% speak a European language other than English or Spanish, and 1.6% speak an Asian language.

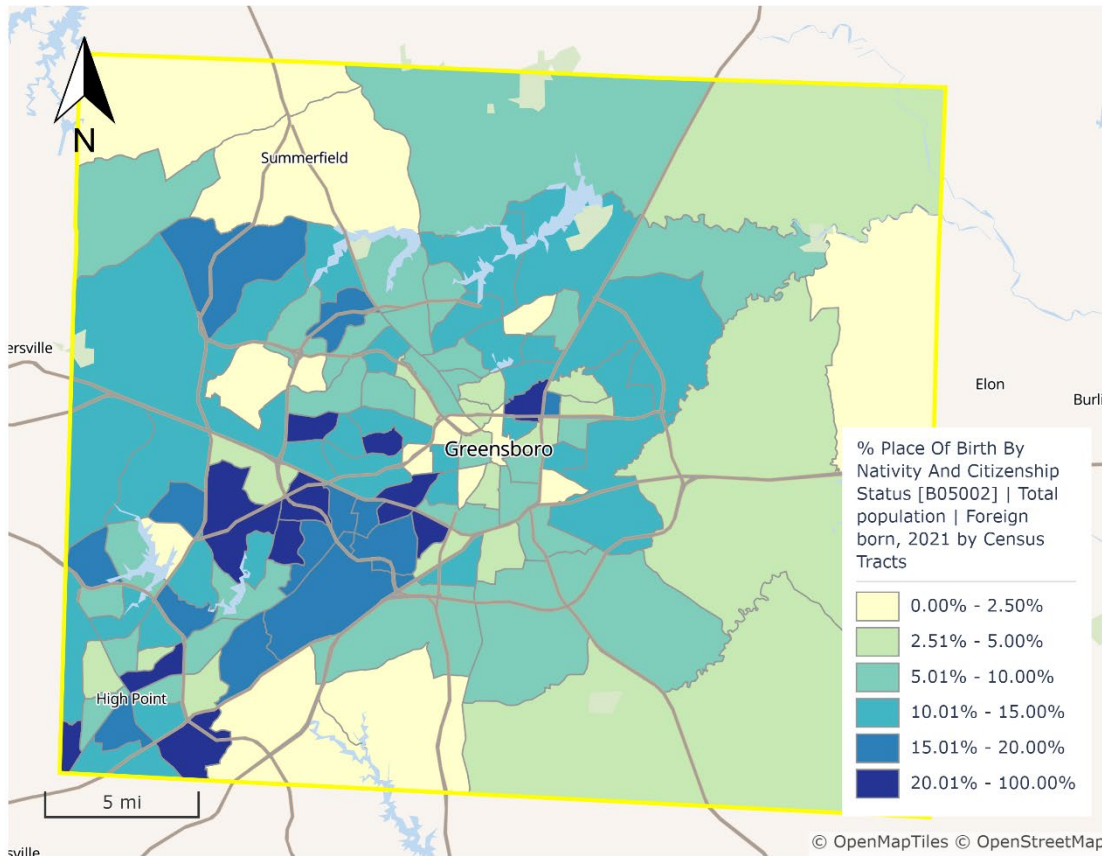


FIGURE 23 – FOREIGN BORN POPULATION GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

Household Income

The per capita Guilford County household income was \$31,048 while the median household income was \$53,756 (ACS 2021) down significantly from 2019. Importantly, a quarter (25.5%) of the households in Guilford County had an income below \$20,000 and 45.4% of households (93,291) had an annual income of less than \$50,000). Income was highest in northwest Greensboro and northwest High Point and lowest in south and east Greensboro and south High Point.

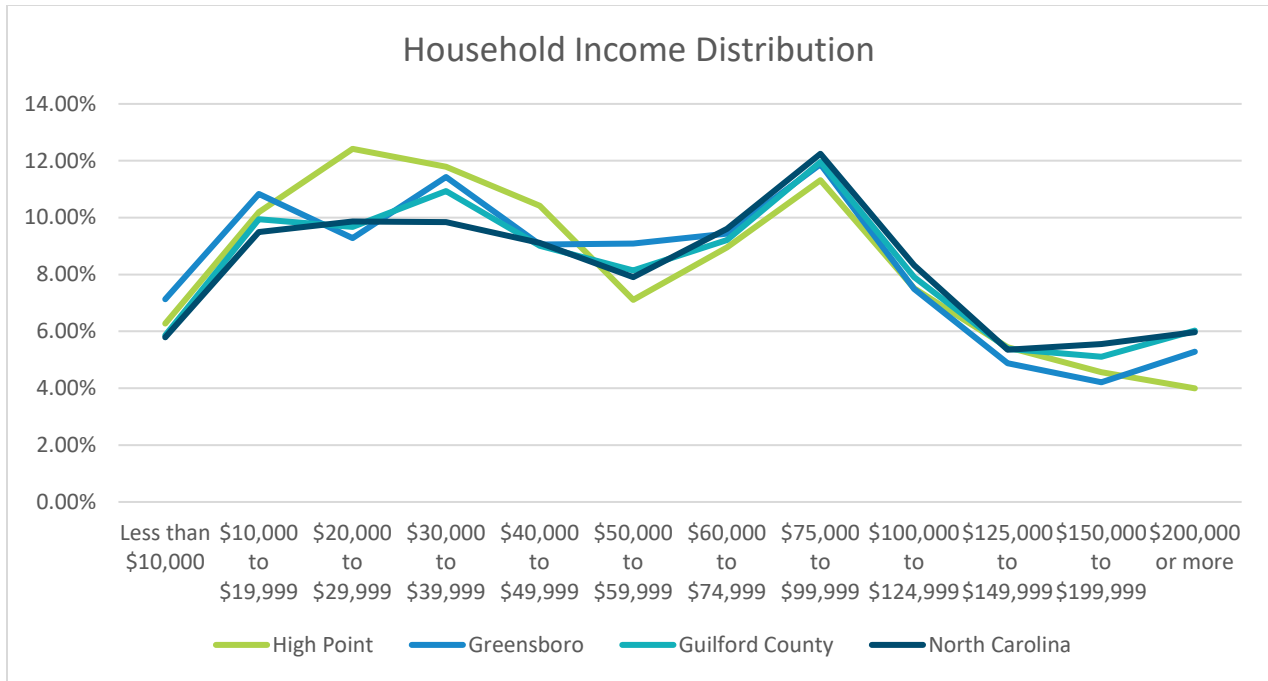


FIGURE 24 – COMPARISON OF HOUSEHOLD INCOME DISTRIBUTION (ACS 2021).

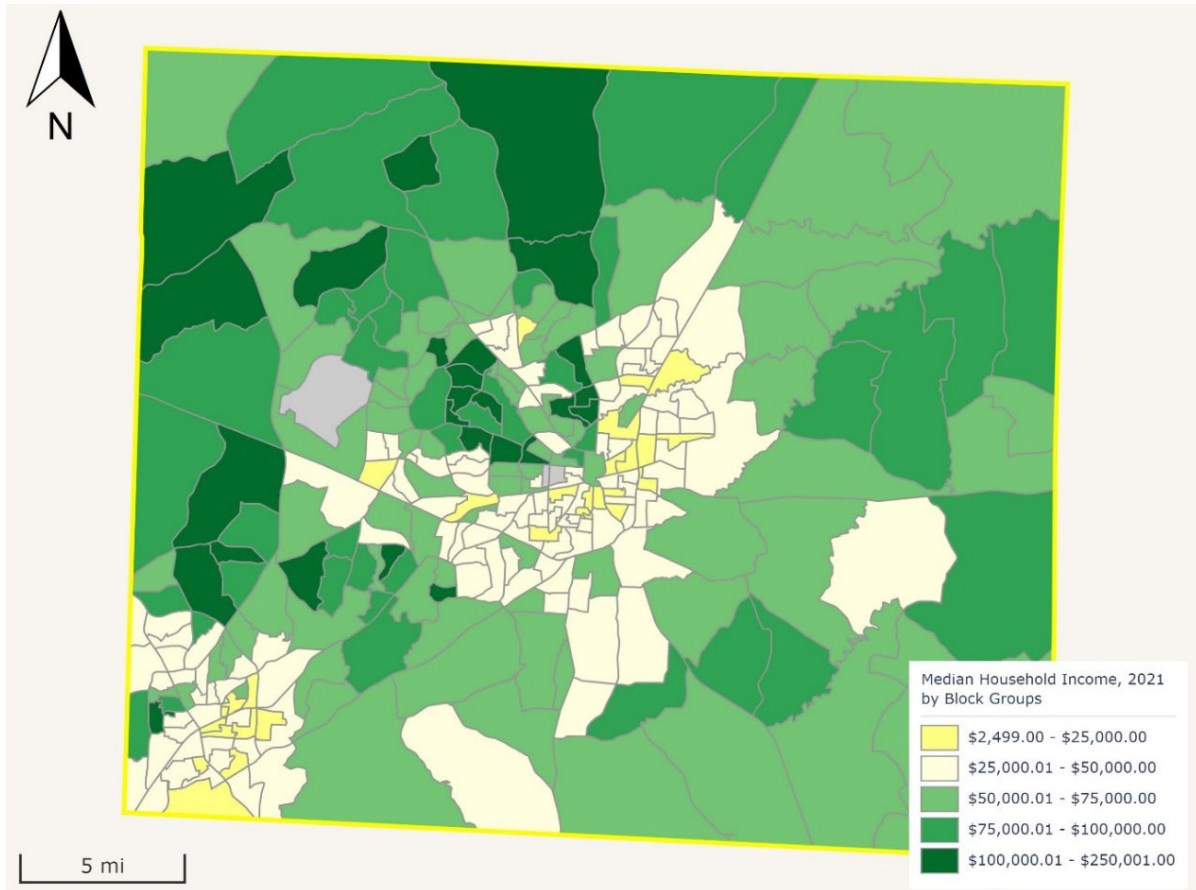


FIGURE 25 – MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP (ACS 2021)

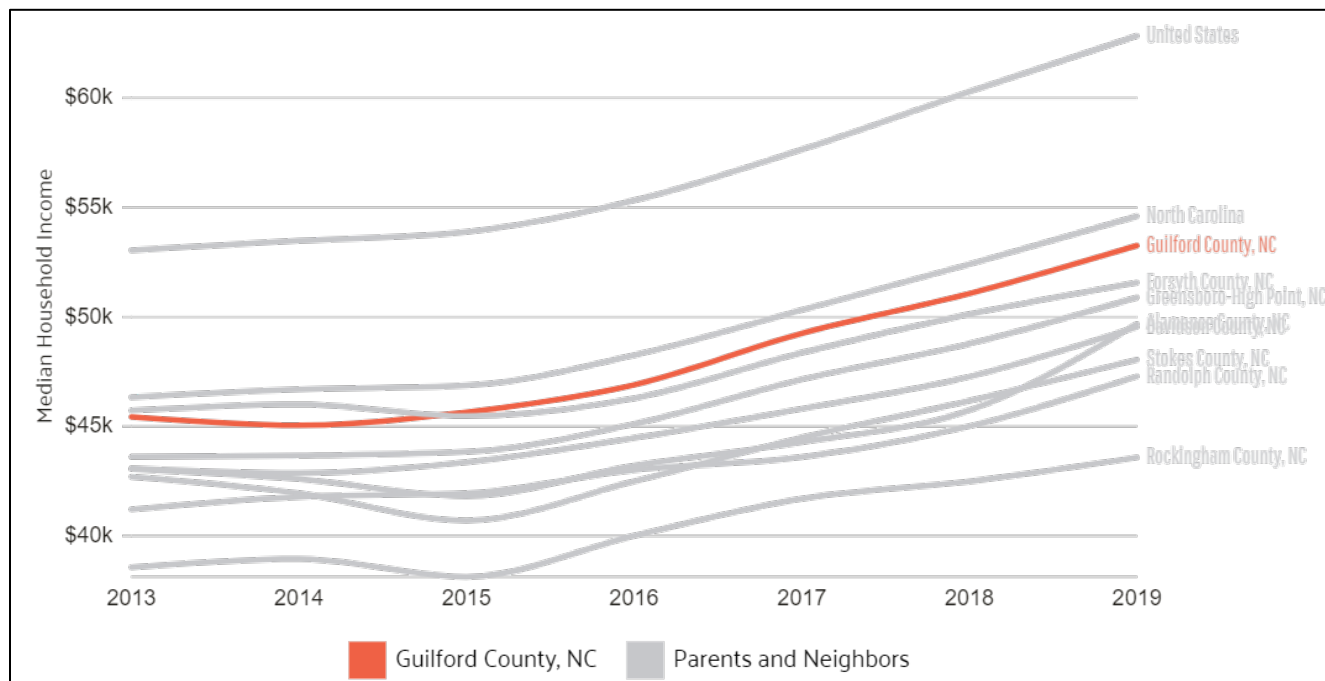


FIGURE 26 - COMPARISON OF MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME 2013-2019 BY COUNTY

Source of Income

About three-quarters (76.4%) of households earned income from wages or salary while 30.8% received Social Security Income, 18.2% earned income from investments, and 19.8% received retirements income (ACS 2021). One-in-six Guilford County households (14.3%) also received public assistance or food stamps/SNAP. A tenth are self-employed (10.0%). It was noted that many households receive income from multiple sources.

Poverty

According to the Census (ACS 2021), there are about 77,833 individuals in poverty in Guilford County, about 15% of the total population. In 2019, 37,243 individuals (or 31.6%) in Guilford County received cash public assistance income, food stamps/SNAP, or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) in the last 12 months. While only 9.8% of the White population was in poverty, 22% of African Americans were in poverty. Of those over 65, about a tenth (9.2%) are living in poverty (ACS 2013-2017). About a fifth of children under the age of 18 (21.3%) live in households under the poverty line (24,159 children in all). More than half (54.9%) of the 31,224 households that are headed by a single female householder (female householder, no husband present) with own children were below poverty level (ACS 2021).

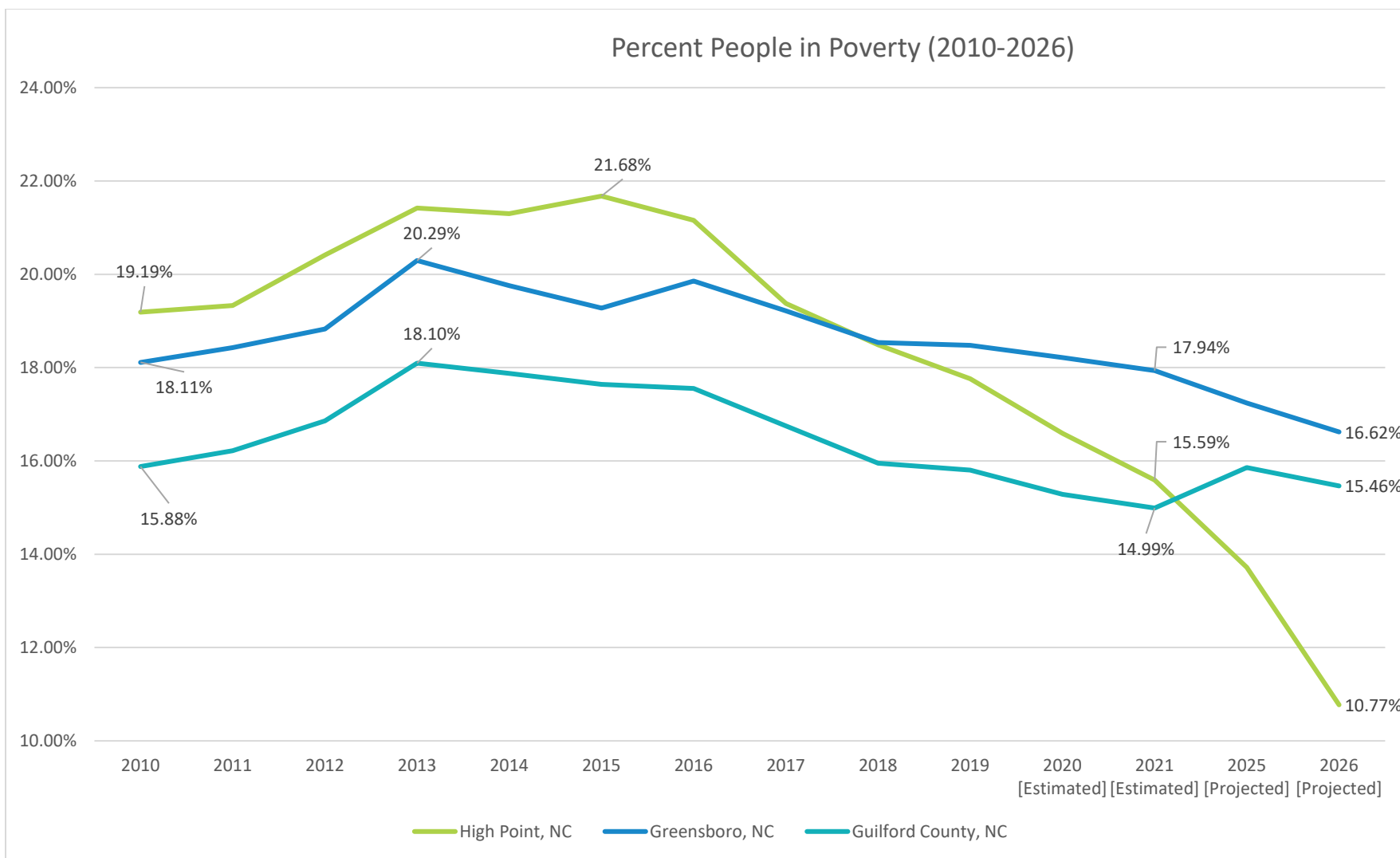


FIGURE 27 – POPULATION IN POVERTY IN HIGH POINT, GREENSBORO, AND GUILFORD COUNTY NORTH CAROLINA 2010-2019

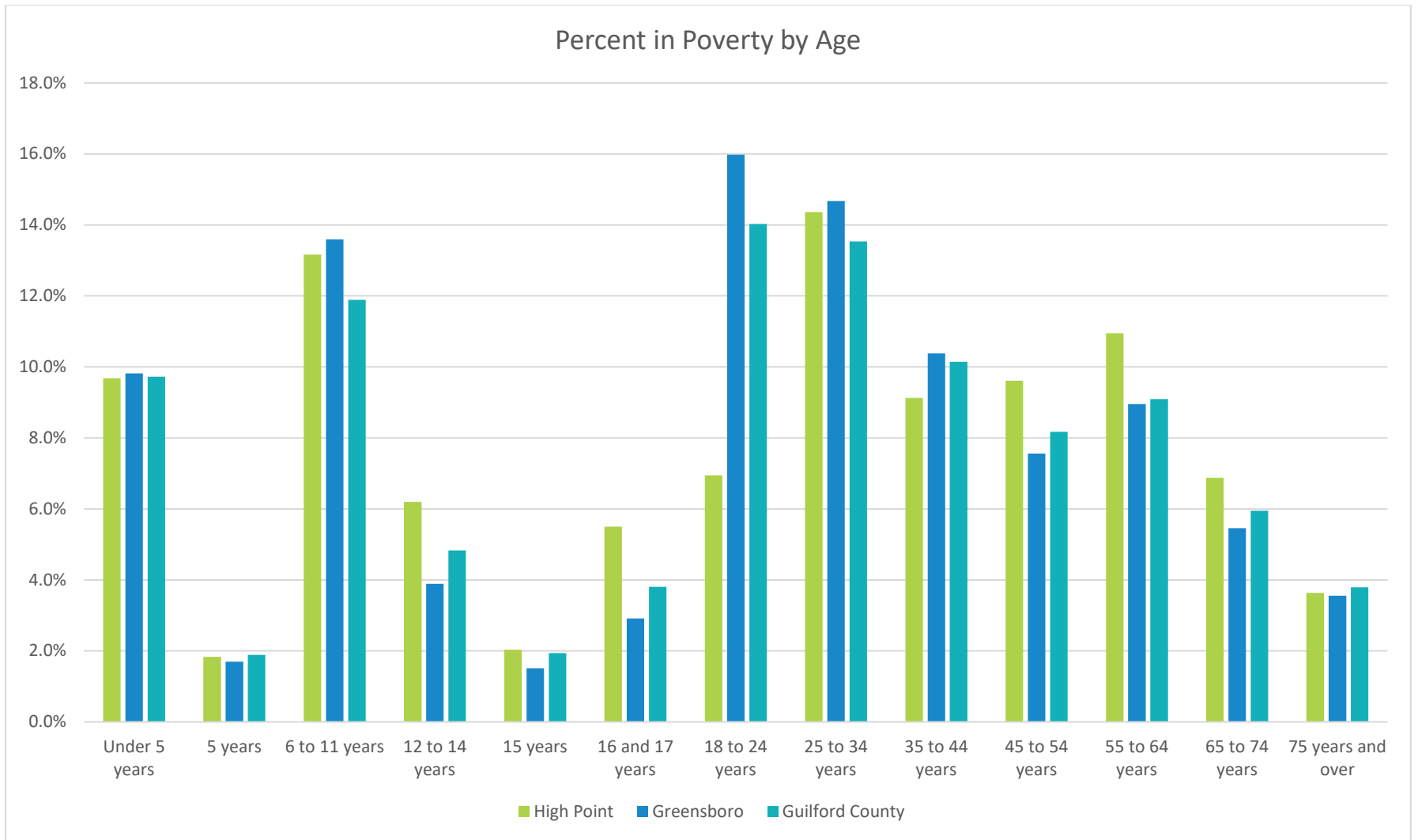


FIGURE 28 - PERCENT OF INDIVIDUALS IN POVERTY BY AGE (ACS 2021)

Concentrations of Poverty

Within the county, there was a geographic trend of tracts with high percentage of people in poverty concentrated in urban centers and correlated with tracts that are a high percentage minority. Four of the Census Tracts in High Point and six the Census Tracts in Greensboro have been designated as having persistent poverty according to the CDFI Fund (2017). The tract with the highest percentage of people in poverty (62.5%) was an urban area which includes the Warnersville, Smith Homes, and Oak Grove neighborhoods in Greensboro (Census Tracts 011400). This tract was 91.8% non-white. Furthermore, the median income of the tract was \$26,432 just under 50% AMI. In High Point, poverty is concentrated in the Core City. These same areas (Census Tracts 144.08, 143, and 138) have been designated as concentrations of “persistent poverty” where 20 percent or more of the population has been living in poverty over the past 30 years (Brown University Longitudinal Tract Database, Policy Map, Census)

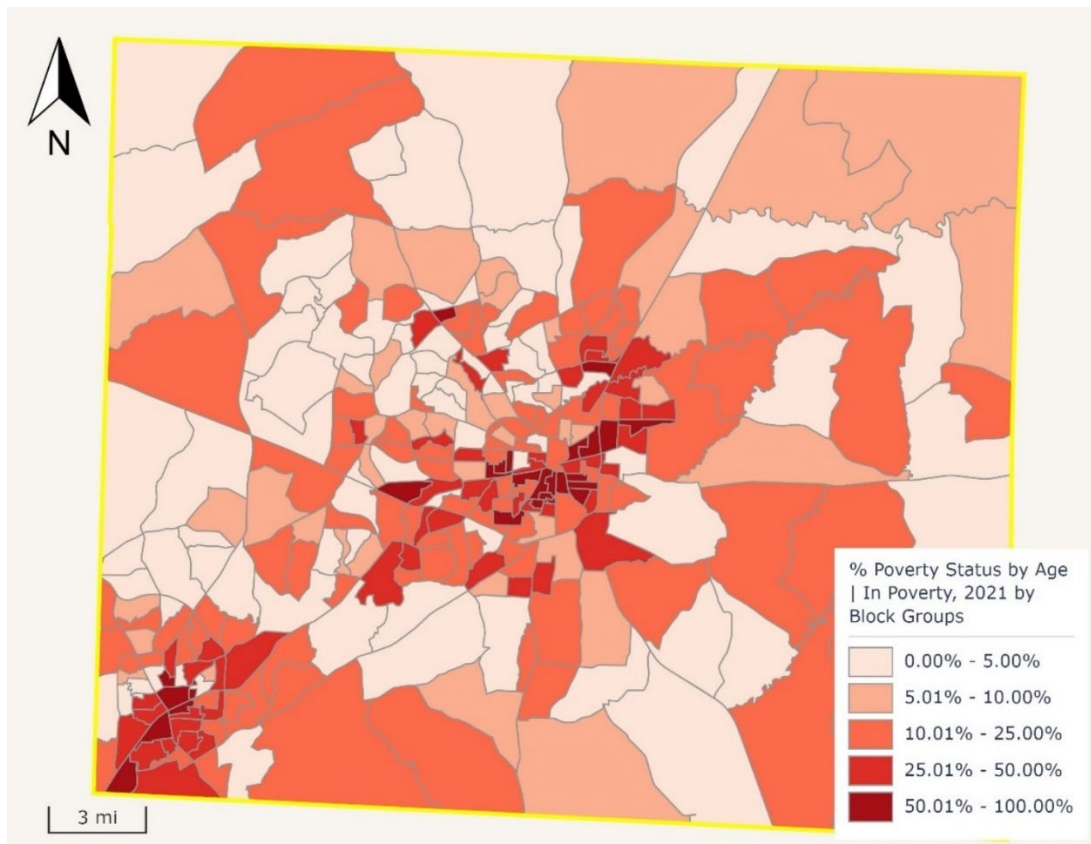


FIGURE 29 – PERCENT IN POVERTY GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP (ACS 2021)

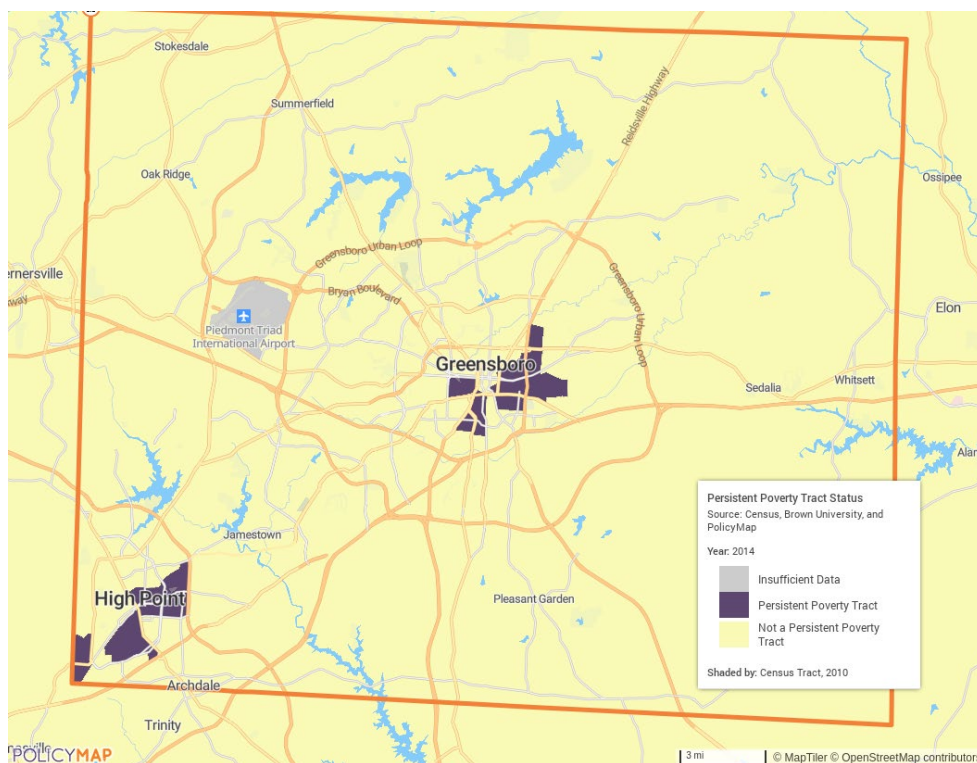


FIGURE 30 - PERSISTENT POVERTY TRACTS, GUILFORD COUNTY

Labor Force Participation

There was a total of 247,759 workers employed in the county and 258,816 adults who are not in the labor force (BLS 2022). The leading employment sectors based on number of people employed (ACS 2016-2020) included: Health Care, Manufacturing, and Retail Trade. According to Data USA, the highest paying industries are Management of Companies & Enterprises (\$62,096), Professional, Scientific, & Technical Services (\$58,940), and Finance & Insurance (\$52,459).

Data from the American Community Survey 2021 shows that 63.04% of the population over the age of 16 in Guilford County were in the labor force. People not in the labor force are described as students, homemakers, retired workers, off season workers, institutionalized peoples, and those doing unpaid family work. In Guilford County, 62.94% were in the civilian workforce and just 0.9% were in the armed forces. More than a third (36.91%) were not in the labor force.

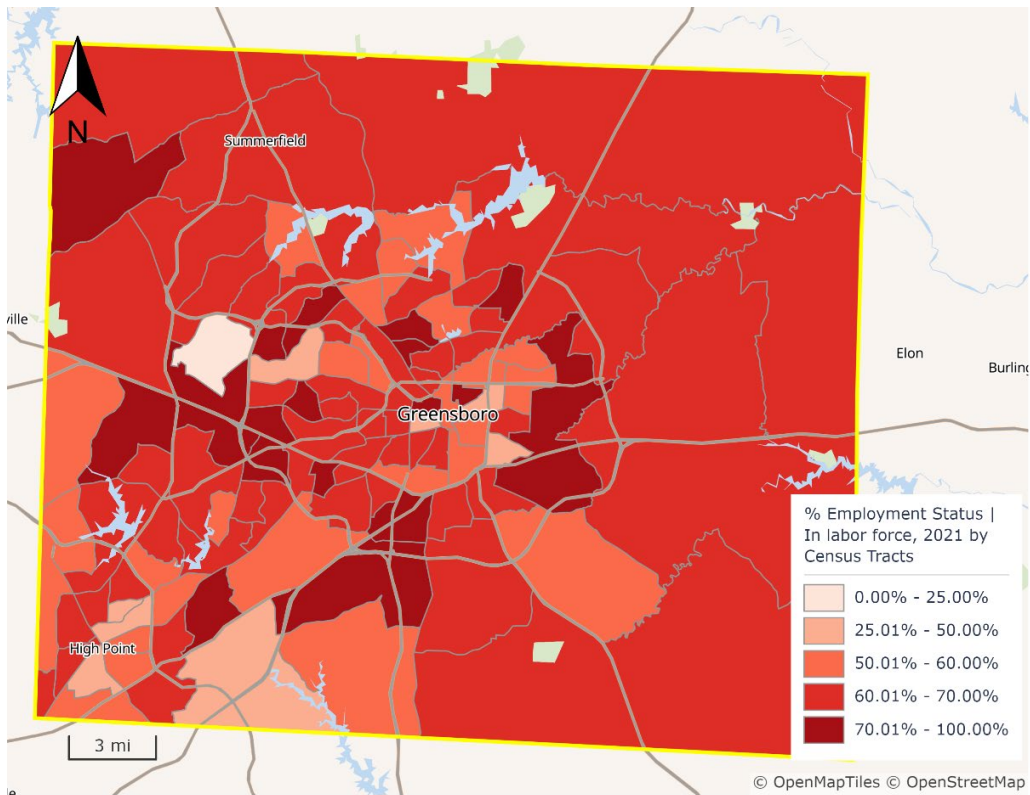


FIGURE 31 – PERCENT IN LABOR FORCE GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

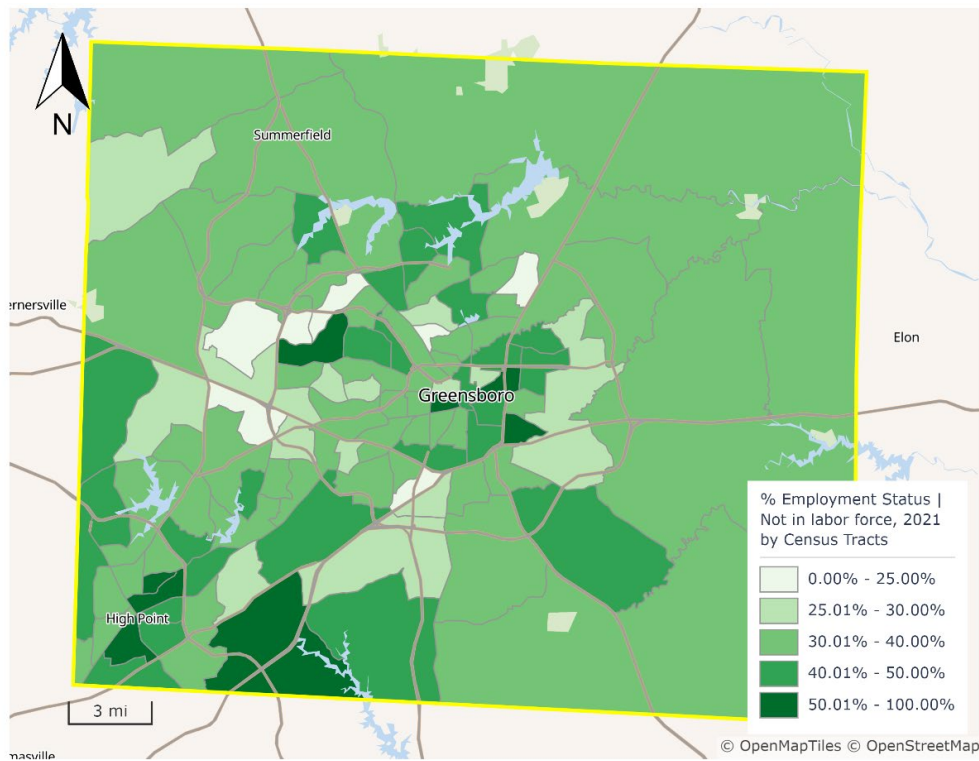


FIGURE 32 – PERCENT NOT IN LABOR FORCE GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

Employers

Employment by Industry

Education Services, Health Care, and Social Assistance is the major employment sector in the county with about 23.03% of the labor market. Second is manufacturing sector with 11.76% and closely followed by Retail Trade with 11.26%. The leading employers in the county include schools (Guilford County Schools, UNCG, NCA&T), health systems (Cone and Wake Forest), parcel shipping (US Postal Service, UPS), and government (Guilford County, Greensboro, High Point).

Unemployment Rate

Unemployed persons are anyone who was not at work, was actively looking for work in the last month and able to start a job or was waiting to be called back to job that had laid them off during the reference week for the data collection. Overall, Guilford County has an unemployment rate of 4.3% as of July 2022, down significantly from the COVID19 Pandemic high of 15.8% (May 2020), but not back to the pre-pandemic low of 3.3% in Dec 2019. There was a general trend of higher unemployment rates in the urban areas of Greensboro and High Point.

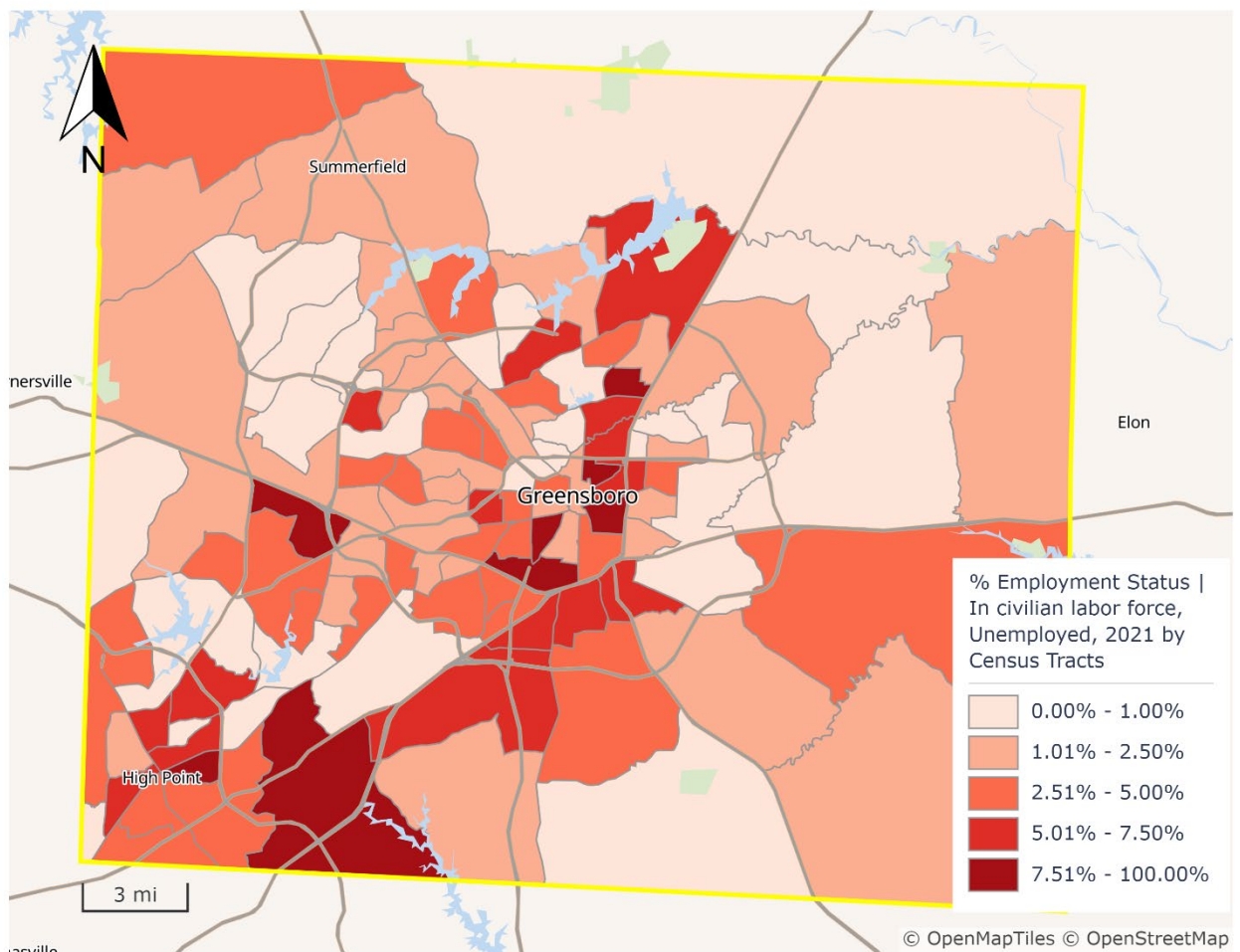


FIGURE 33 -UNEMPLOYMENT RATE GUILFORD COUNTY BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

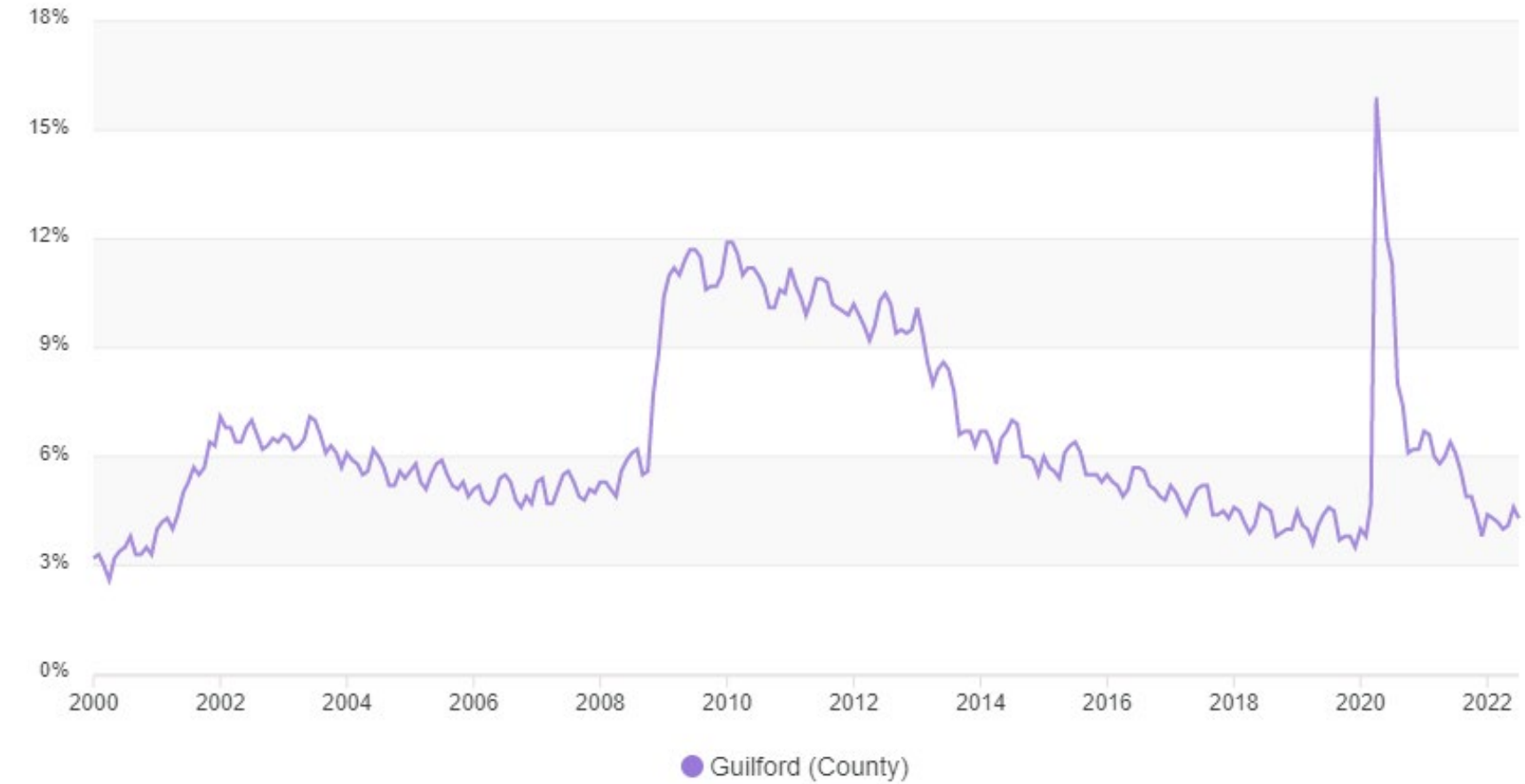


FIGURE 34 -UNEMPLOYMENT RATE GUILFORD COUNTY 2000-2022 (BLS Q2 2022)

Educational Attainment

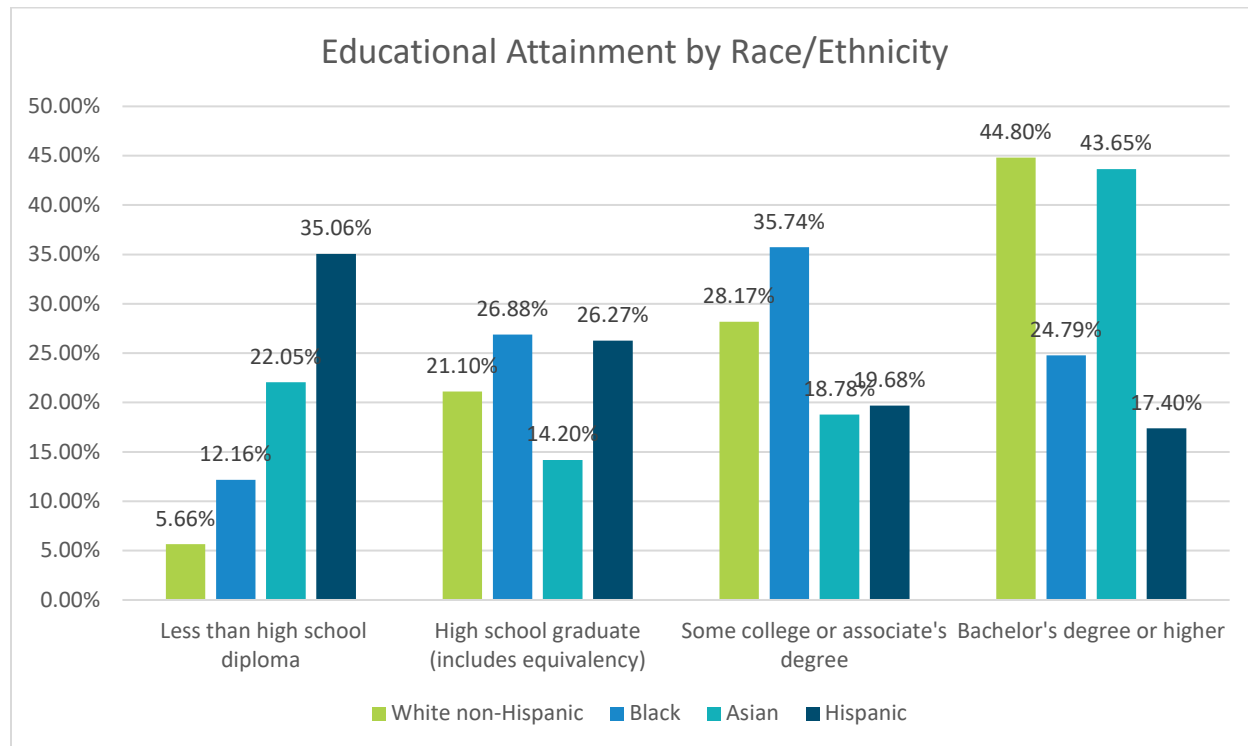


FIGURE 35 – EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT BY RACE/ETHNICITY GUILFORD COUNTY, NC (ACS 2021)

Educational attainment in Guilford County was high with 87.3% of adults completing high school/GED or more, and 35.9% of adults have a higher education degree (bachelor’s, master’s, or doctorate; ACS 2021). Guilford County Schools has 126 schools and 70,047 students. Only 37% of elementary students tested at or above the proficient level for reading, and 33% tested at or above that level for math. The average high school graduation rate is 82.0%. According to the Consumer Expenditure Estimates by SimplyAnalytics (2022), the average household expenditure on education was \$1,041.48 with the largest share being for College Tuition. In total, county-wide, households spent \$225,077,179 on education.

There is a racial achievement gap in educational attainment with 87.4% of the African American population 25 years and older having a high school diploma or greater level of education compared to 94.1% of the white population (ACS 2021). The gap is even more apparent with the percentage of the population having attained at least a bachelor’s degree: 24.8% for African Americans and 44.8% for whites.

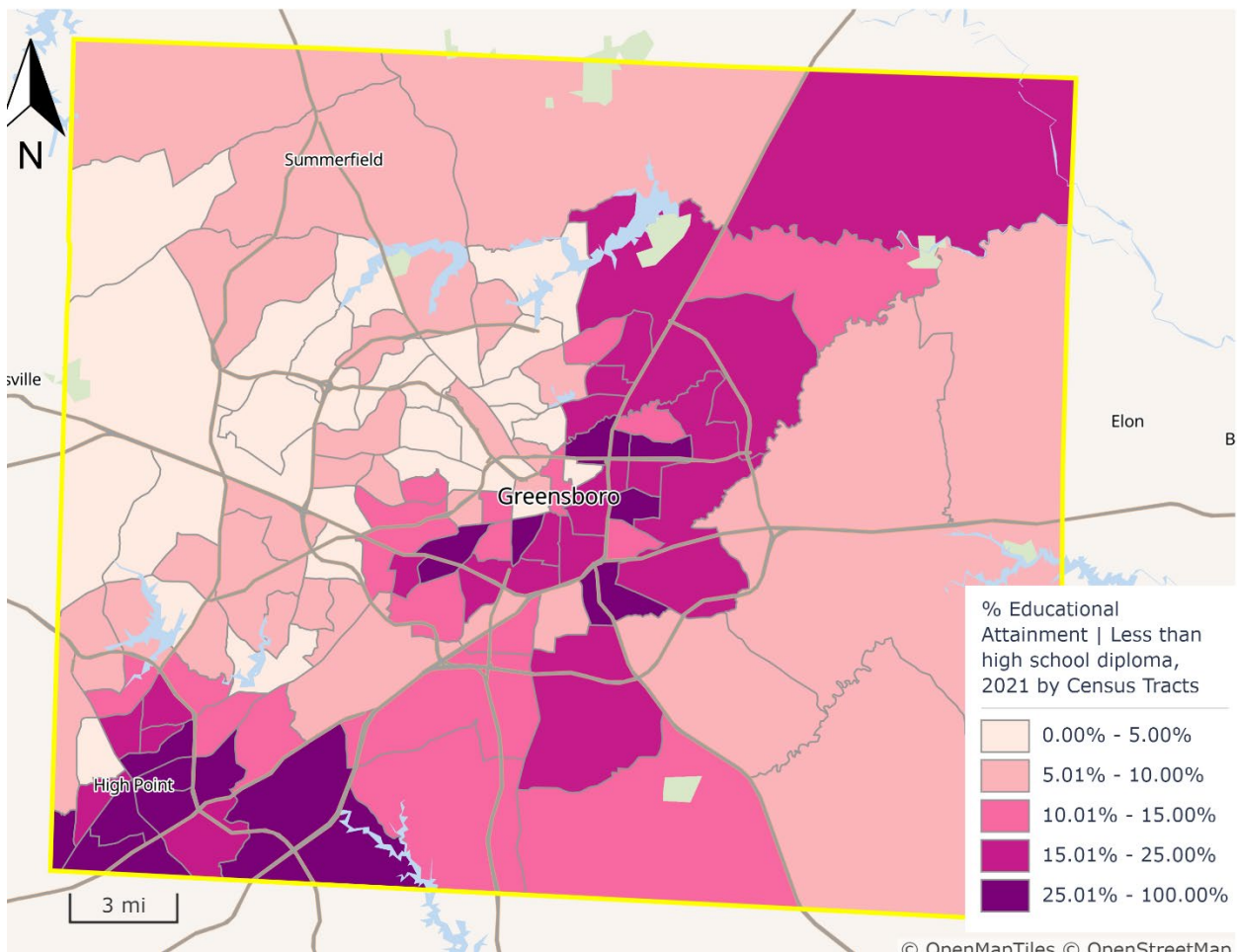


FIGURE 36 – PERCENT LESS THAN HS DIPLOMA GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

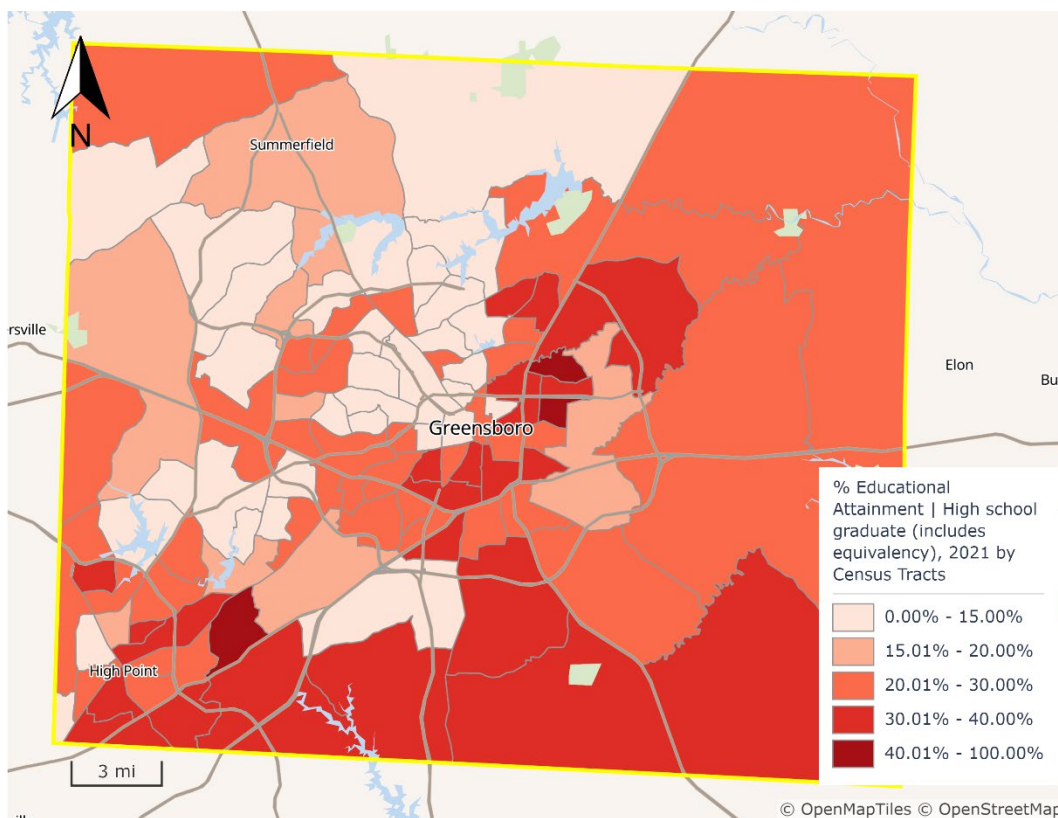


FIGURE 37 – PERCENT HS/GED ONLY GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP (ACS 2013-2017)

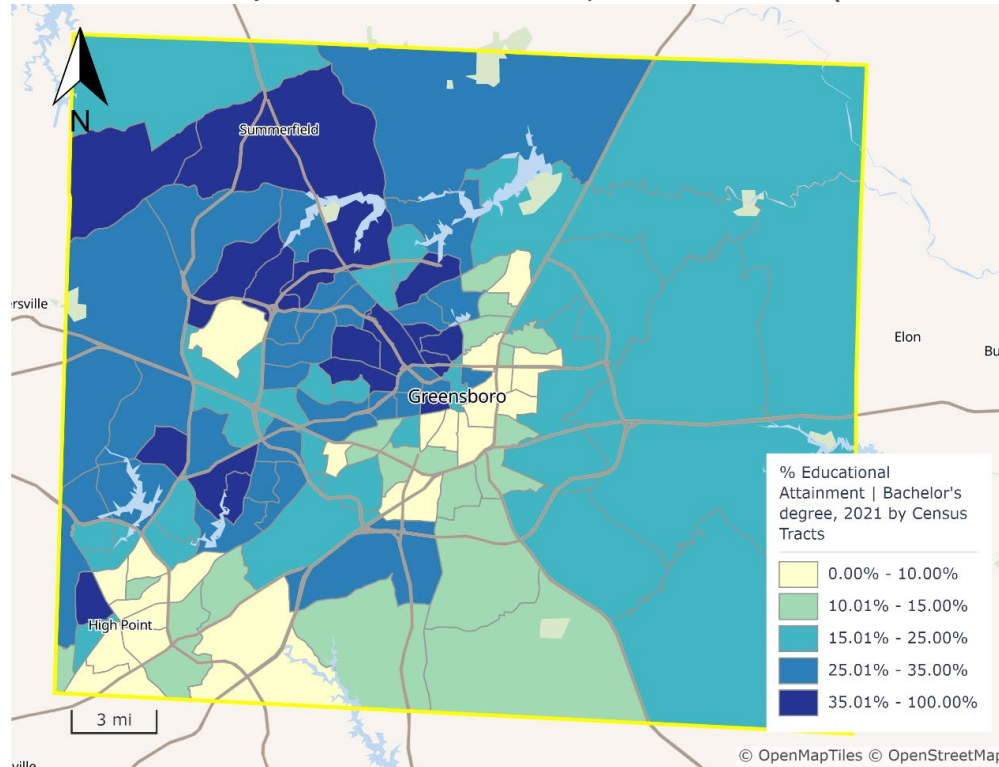


FIGURE 38 – PERCENT BACHELOR'S GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

Community Health

Health Care

There are a number of Health and Well-Being Facilities in Guilford County. The area is served by two major hospital systems, Cone Health and Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist High Point Medical Center, with a total of four hospitals (High Point Regional, Moses Cone Memorial, Westly Long, and Kindred Hospital) with a total of 1,607 beds. There are six community health centers and “look-alikes” operated by Triad Adult and Pediatric Medicine, Inc. Other health-care assets include 13 mental health facilities (SAMHSA 2019), 21 nursing facilities, and 34 drug and alcohol treatment facilities (SAMHSA 2019). There are .55 dentists and .79 primary care physicians per 1,000 individuals (HRSA). Nonetheless, 5 urban census tracts (Greensboro’s south and eastside)¹ have been designated as Medically Underserved Areas for having too few primary care providers, high infant mortality, high poverty, and/or a high elderly population by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA 2022).

The County has an active Public Health Department that partners with community groups and individuals on a variety of health-related projects. It routinely creates a community input process on health issues and health action planning including the Community Health Assessment/Community Health Needs Assessment (CHA/CHNA) every three years.

Health Insurance

According to American Community Survey data urban areas had a higher percentage of residents without health insurance in comparison to rural tracts. Overall, 11.7% of residents *do not* have health insurance which was above the state’s average of 10.7% and the national average of 8.5%.

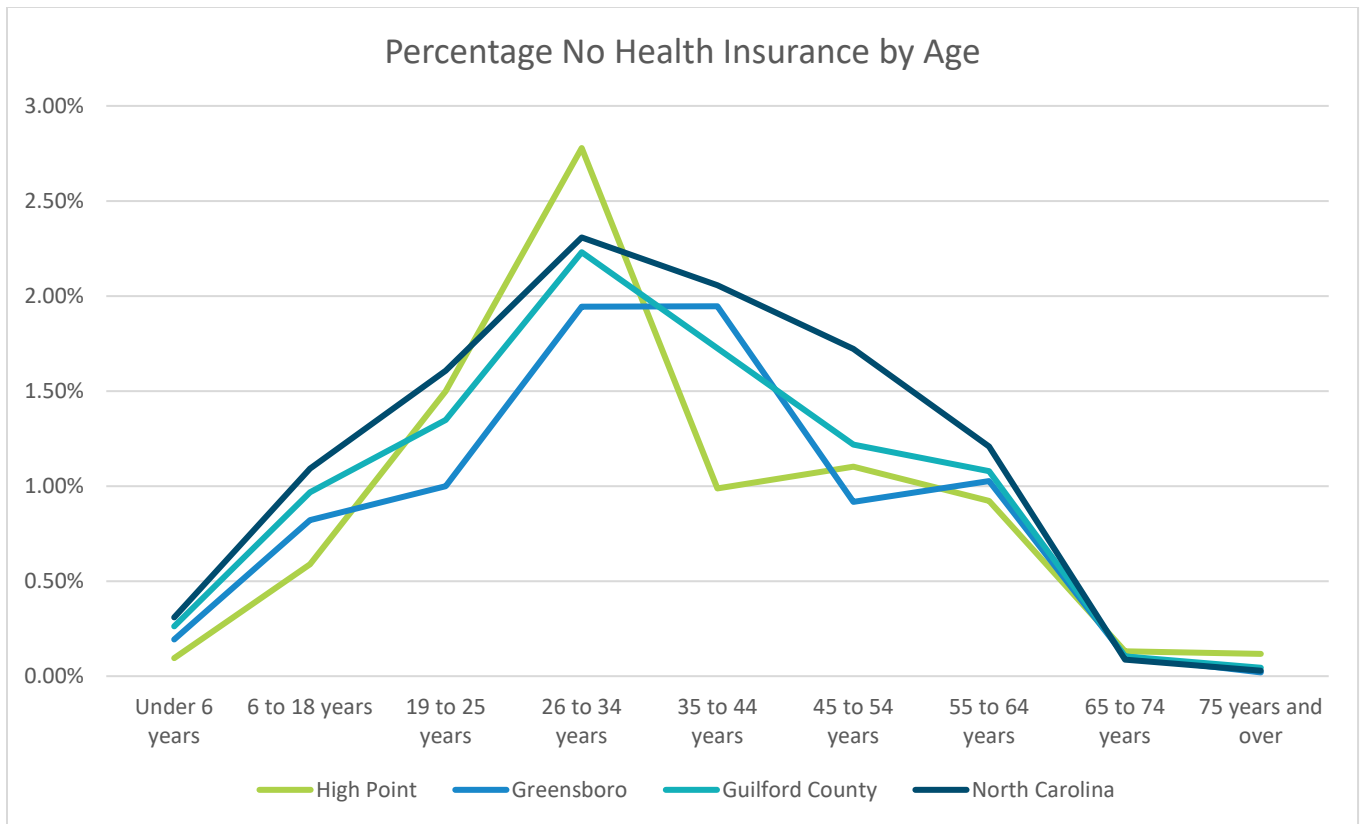


FIGURE 39 - PERCENTAGE NO HEALTH INSURANCE BY AGE GUILFORD COUNTY

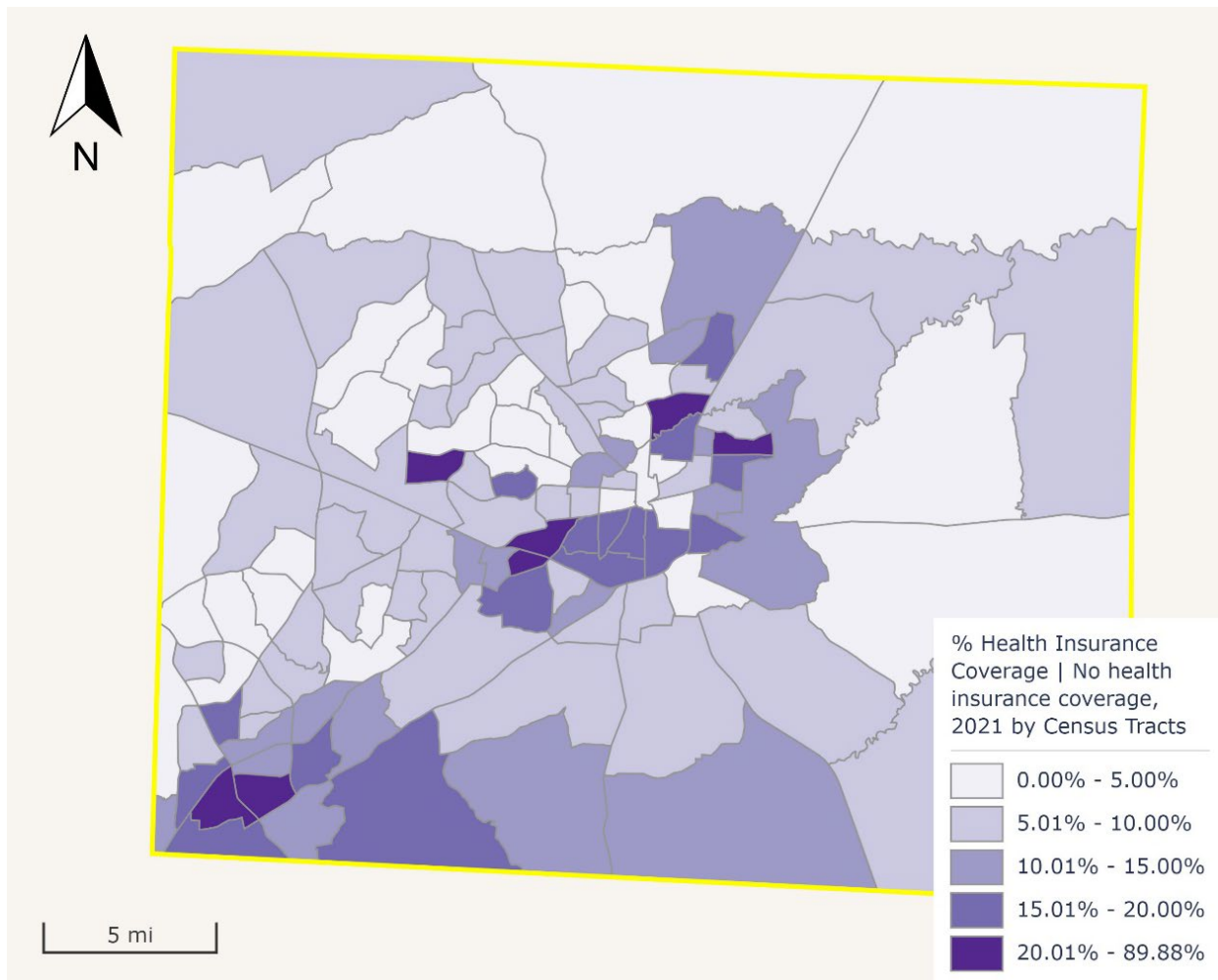


FIGURE 40 – POPULATION WITHOUT HEALTH INSURANCE GUILFORD COUNTY, NC 2021

Community Health Characteristics

Guilford County is ranked 30th from the top out of 100 counties in NC for overall health outcomes. About one-in-seven residents (13.8%) self-report fair to poor physical health and likewise one-in-seven (13.6%) report poor mental health in the past two weeks (CDC PLACES, 2020)². Life expectancy in Guilford County is 79 years.

About one-in-seven adults (13.4%) engage in heavy drinking, 16.1% currently smoke, 22.2% report no leisure-time physical activity, and 33.7% report sleeping less than 7 hours (CDC PLACES, 2020). A third (32.3%) report being considered obese

(BMI of 30 or greater) and two thirds (66.1%) of adults are overweight (BMI above 24.9).

Prevention is key to good community health. A majority (80.6%) visited a doctor for routine checkup within the past year. Yet, only 62.1% visited a dentist or dental clinic.

About half (49.4%) of older adult men and 40.1% of older adult women aged ≥ 65 years are up to date on their core set of clinical preventive services (Flu shot past year, PPV shot ever, Colorectal cancer screening, and Mammogram past 2 years). Three-quarters (75.3%) of women ages 50-74 have had a mammogram, and 73.7% of adults aged 50-75 have had a fecal occult blood test, sigmoidoscopy, or colonoscopy. Cervical cancer screening among adult women aged 21-65 years are at 85.1% while cholesterol screening among adults is at 87.5%.

Notably, a third (33.9%) of adults have high blood pressure and 32.6% have high cholesterol. Nearly a quarter (23.5%) of adults have arthritis and 11.1% have been diagnosed with diabetes. One-in-five (19.8%) have depression while 9.3% of adults have asthma. Coronary heart disease (6.5%), cancer (6.4%), and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (6.2%) are prevalent. Less prevalent are the incidence of stroke among adults (3.4%) and chronic kidney disease (3.2%).

Infant Mortality

According to the Guilford County Department of Health and Human Services 2022 *Maternal and Child Health Data Brief*⁴, the infant mortality rate decreased from 9.3 deaths per 1,000 live births in 2019 to a rate of 7.6 in 2020. The Guilford County infant mortality rate is higher than that of the state of North Carolina as well as the US rate. High Point, with 10 infant deaths among 1,183 live births (8.4 per 1,000) is slightly higher as compared with Greensboro’s rate (28 deaths among 3,515 births for a mortality rate of 7.9 per 1,000). Poor birth outcomes are a significant problem for Guilford County, with rates of infant mortality considerably higher than national benchmarks. While mortality rates have come down, low birthweight has increased slightly.

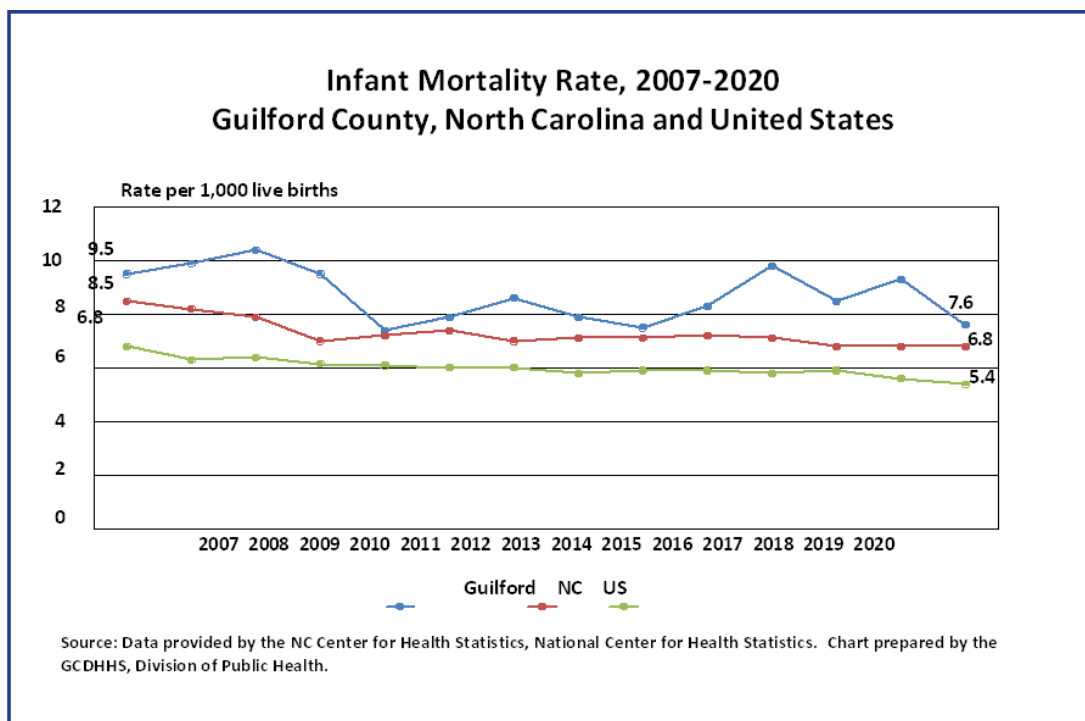


FIGURE 41 - INFANT MORTALITY GUILFORD COUNTY 2007-2020

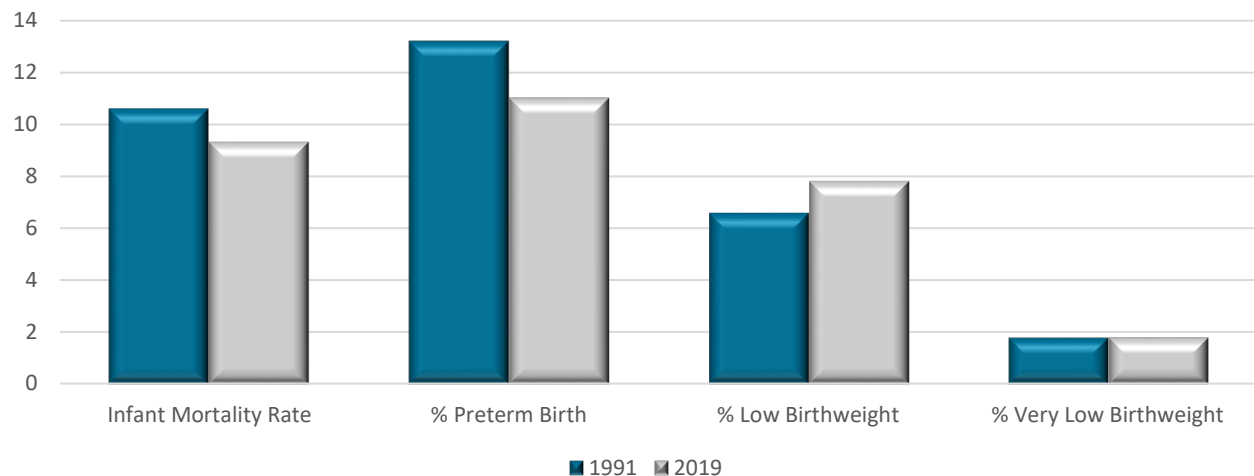


FIGURE 42 - INFANT HEALTH & MORALITY, NC STATE CENTER FOR HEALTH STATISTICS

COVID19 Vaccinations

To date, there have been over 150,000 cases of COVID-19 in Guilford County with a total of 1,133 deaths.⁵ The vaccination rate in the county is comparatively high with 66% receiving at least one dose of the vaccine and 60% having received at least one booster.⁶ A recent survey by UNC Greensboro’s Center for Housing and Community Studies⁷ found that half of respondents who received COVID-19, vaccinations (49.9%) were worried about a family member getting sick from the COVID-19 virus, yet only 26.5% were worried about getting sick themselves. Of those who delayed getting vaccinated, about half (50.2%) were concerned with the speed of the development and approval of the vaccine. Two-fifths (41.9%) of delayed getting the vaccination because they didn’t trust what they were hearing about the vaccine and almost a third (32.4%) were concerned that the vaccine may be a government experiment.

Life Expectancy

Life expectancy at birth was collected from the United States Small-Area Life Expectancy Estimates Project for 2010-2015 by Census tract. There are 12 tracts

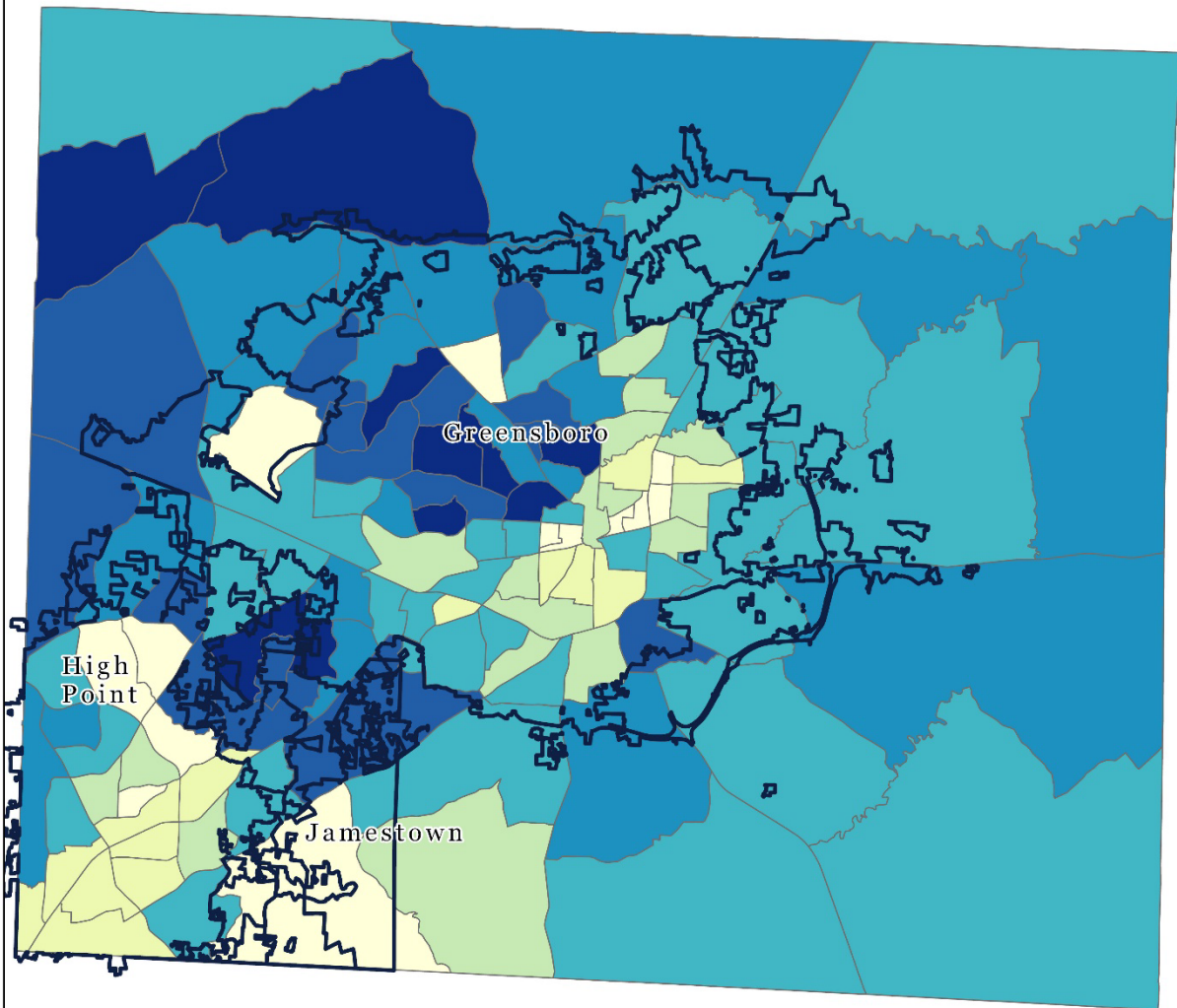

that do not contain life expectancy data—two include university campuses and one the airport. There was a correlation between higher life expectancy and areas with higher income. The average life expectancy for Guilford county was 76.8 years, but the range of average life expectancy varies from a low of 69.3 to 88.0 years (18.7 years difference).

Health Care Expenses

On average individuals spend \$6,121.73 annual dollars out of pocket on health insurance, medical services, medical equipment, and drugs (Consumer Expenditure Estimates 2022). Average household medical services were \$1,189.37 in 2022 while health insurance was \$4,161.23 on average. Households also spent an average of \$213.83 on medical supplies and \$557.30 on drugs (prescription, non-prescription, and vitamins).

Housing

An estimated 41.0% (or 85,275) households rent their homes (ACS five-year estimates 2016-2020). The average rent for an apartment in Greensboro is \$1,147 and \$1,108 in High Point (Rent Café 2022). The median home price in Greensboro is \$242,389 and \$221,207 in High Point (Zillow 2022). One-in-six (16.6%) homeowners and nearly half of renters (45.8%) are cost burdened, spending more than 30% of income on housing-related costs (ACS five-year estimates 2016-2020).

Housing Stock

There were an estimated 230,065 housing units in Guilford County. Nearly two-thirds (68.53%) of the housing stock is single family homes. These include all one-unit structures, both attached (5.73%) and detached (62.80%). A small number of homes are duplexes or 2-unit buildings (1.96%). Units in small apartment building are buildings with 3 to 49 units make up about a quarter (24.19%) of the housing stock. Large apartment buildings include buildings with 50 units or more, and account for only 2.41%. Mobile and manufactured housing accounts for 2.88%.

Median Year Built for Homes

The median year of homes built in Guilford County was 1978. There was a geographic trend of older homes being in the urban centers of Greensboro and High Point and newer homes are in the rural neighborhoods of the county. Newer homes are especially found in the northwest rural regions. The cluster of older homes in urban areas can be explained by their early development as the city began to grow while the newer homes are built on the outskirts of the city due to suburban sprawl.

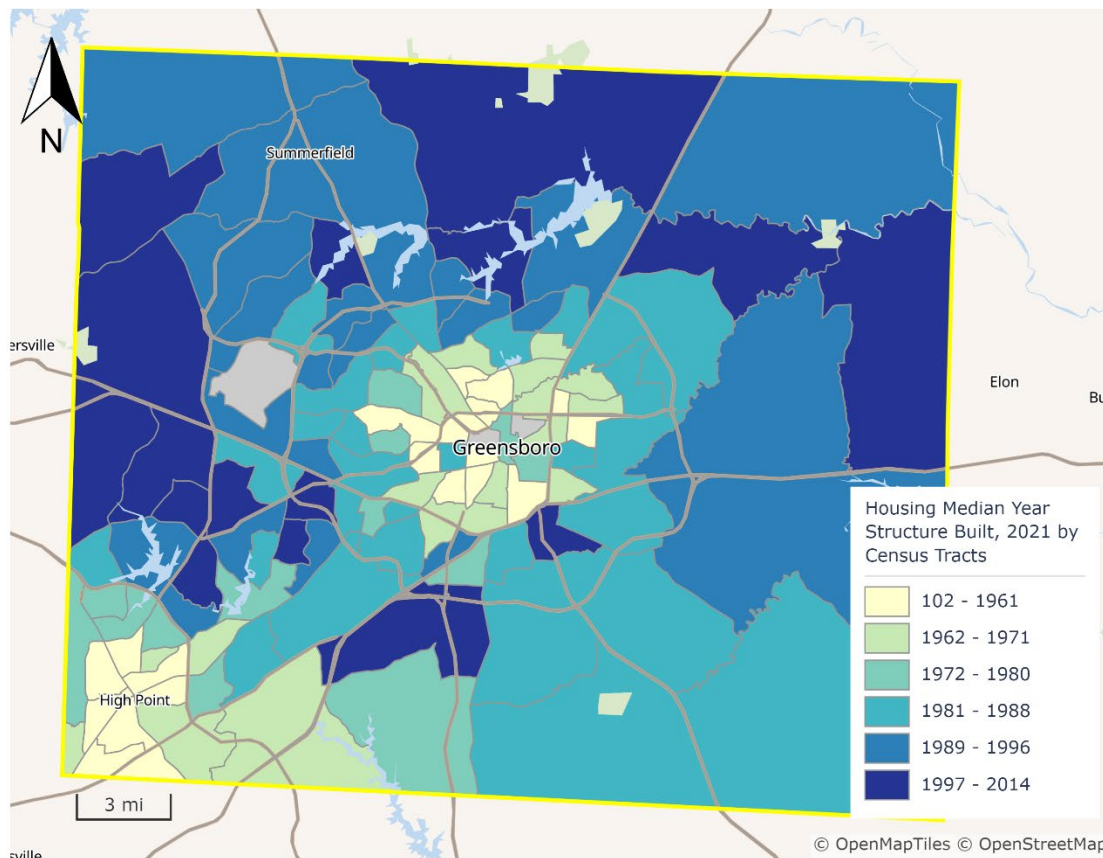


FIGURE 44 – MEDIAN YEAR OF CONSTRUCTION GUILFORD COUNTY, NC (ACS 2021)

Occupancy

Vacancy in Guilford County is very low. Vacancy data from Valassis Lists based on United States Postal Service (USPS), and the USPS Computerized Delivery Sequence (CDS) showed a drop in the vacancy rate from 4.34% in Q3 2014 to 2.5% in Q2 2021. The percentage is calculated as the number of addresses that were vacant, divided by the total number of valid postal addresses, including vacant and no-stat addresses. Vacant postal addresses are those where mail has not been collected for at least 90 days, excluding PO Boxes and rural route addresses. According to ACS 2021 data, the majority of households in Guilford County are occupied (87.5%). There was a geographic pattern of vacant housing concentrated in urban centers of east Greensboro and central High Point (Core City).

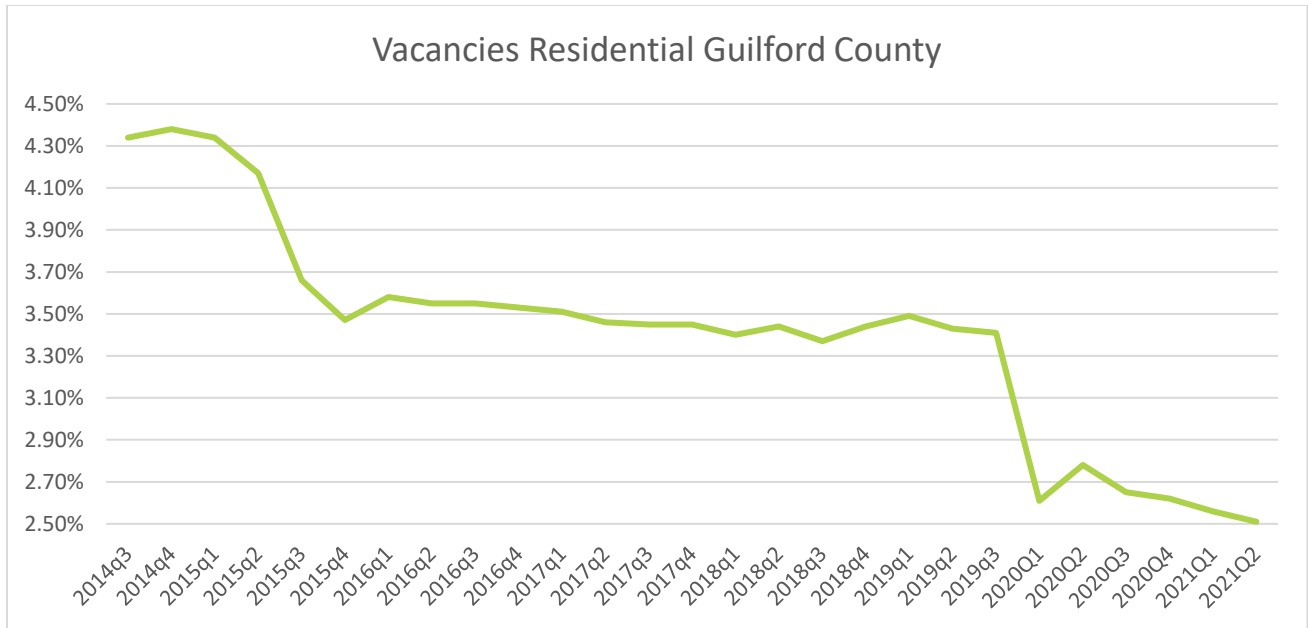


FIGURE 45 – VACANCY RATE BY QUARTER IN GUILFORD COUNTY (VALASSIS DATA)

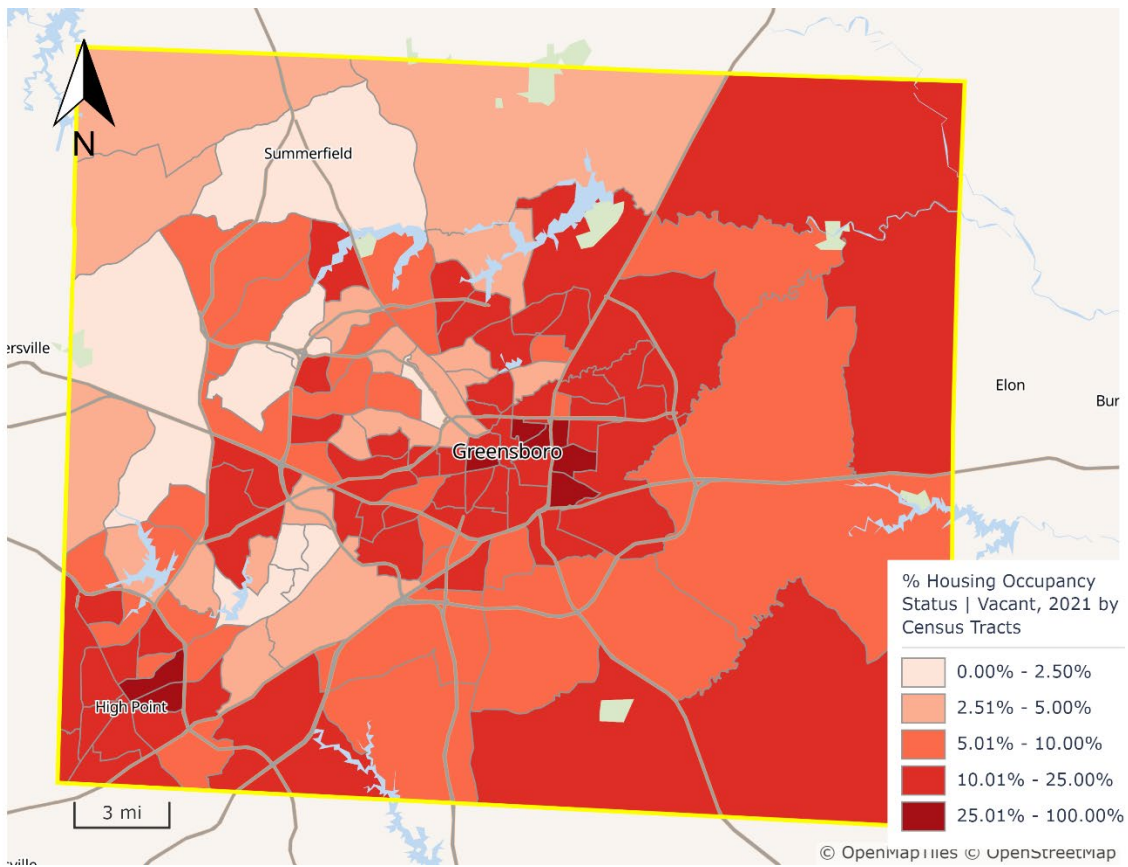


FIGURE 46 – VACANT HOUSING UNITS GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY CENSUS TRACT (ACS 2021)

Owner Occupied Housing [HERE](#)

Of the occupied housing units in Guilford County, 58.9% are owner occupied (ACS 2013-2017). Block groups in rural areas have higher percentages of owner-occupied housing than the urban block groups. Most owners (73.6%) have a mortgage.

There are six block groups with all housing units occupied by owners and in these there are no multi-family dwellings or apartment buildings. Two of the neighborhoods border each other in rural Guilford County, north west of the Greensboro metropolitan area (block groups 160032 and 160083). Two of the block groups are in Irving Park (block groups 104041 and 104042) and another was nearby in Carriage Hills (block group 125112). The last neighborhood was adjacent to Sedgefield Country Club (block group 165024). Owner occupancy is lowest in East Greensboro and South High Point where poverty is highest.

Percent of Housing Units Occupied by Owner, 2013-2017

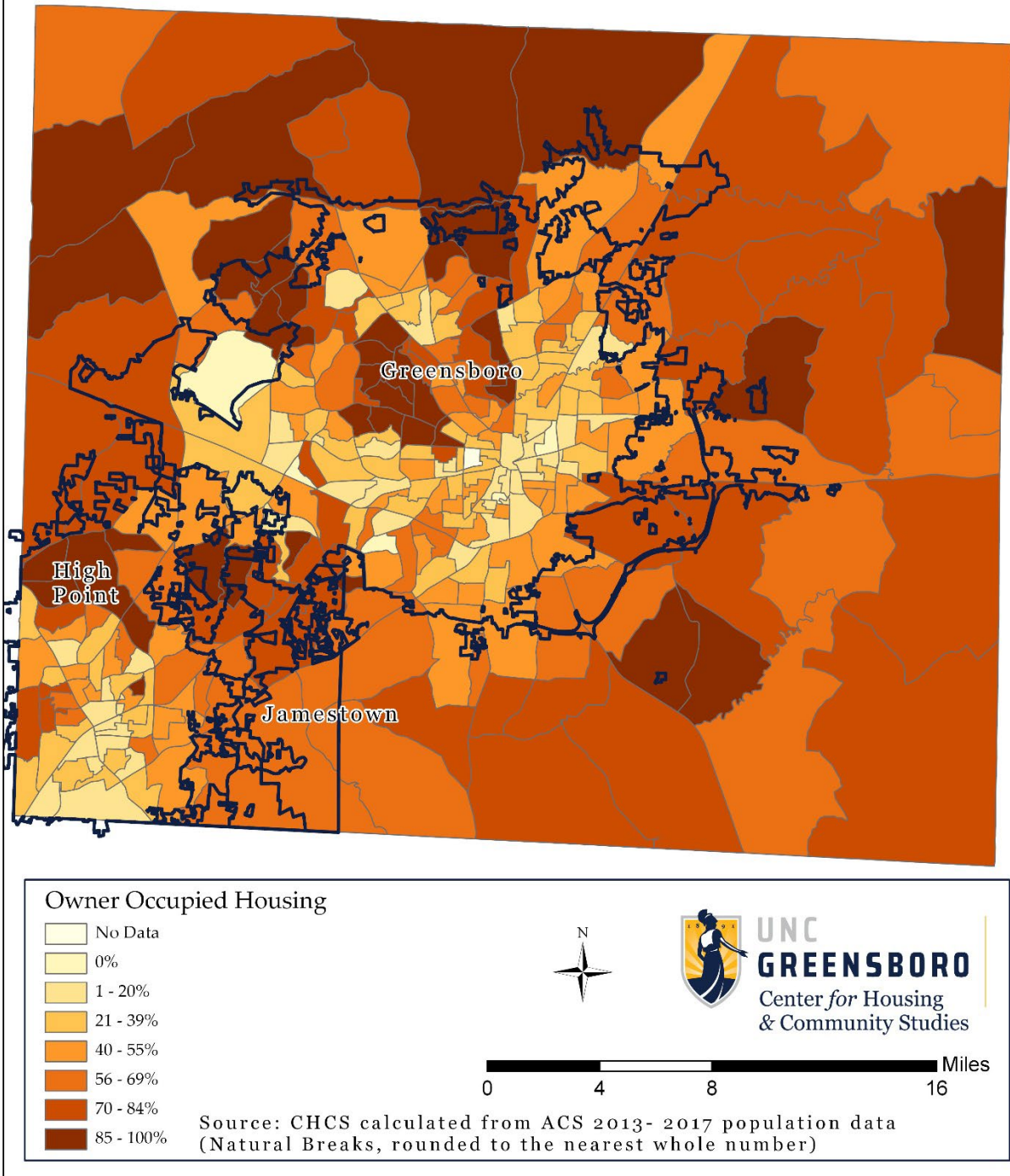


FIGURE 47 – OWNER OCCUPIED HOUSING UNITS GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP (ACS 2013-2017)

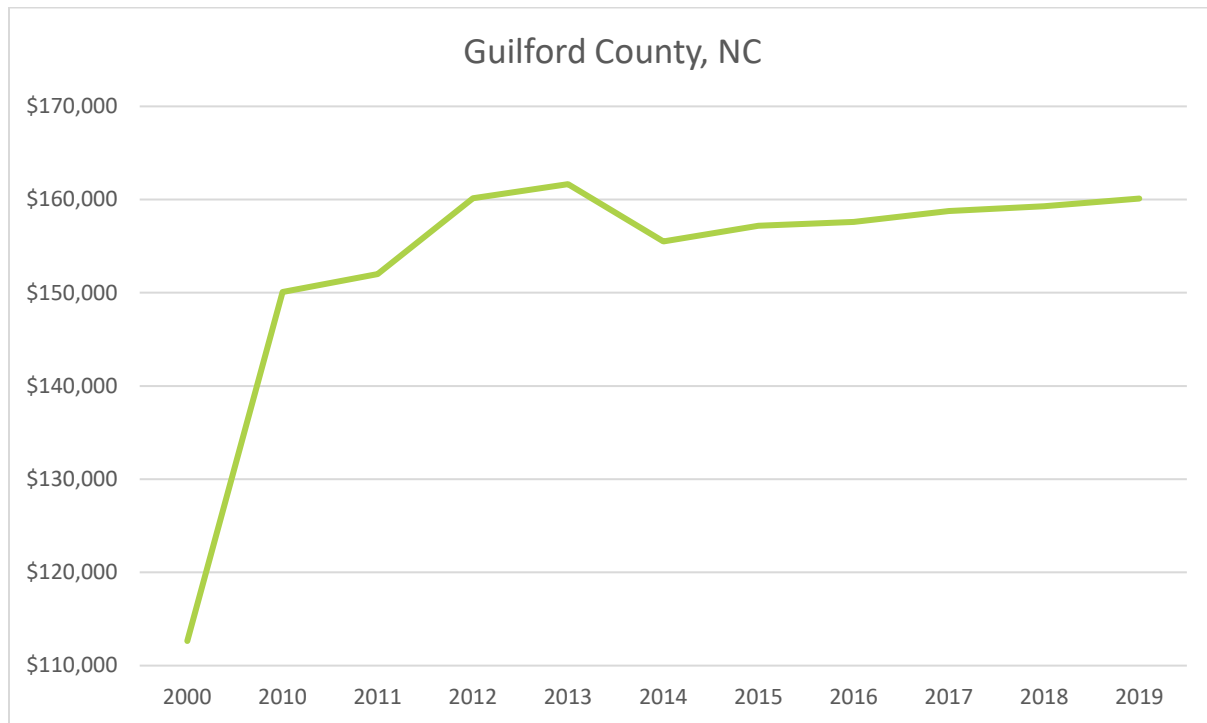


FIGURE 48 – MEDIAN HOME VALUE IN GUILFORD COUNTY (ACS 2019)

The median value in 2019 was \$160,099. Home values have increased about 42.1% in the last nine years. Neighborhoods in the northwest corner of Guilford County have higher home values compared to the rest of the county. The lower home values tend to be found in the south eastern quadrants of both Greensboro and High Point. The tract with the highest home value of \$585,400 (based on ACS 2013-2017 data) was in Irving Park of northern Greensboro and contains three Census block groups (tract 010404). The median household income for the neighborhood was \$146,750 with the highest median household income in the county, \$181,458, in one of its three block groups (104043). The higher incomes are correlated with higher educational attainment with two of the three census tracts having the two highest percentages of population with at least a bachelor’s degree (85.6% and 83.2%) (block groups 104043 and 104042). This neighborhood was an older population with a median male age of 51.3 years old and a median female age of 52.3. This neighborhood also has the highest life expectancy in the county of 88

years. This neighborhood was nearly all white (96.8%). A large portion of this tract was the Greensboro Country Club with the rest of the neighborhood being primarily residential areas.

The neighborhood with the lowest median home value (\$46,000) was in southwest High Point and contains four block groups (tract 014300). This neighborhood was surrounded by other neighborhoods in the lowest category of median home values. The median household income of this area was \$25,352 which around 50th percentile of AMI. Less than 10% of the population in this neighborhood has attained at least a bachelor's degree and less than 30% have attained some college education. This neighborhood has a normal median age for the population with males being 27.5 years old and females being 31.5 years old. In direct contrast to the Irving Park neighborhood, this area has the lowest life expectancy in the county of 69.3 years. The racial makeup of the population was 61.6% non-white with African American as the predominant minority race. The neighborhood was dominated by auto mechanic shops, industrial factories and railroad interchanges. The few residential areas in this neighborhood are composed of apartment complexes and small houses.

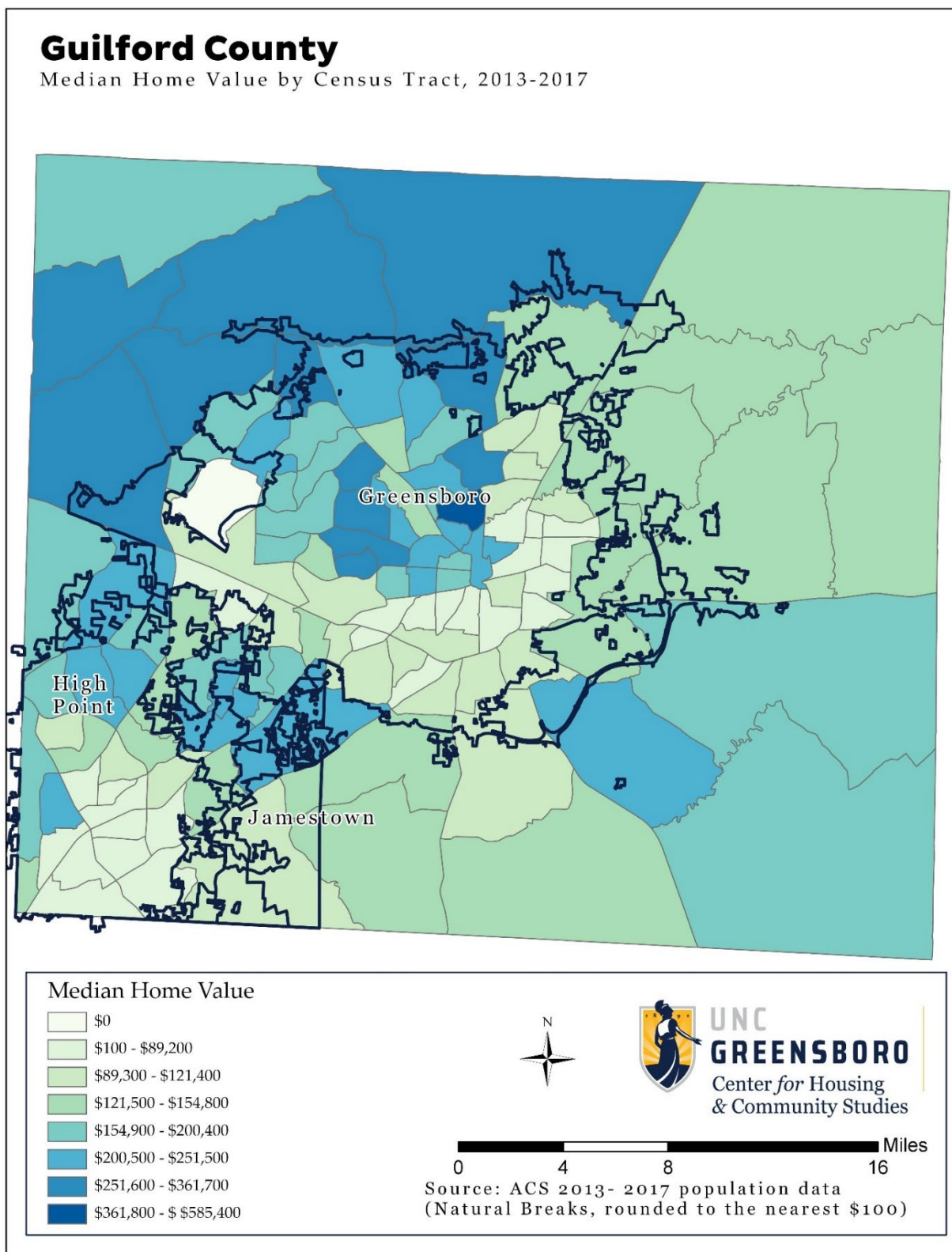


FIGURE 49 – MEDIAN HOME VALUE GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP (ACS 2013-2017)

Renter Occupied Housing

Two-fifths of the residences in Guilford County (41.1%) are renter occupied (ACS 2013-2017). There are five block groups in Guilford County where all housing units are occupied by renters. Two of which contain no households which explains their 100% renter occupied status (block groups 110003 and 107023). Another neighborhood composed entirely of renters was the Smith Homes neighborhood near Sussman Park in Greensboro (block group 114002). It was a young neighborhood with a median age of males of 14.5 and a median age of females of 27.2. African Americans make up 93.7% of the population, none of the population has attained at least a bachelor's degree, and the median household income was \$8,354. In contrast, the other two neighborhoods are in south west Greensboro (block group 126092) and West Greensboro (block group 160114). These neighborhoods are more educated with at least 23.4% having at least a bachelor's degree, Whites make up 25.6-39.8% of the population, and the median income was \$29,337-\$31,132.

Percent of Housing Units Occupied by Renters, 2013-2017

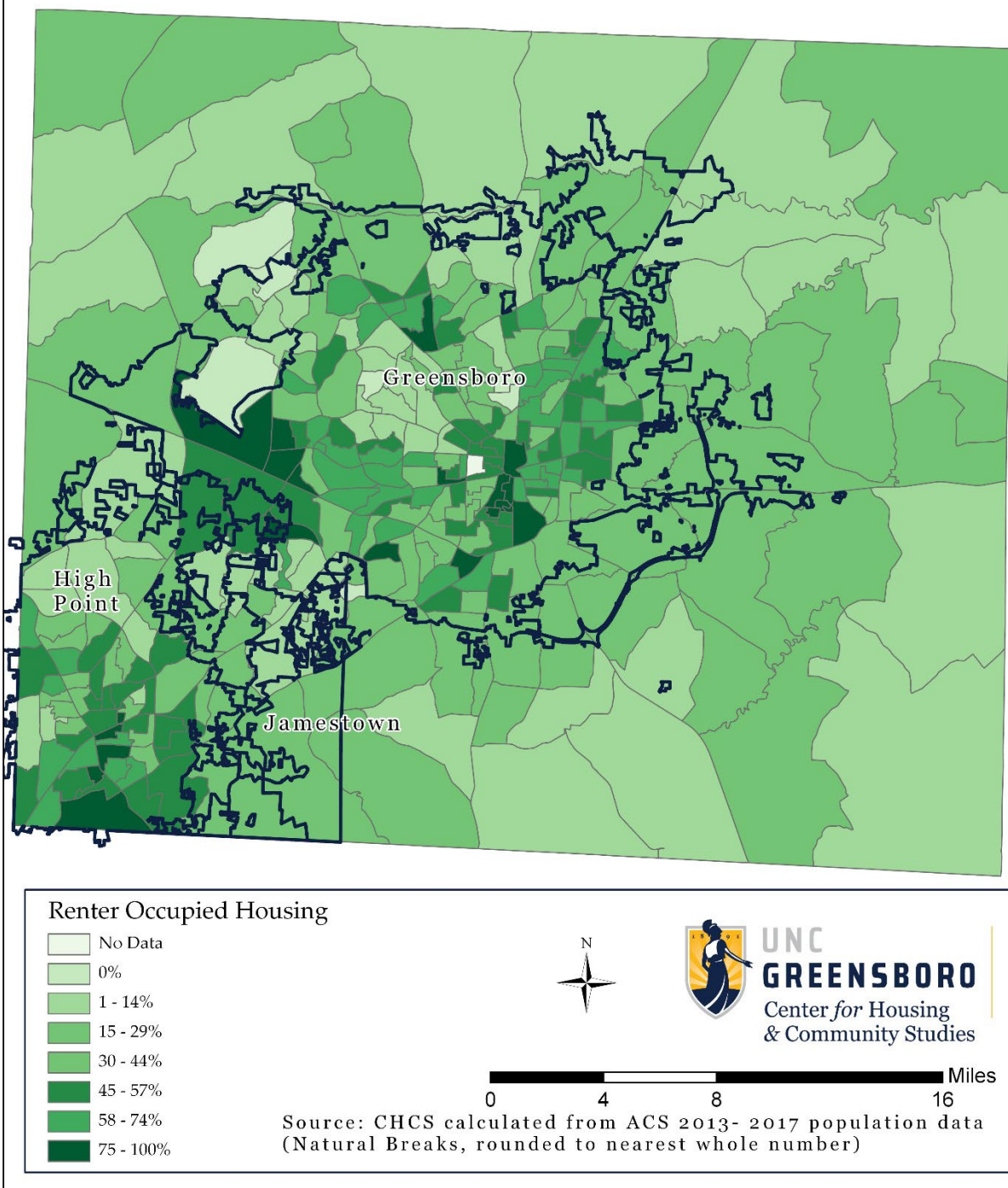


FIGURE 50 – RENTER OCCUPIED HOUSING UNITS GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP (ACS 2013-2017)

Median Rent

Typical (median) gross rent for rental units with cash rent in this area was \$821 (ACS 2013-2017). According to RentCafe (Nov 2019), average rent for an apartment in High Point was \$850 and \$914 in Greensboro. Rent has increased 12.8% in Greensboro and 14.9% in High Point between Nov 2016 and Nov 2019. Median rent was highest in the north of High Point. The most affordable neighborhoods in High Point are Archdale, where the average rent goes for \$667/month, Townsend Business Park, where renters pay \$667/month on average, and West Fairfield, where the average rent goes for \$667/ month. The most expensive neighborhoods in High Point are Skeet Club Ridge (\$886), The Overlook (\$886) and Walnut Creek (\$886). The most affordable neighborhoods in Greensboro are Bryson Ridge, where the average rent goes for \$782/month, Cone Mills, where renters pay \$782/ month on average, and East Bessemer, where the average rent goes for \$782/ month. The most expensive neighborhoods in Greensboro are Lindley Park (\$1,484), Starmount Forest (\$1,484) and Sunset Hills (\$1,484).

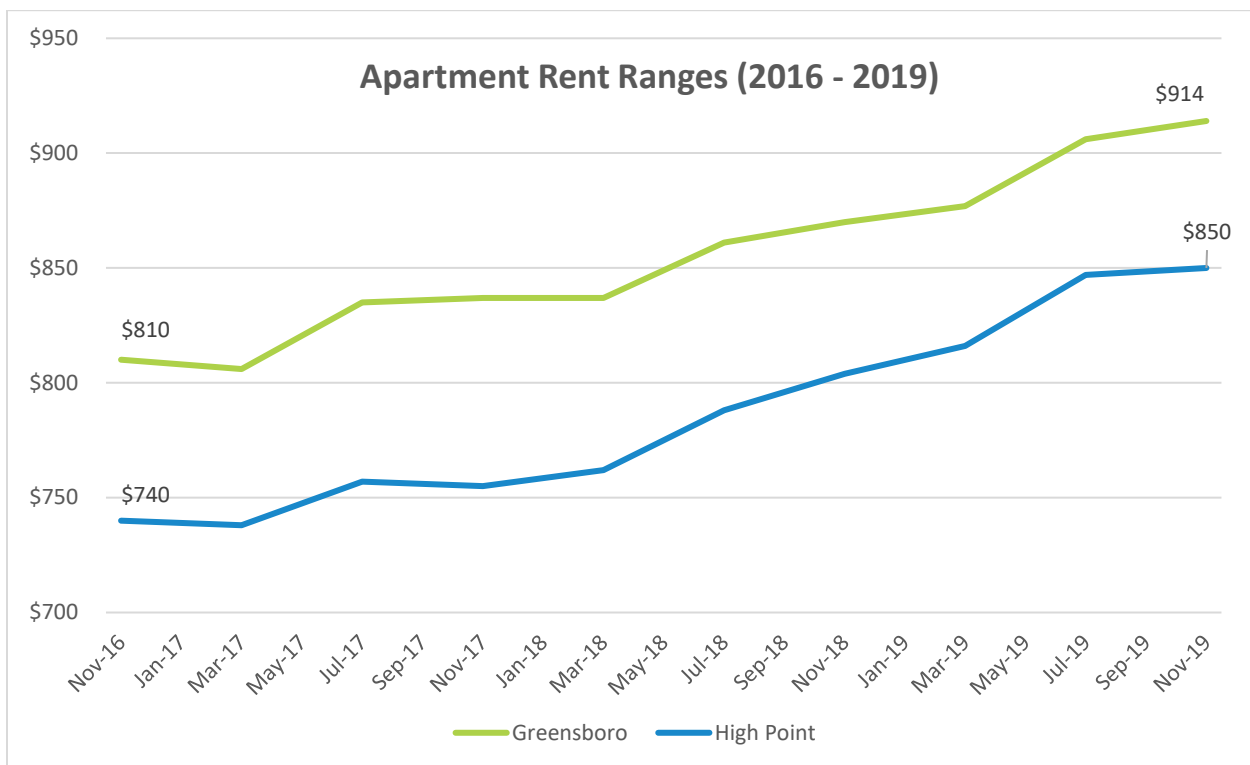


FIGURE 51 – MEAN RENT 2016-2019 (RENTCAFE)

According to ACS 2013-2014 data, the Greensboro neighborhood Jefferson Gardens (block group 161012) had the highest median rent at \$2,637. The next highest median rent was \$1,625 in the neighborhood surrounded by Skeet Club Blvd and Old Mill Rd in Deep River (block group 163031).

The lowest median rent of \$238 was found just south of High Point University along North College Drive and East Kivett Drive (block group 138004). It has an occupancy rate of 84%, 81% of which are occupied by renters, thus lack of demand for housing was not the main driver of the low rental rate. The neighborhood was dominated by a large apartment complex that provides much of the housing. More than half of the population (58%) reported moving within the last year indicating a transient community. The neighborhood was characterized as 73% not white with a median income of \$15,588 and a median home value of \$72,600. The population has a wide discrepancy in median ages between males (12.7) and females (28.4) which indicates a high occurrence of single-mother homes.

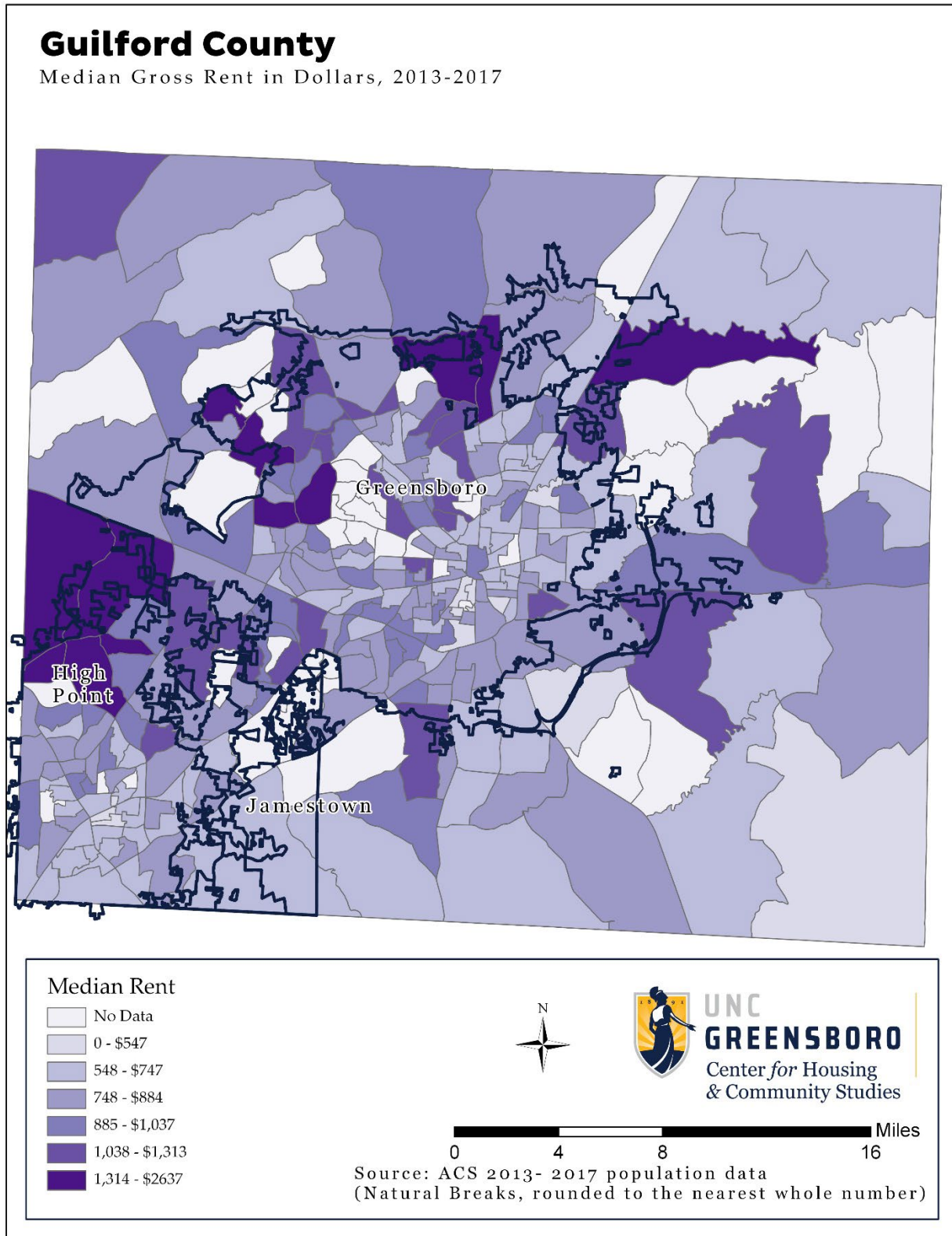


FIGURE 52 – MEDIAN GROSS RENTS GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP (ACS 2013-2017)

Housing Cost-Burden

Affordable housing continues to be a struggle for working families. According to the *Out of Reach 2019* report by the National Low-Income Housing Coalition, the housing wage is defined as the amount people need to earn per hour to afford the rent for a modest, 2-bedroom apartment at fair market value, without paying more than 30% of their income for that housing. The housing wage in the Greensboro-High Point is \$14.79 per hour. A worker making minimum wage would need to work about 82 hours weekly to afford a two-bedroom unit. More than half of renters (52.3% or 9,761 renters) and 23.8% of homeowners were cost burdened (paying more than 30% of their income towards rent). Of those cost-burdened renters, 18.42% were over the age of 65. Additionally, 52.13% of cost burdened renters earned less than \$20,000 (ACS 2013-2017). Similarly, of those cost-burdened homeowners, 24.2% were over the age of 65 and 72.8% of cost burdened homeowners earned less than \$20,000 (ACS 2013-2017).

Moved Last Year

A measure of housing turnover or instability within a neighborhood is “Moved Last Year.” This American Community Survey question collected asks where a person lived one year ago to assess residential stability and to track the immigration and emigration of populations. The highest rates of transient communities can be found in the city centers of Greensboro and High Point. Generally, rural areas are more stable across the county with a few exceptions, like Stokesdale (block group 159012) where 26.5% of the population moved last year.

The block group with the highest percentage of people that moved within the last year (61.7%) was found around the University of North Carolina-Greensboro (block group 107023). This can be explained by students moving in and out of housing on a yearly basis. The second highest percentage of people who moved within the last year was 58.2% and High Point University was in the middle of the block group (block group 138004). The third highest percent of people who moved last year was 57.1% in the West End neighborhood in High Point (block group 140001). This highly residential neighborhood contains a hospital, middle school, and a high school and children make up 39.6% of the population.

Four block groups in Guilford County reported no movement in the area. They are spread across rural and urban areas in the northern half of Guilford County. One block group was the airport with no population (block group 801001). Moving East, the Hamilton Forest and Carriage Hills neighborhoods, also reported no movement (block group 125114). This was an area with mainly single-family residences. It was also a high-income area with a median home value of \$276,700 and a median household income of \$106,583. The next area with no movement was south of downtown Greensboro and Gate City Boulevard along South Elm Street in between the Warnersville and Asheboro neighborhoods (block group 113001). It was similarly made up of single-family residences but does not have high median household income (\$26,198) and most of the households are renter occupied (57.9%). The last block group (154012) with no movement was in the rural northeast part of the county. This follows the trend of low movement in rural areas due to most of the population owning their home, 80.9% for this neighborhood, and being settled in their homes for longer period of times.

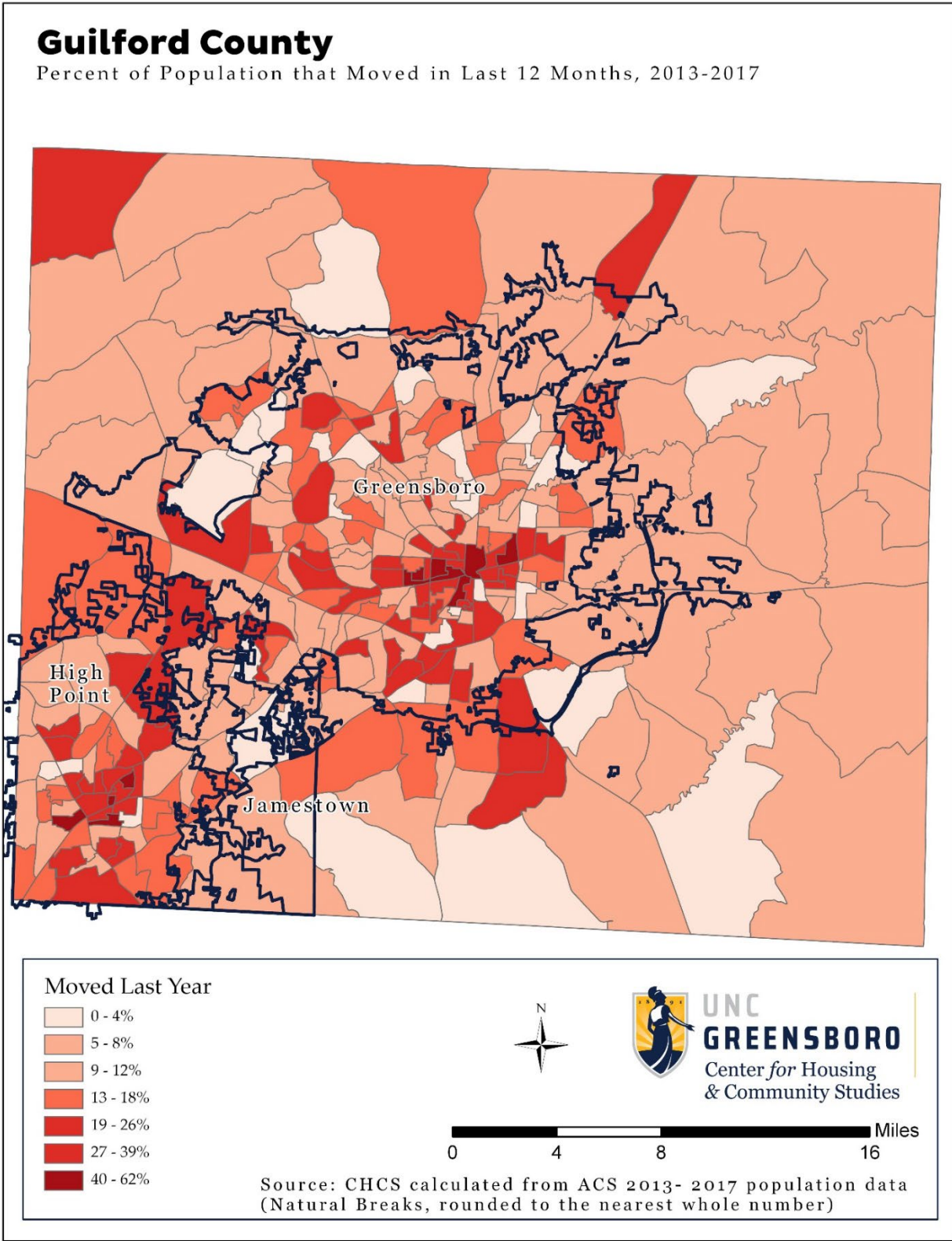


FIGURE 53 – PERCENT MOVED IN LAST YEAR GUILFORD COUNTY, NC BY BLOCK GROUP (ACS 2013-2017)

Evictions

Data from the Princeton Eviction Lab shows that in 2016, Guilford County had a 7.57% eviction rate. For every 100 rental households in the county, 7.57 experienced an eviction. On any given day, around 18 families were evicted from their homes. The rate of evictions for Guilford County is 2.96% higher than NC with 6,589 completed evictions (resulting in writs of possession) and about over 16,272 summary ejectment filings (the initial legal process to begin an eviction in the courts). Unfortunately, these numbers for 2016 underestimate the number of evictions. All of the evictions tracked in Eviction Lab are formal evictions - all going through the long process of legally removing a tenant. As Matthew Desmond, the Principal Investigator at the Eviction Lab, writes, informal evictions are perhaps more common than formal evictions. An informal eviction could be a landlord padlocking the door while the tenant is at work or a landlord threatening a tenant if they do not leave their home. According to civil processing data of the last 7 years from the Guilford County Sheriff's Department, nearly 5000 households were formally locked out of their units due to eviction every year.

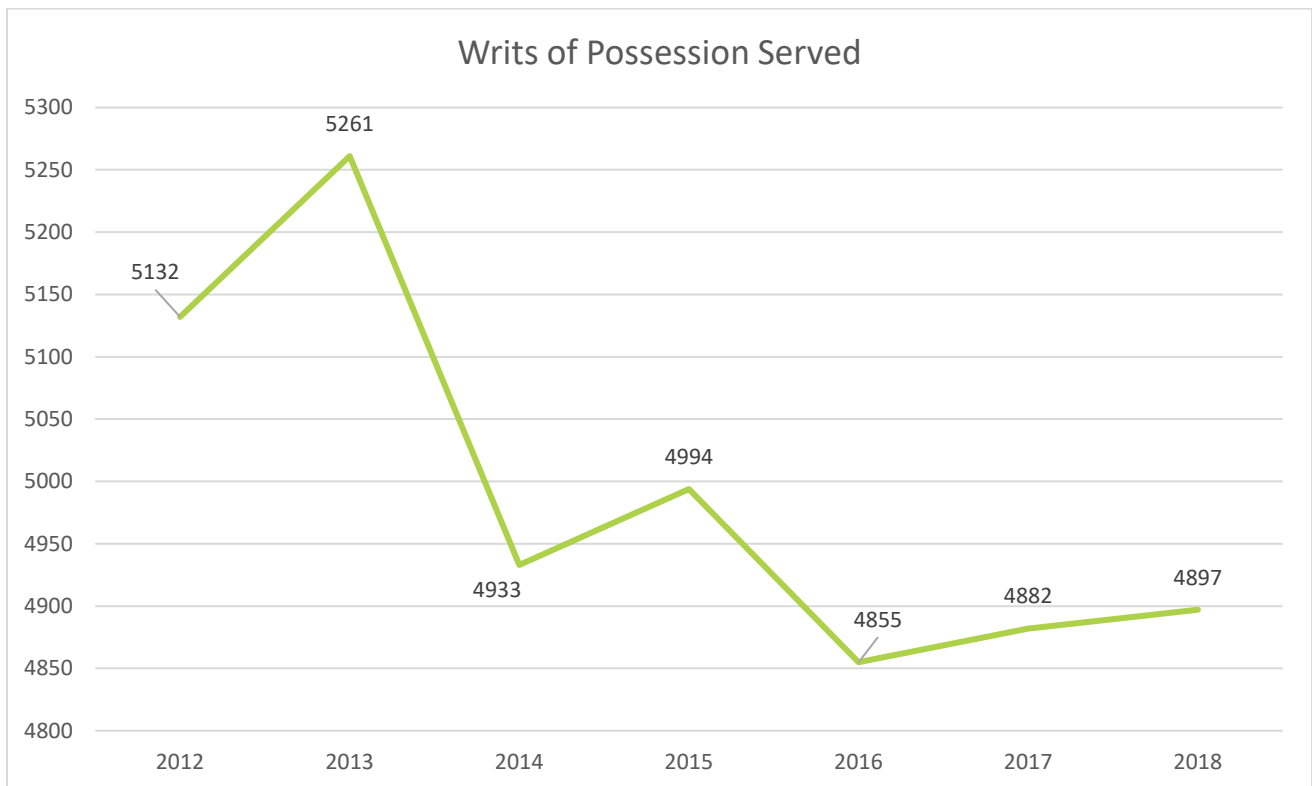


FIGURE 54 – WRITS SERVED BY SHERIFF GUILFORD COUNTY, NC (2012-2018)

Homelessness

Point in Time (PiT) counts, conducted bi-annually across the nation, provide a snapshot of unduplicated sheltered and unsheltered individuals and families experiencing homelessness on any given night as defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). HUD defines an individual as experiencing homelessness when they reside in places not meant for human habitation, in an emergency shelter or transitional housing, or when they lack the resources and/or support networks needed to obtain housing. The count includes only individuals willing to answer questions about their living status within a single 24-hour time period. According to the Partners Ending Homelessness, 586 People experienced homelessness on 30 January 2019 in Guilford County. According to the Department of Homeless Services and Community Support at Guilford County district, K-12 student homelessness was up 21% since 2015-216 with 3,247 students experiencing homelessness system wide. This count using a different definition of homelessness that includes those who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. Students complete a form that states that they are going through a housing crisis of some sort.

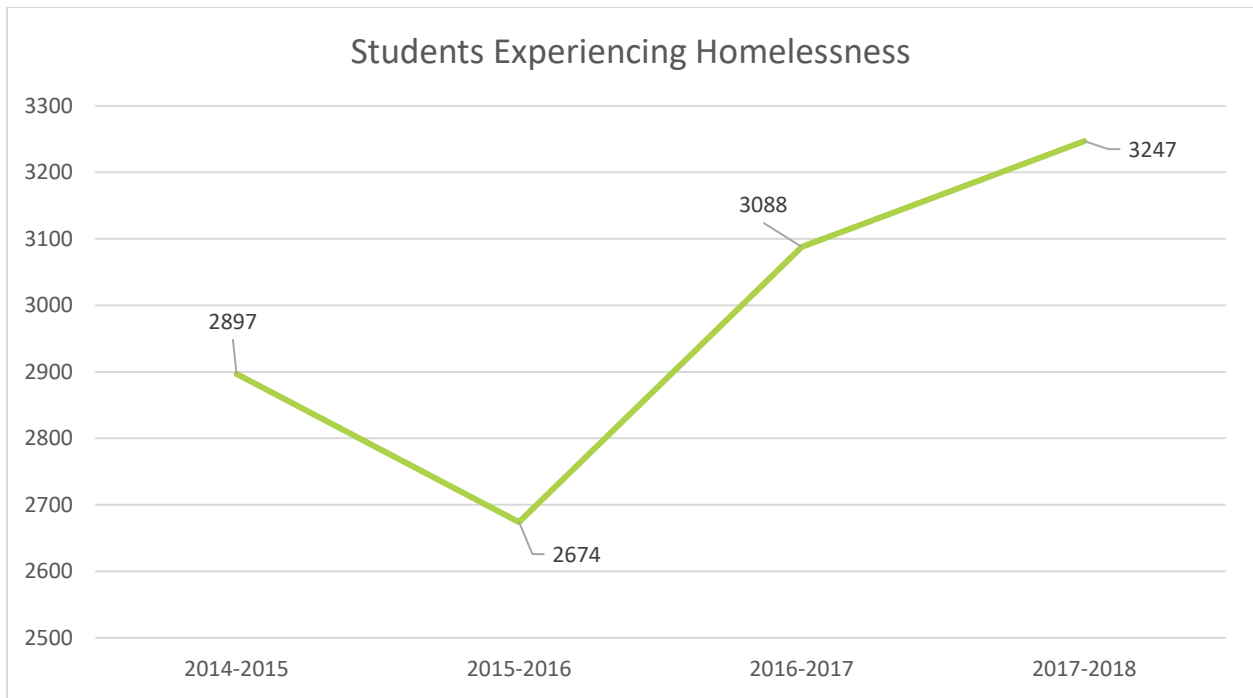


FIGURE 55 - STUDENTS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS IN GUILFORD COUNTY (GCS)

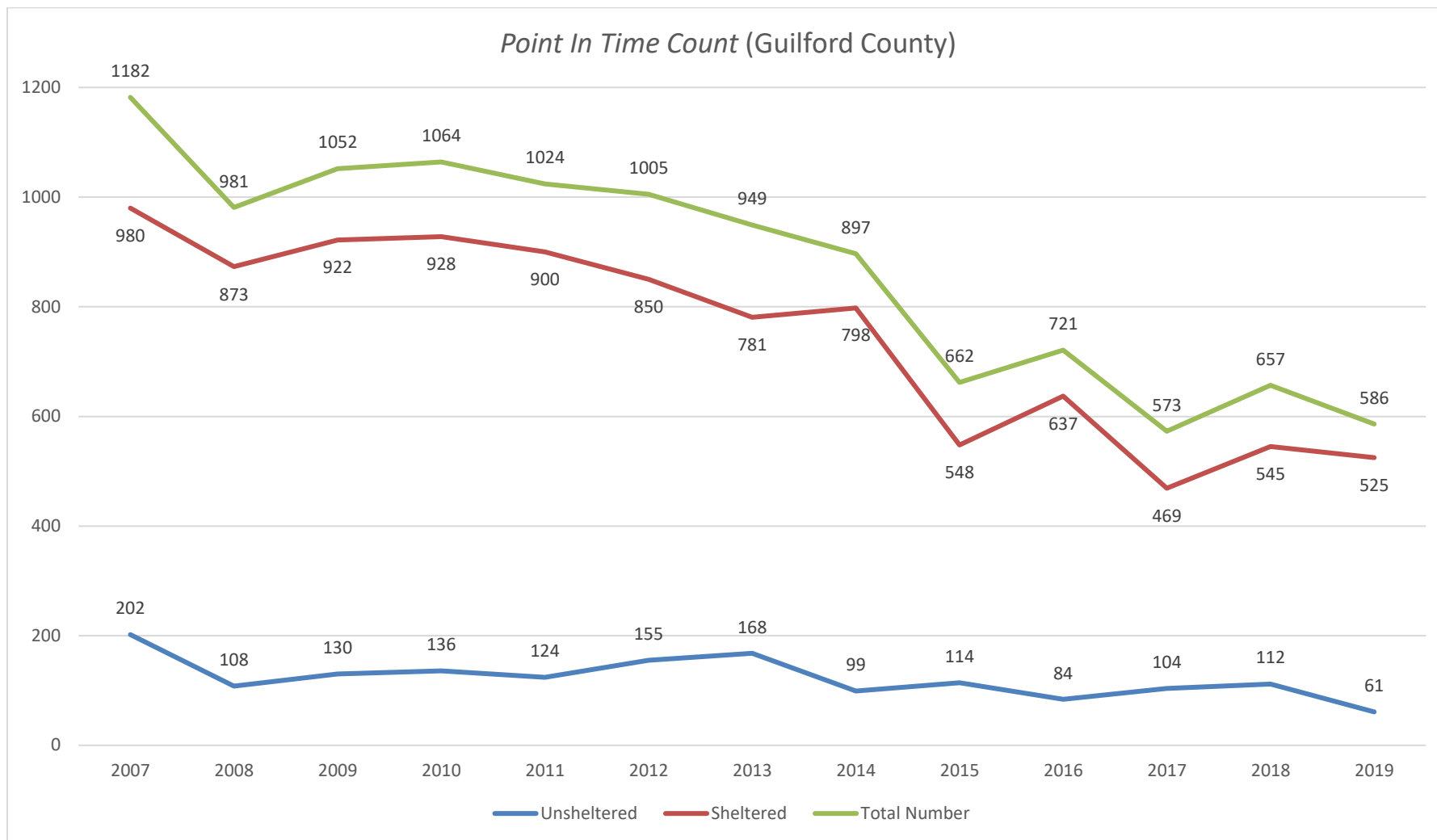


FIGURE 56 - HOMELESSNESS IN GUILFORD COUNTY, POINT IN TIME COUNT, 2007-2019

Personal Transportation

According to the Census Bureau, residents in Guilford County are heavily dependent upon automobiles. Most people commute to work by personal automobile (90.7%) and 6.4% of households do not have a vehicle (ACS 2016-2020). The average commute time is 22 minutes. Few commuters (1.3% of the workforce) in Guilford County have "super commutes" in excess of 90 minutes. Only 1.87% of residents walked and .20% took a taxi. The average car ownership is 2.2 cars per household while 6.94% of households do not have a vehicle. The average household spent \$10,569 on transportation costs in 2020 (Easy Analytic Software, Inc. - Consumer Expenditures CEX Database, 2020).

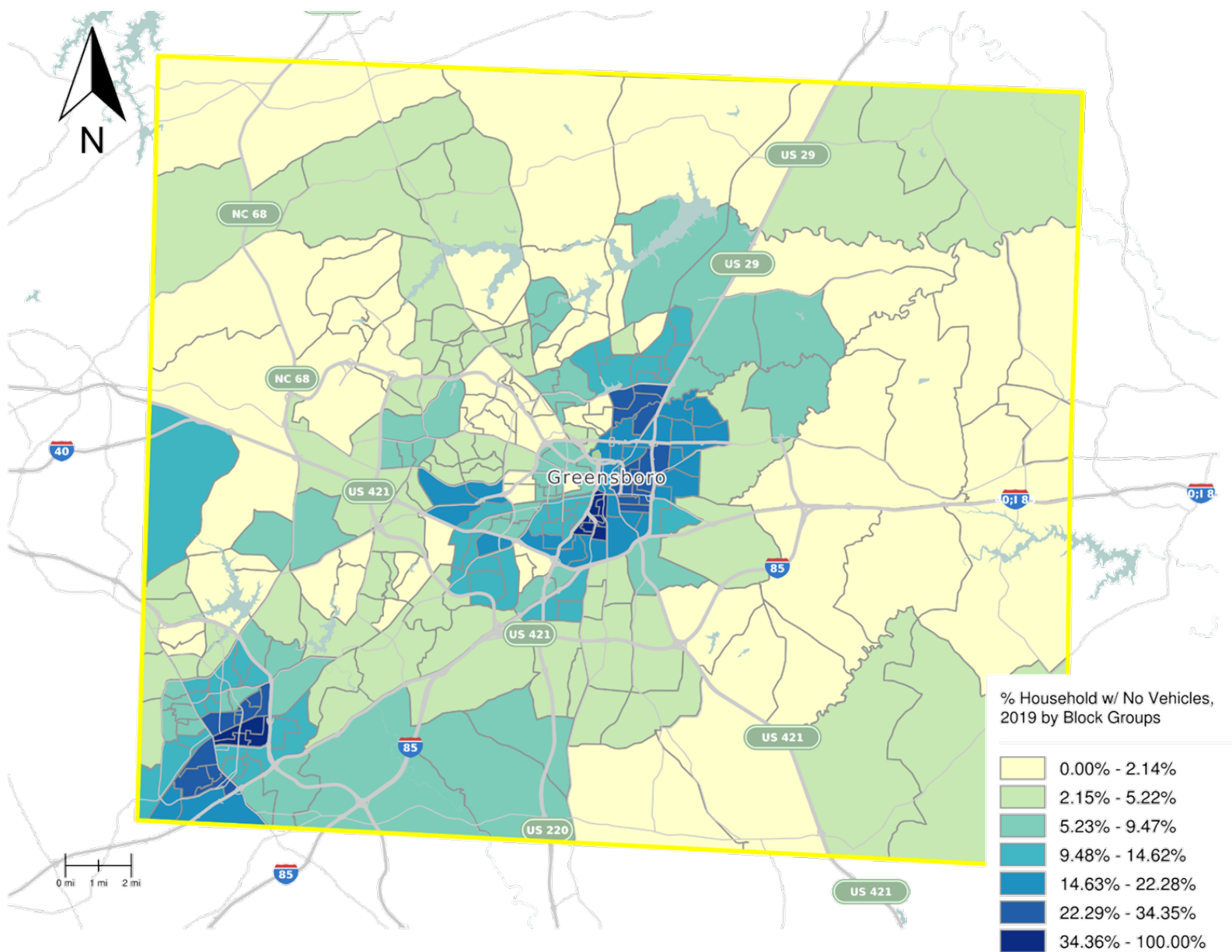


FIGURE 57 – NO VEHICLE OWNERSHIP IN GUILFORD COUNTY, NC (ACS 2019)

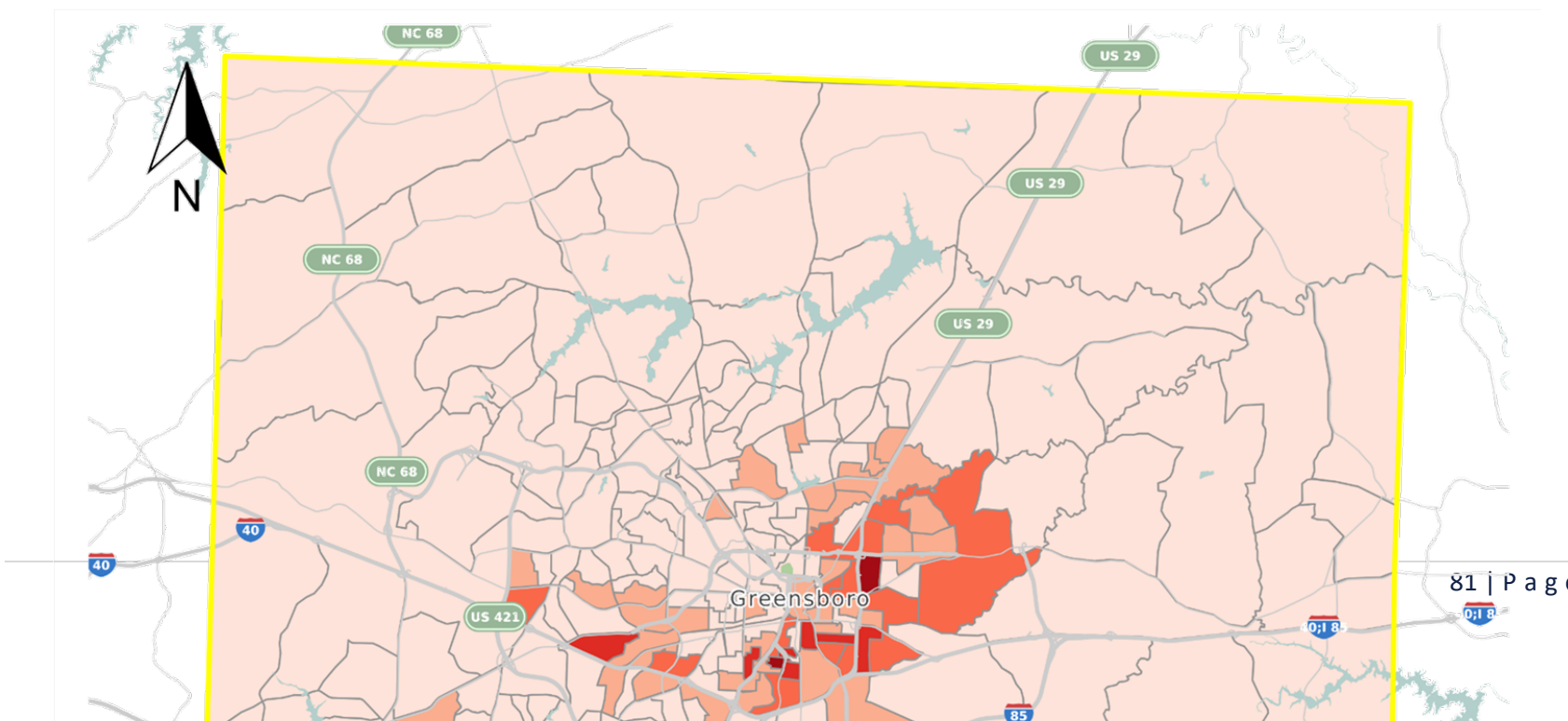


FIGURE 58 – PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION HIGH POINT, NC (ACS 2019)

Public Transportation

Public transportation in Guilford County includes the High Point Transit System (Hi Tran), Transportation and Mobility Services of Guilford County (TAMS), Greensboro Transit Authority, and the Piedmont Authority for Regional Transportation (PART). High Point has 14 routes and a regular fare of \$1.25 and discounted fares for seniors/disabled for .60¢. Transfers are also free and children under 43" in height ride free. TAMS Transportation is provided for medical appointments, employment, education, senior services, nutrition sites and adult day care for those without access to Hi Tran. Greensboro Transit Authority operates 16 Routes from 5:15 am to 11:30 pm Mondays through Fridays and 6 am to 10 pm Saturdays. Fares range from \$.75 for Students (6-18), Seniors (60+), persons with disabilities, on Medicare or Medicaid and Veterans and \$1.50 for regular fare. They also have daily and 31-day unlimited ride passes (\$4.00-\$58.00). They also offer Specialized Community Area Transportation (SCAT) and I-Ride Paratransit Services for the disabled. The Piedmont Authority for Regional Transportation (PART) also operates a regional transit system with 15 express routes connecting with the High Point and Greensboro transit systems and offering services to 10 counties of the Piedmont Triad. Only 2.0% of the population uses public transportation to commute to work (ACS 2019). Nonetheless, neighborhoods in the Core City of High Point and in South and East Greensboro are dependent upon public transportation with low vehicle ownership and high transit utilization.

Food Costs

Households on average spend over \$5,081.23 on food in Guilford County almost equally distributed between food at home (\$2,790) and food away from home (\$2,297). The highest expenses were logically in high income neighborhoods in the northwest of the county, in west High Point, and in the Jamestown area. Low income families had as little as \$1415.25 or less for annual food expenses. According to Feeding America, average meal costs of \$3.01 are on par with national averages.

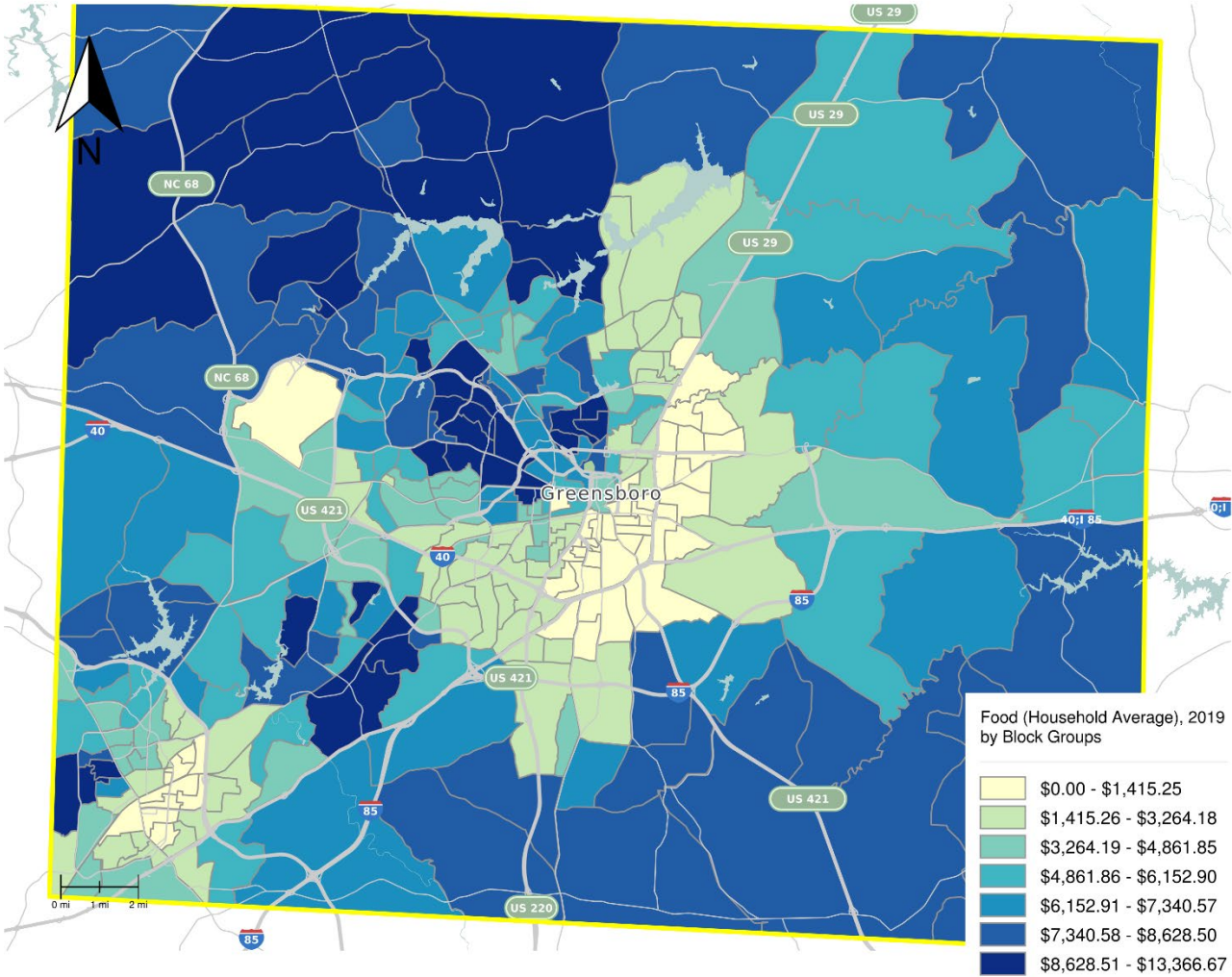
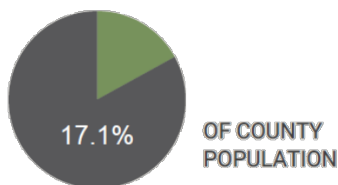


FIGURE 59 – HOUSEHOLD AVERAGE FOOD EXPENSES (ACS 2019)

ESTIMATED PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY AMONG FOOD INSECURE PEOPLE

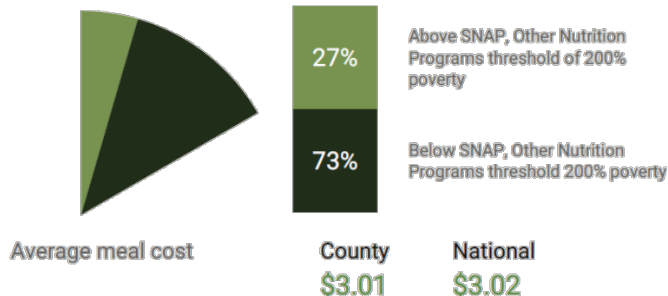


FIGURE 60 - FOOD INSECURITY RATE GUILFORD COUNTY SOURCE: FEEDING AMERICA MAP.FEEDINGAMERICA.ORG

Guilford County was rated as a six on the Food Environment Index. The Food Environment Index ranges from 0 (worst) to 10 (best) and equally weights two indicators of the food environment: Limited access to healthy foods and Food insecurity. About 6.7% of residents have limited access to healthy foods, yet, 17.1% are food insecure. These are individuals who are low income and do not live close to a grocery store. Living close to a grocery store is defined differently in rural and nonrural areas; in rural areas, it means living less than 10 miles from a grocery store; in nonrural areas, less than 1 mile. Low income is defined as having an annual family income of less than or equal to 200 percent of the federal poverty threshold for the family size.

While only 11.0% of adults reported eating less than 1 serving of fruit/vegetables per day in Guilford County (CDC) that rate is 19.7% and 18.9% around Smith Homes and NCA&T in Greensboro, and 18.9% and 17.6% around Leonard Street Park and Southside Recreation Center in High Point. These areas have high levels of poverty, lack transportation, and there are no supermarkets nearby. Seven Census Block Groups in southeast High Point have been designated as Limited Supermarket Access (LSA) areas. Residents of LSA areas travel farther to reach supermarkets than residents of non-LSA areas within the same population density and car ownership class.

Importantly, 15.7% of households receive Public Assistance Income or Food Stamps/SNAP and 50.2% of children are eligible for free and reduced lunch in the

County . Attempts to address food security and food hardship include backpack programs for children, food pantries and meal programs, Food Finder,⁸ and community gardens. The Greater High Point Food Alliance is working with the Second Harvest Food Bank to provide a food pantry program with healthy foods. High Point Medical Center also provides a farmer’s market. In Greensboro, Out of the Garden Project and others have created mobile farmers’ markets and community gardening programs.

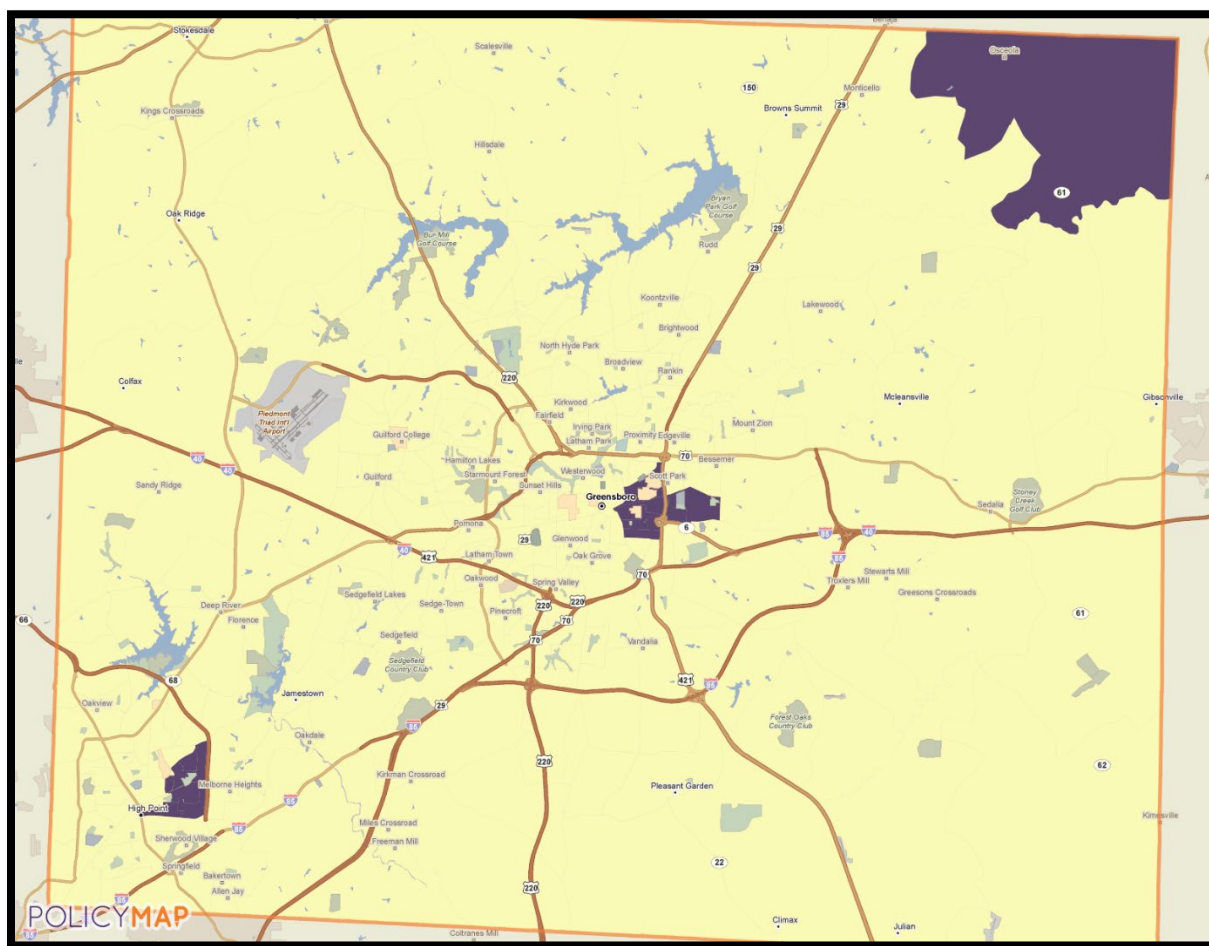


FIGURE 61 – LIMITED SUPERMARKET ACCESS GUILFORD COUNTY (REINVESTMENT FUND 2016)

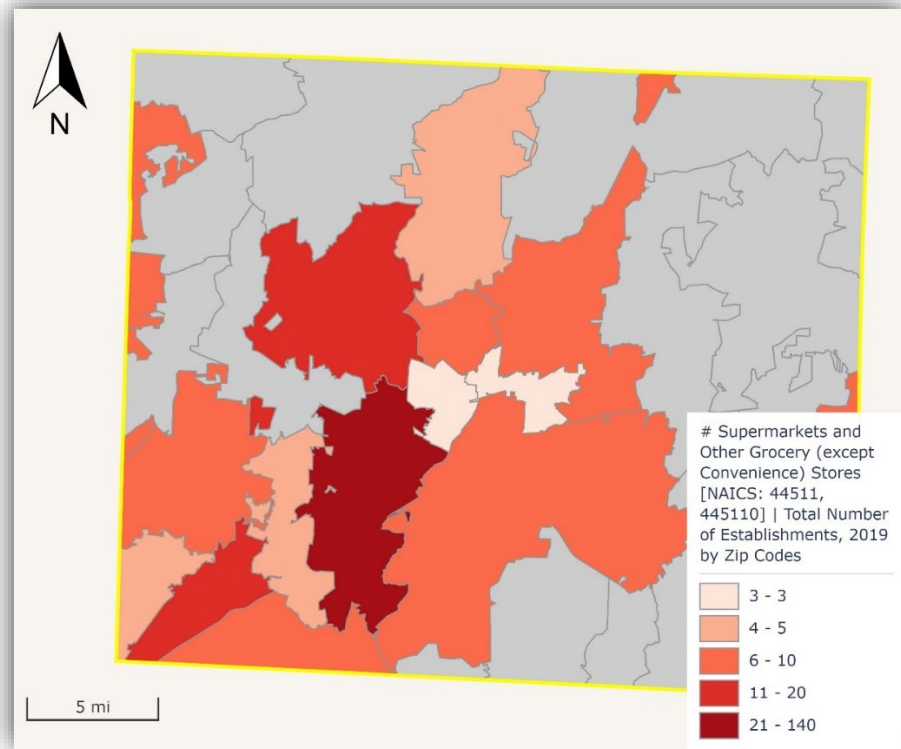


FIGURE 62 – SUPERMARKET & GROCERY STORES BY ZIP CODE IN GUILFORD COUNTY, NC 2019

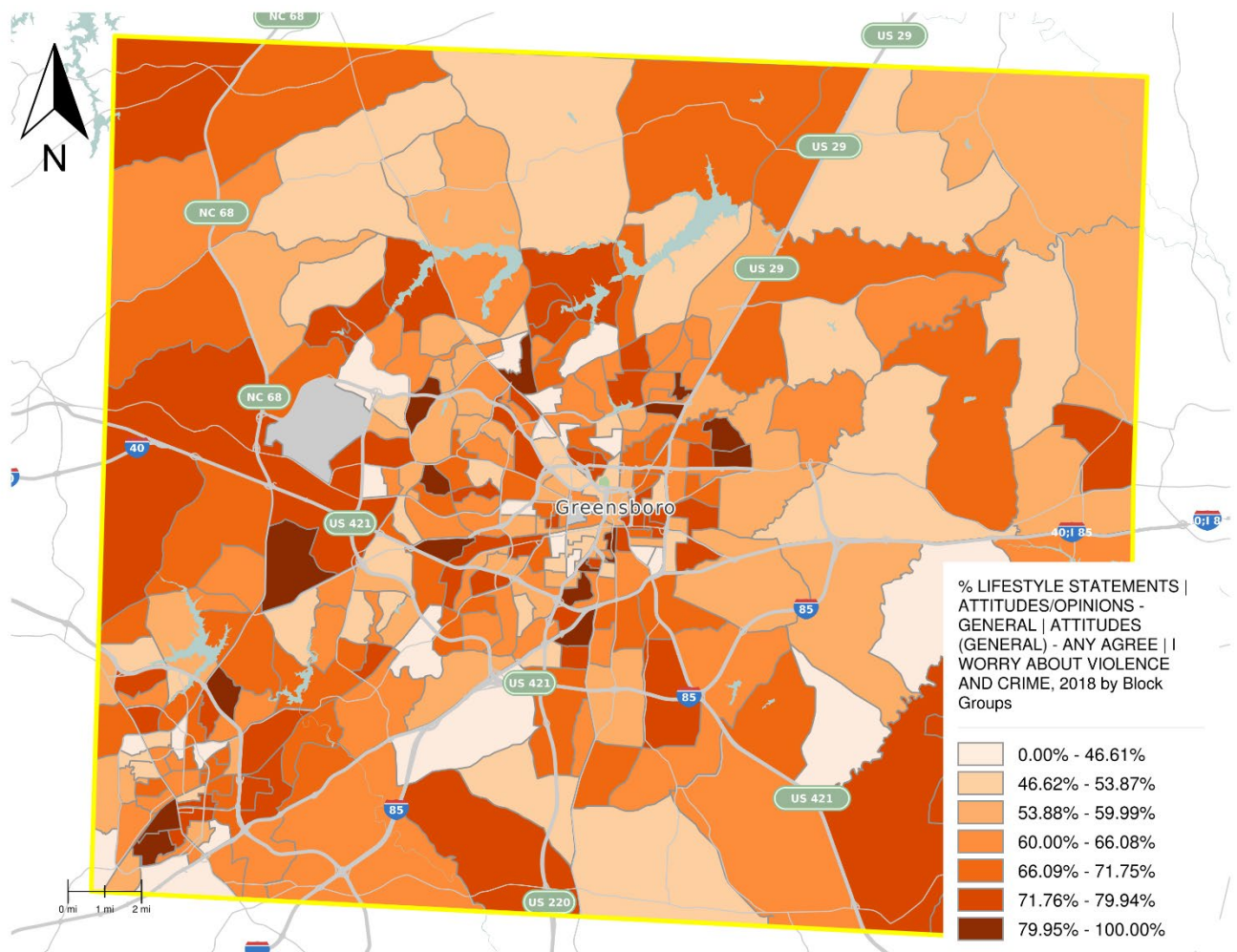


FIGURE 63 - FEAR OF VIOLENCE AND CRIME (SIMMONS LOCAL CONSUMER INSIGHTS 2018).

EASI Crime Indices

Easy Analytic Software Inc. (EASI) has created a model of the combined likelihoods of the included crime categories to be present in a given area. 100 represents the national average for each variable. Greensboro is higher than the national average in all but forcible rape while High Point is higher only in Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Aggravated Assaults. Guilford County overall is close to the national average in most indexed crime categories.

FBI UCR Violent Crime

While the number of violent crimes in High Point declined from 832 in 2007 to 505 in 2014, it has begun to rise again. Murders per 100,000 persons, as reported by the FBI's Uniform Crime Reports, had risen to 17.8 by 2017 from a low of 1.86 in 2013. Similarly, in Greensboro, violent crimes dropped from 2,312 in 2007 to as low as 1,355 in 2014 but have risen steadily since then.

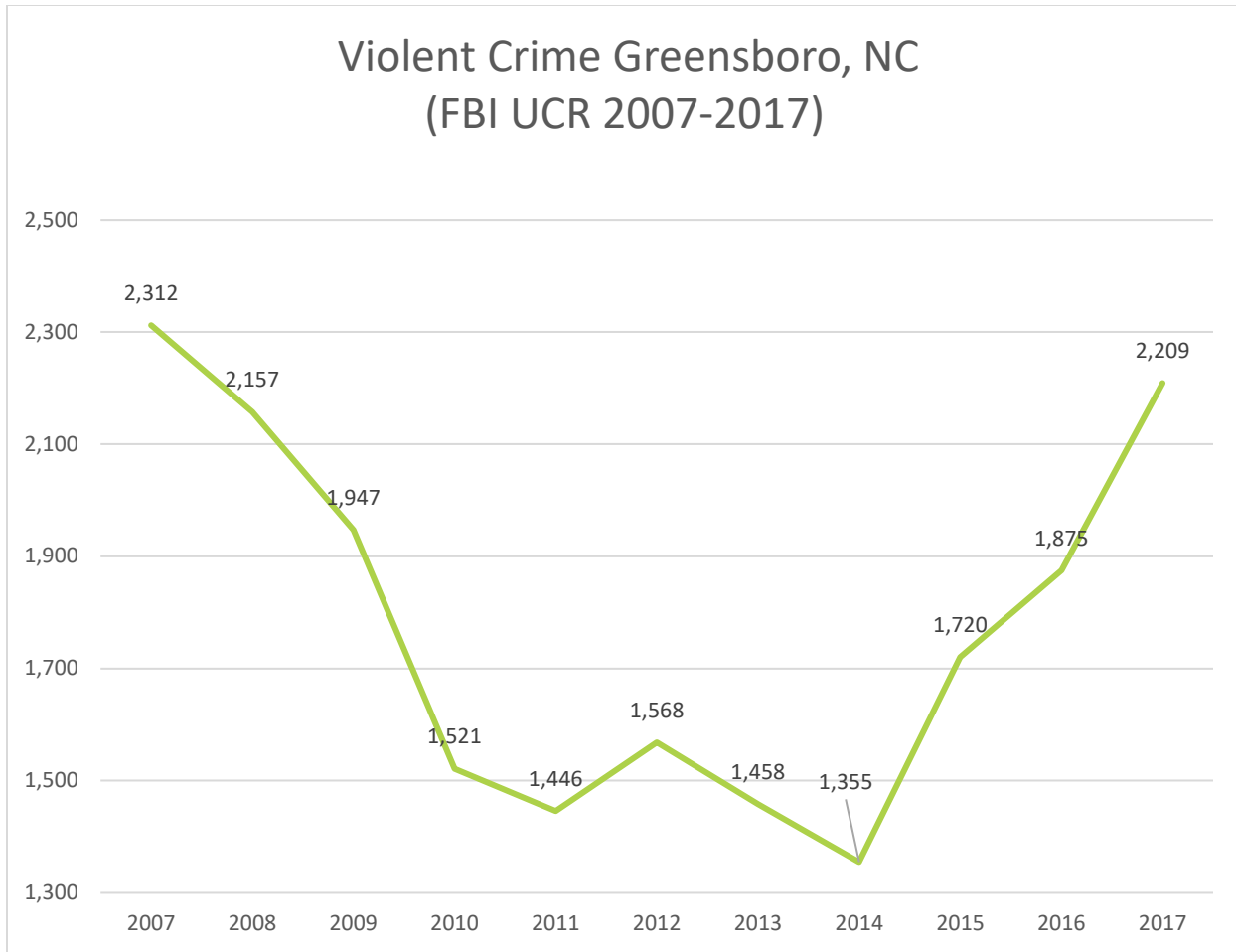


FIGURE 64 – VIOLENT CRIMES IN GREENSBORO 2007-2017 (FBI)

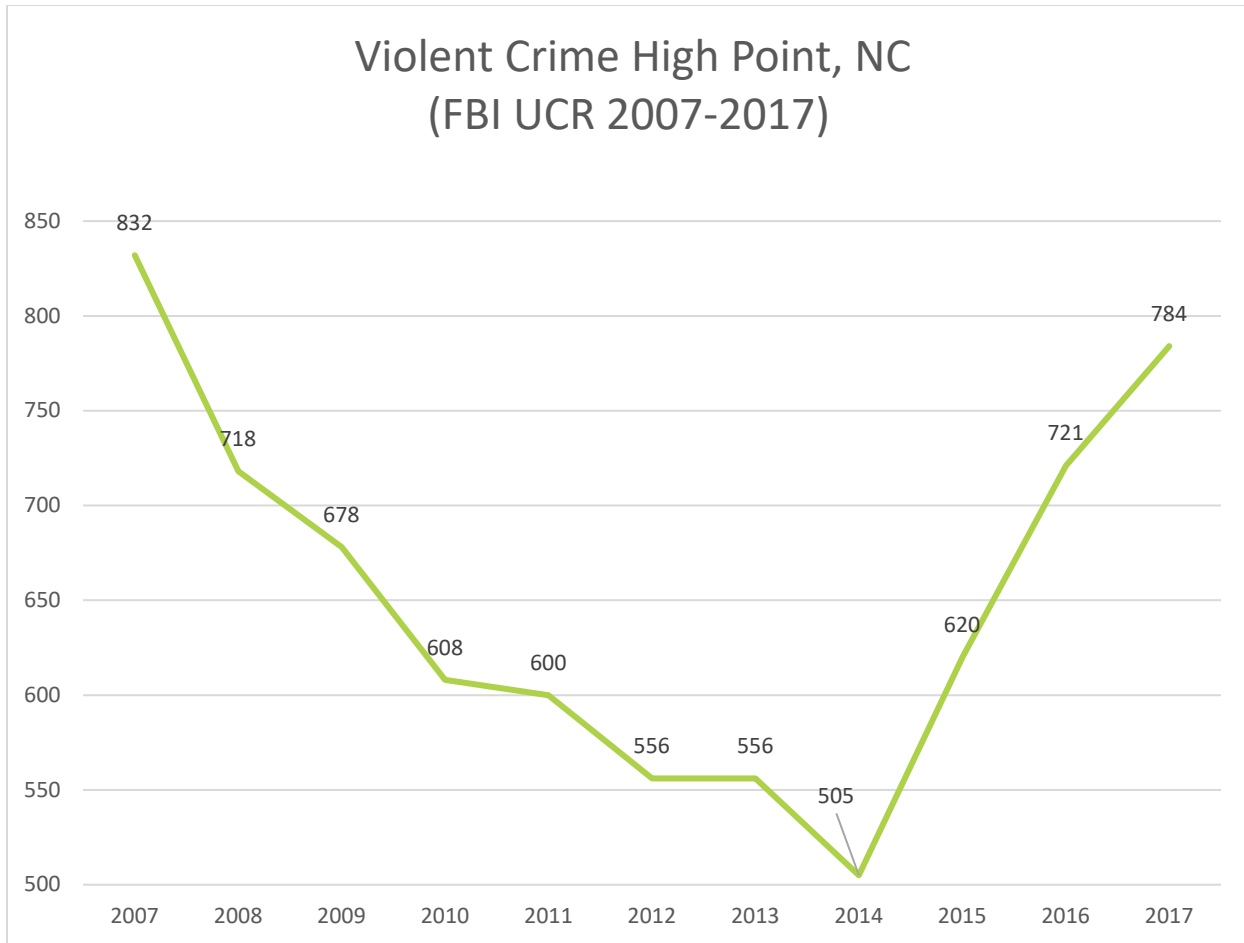


FIGURE 65 – VIOLENT CRIMES IN HIGH POINT 2007-2017 (FBI)

Conclusions

Demographic Summary

The population in Guilford County has grown 22.8% since the 2000 Census. Much of the growth has been in the non-White population and foreign-born populations. The population of Guilford County was over a third African American (34.7%), a little more than half white (53.4%), just under 5% Asian, 2.9% two or more races. Hispanics make up 7.7% of the Guilford population. The Hispanic population has greatest concentrations in south High Point. Foreign born residents make up 10.2% of Guilford County's population. The urban areas of the two major metros have become more diverse and younger in the last decades while rural and suburban areas become older and less diverse.

Most individuals live in family households. Adults living with spouse are concentrated in the rural areas of the county while adults living alone are concentrated near the urban centers. There was a general trend of households with children concentrated in the suburbs and rural block groups while urban block groups are characterized by a higher percentage of households without children. One-fifth of family households (20.0%) were single parents with children, while just over a quarter were married with children (28.3%).

Concentrated Poverty

The per capita Guilford County household income was \$35,398 while the median household income was \$64,462 (ACS 2019) up significantly in the last few years. Rural neighborhoods in general had an AMI of 100% or above while neighborhoods in more urban areas were more likely to be below the median household income. According to the Census (ACS 2019), there are about 90,599 individuals in poverty in Guilford County, about 17% of the total population. While only 4.8% of the non-Hispanic White population was in poverty, 8.8% of African Americans were in poverty. Of those over 65, about a tenth (9.2%) are living in poverty (ACS 2013-2017). Within the county, there was a geographic trend of tracts with high percentage of people in poverty concentrated around urban centers and is correlated with tracts that are a high percentage minority.

Key Issues Facing the Community

Transportation

According to the Census Bureau, residents in Guilford County are heavily dependent upon automobiles. While 6.94% of households do not have a vehicle, only 2.0% of the population uses public transportation to commute to work (ACS 2019). Nonetheless, neighborhoods in the Core City of High Point and in South and East Greensboro are dependent upon public transportation with low vehicle ownership and high transit utilization.

Food

About 6.7% of residents have limited access to healthy foods, yet, 17.1% are food insecure. These are individuals who are low income and do not live close to a grocery store. K-12 student homelessness was up 21% since 2015-2016 with 3,247 students experiencing homelessness system wide.

Substance Use

Alcohol is a very common and legal, controlled substance. An estimated 12% of adults in Guilford County reporting binge drinking. There were 229,206 crime incidents over 5 years from the High Point Police Department, the Greensboro Police Department, and the Guilford County Sheriff combined or 45,841 crime responses annually. The average crime rate in Guilford County was about 89 incidents per 1,000 people annually.
